

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town highways.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and negotiate the extension or renewal of the notes securing such loans, when it is necessary.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$484.50, the State to contribute \$2285.17 for Town Road aid.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for the hire of Log Sites.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$350.00 for the Wilmot Volunteer Firemen to apply on payment of pumper and hose.
- 10. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for the purpose of advertising the attractions and resources of the Town in connection with other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- 11. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the municipal accounting division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 12. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for the purpose of establishing a town dump or dumps, or to see what action the Town will take in the matter.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
