TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 10th. day of March, 1964, to act upon the following subjects: The Town Meeting will open at the conclusion of the School District Meeting; which is called for, at 6 p.m.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,100.00 for highways and bridge repair.
5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$600.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Road No. 62 - White Pond Road - such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Windsor.
6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate \$19.49 as the Town's share.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$40.00 for Police and Forest Fire expenses.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the upkeep and painting of the Town House.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$30.00 for Street Lighting.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate

\$100.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemetery.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for the reconstruction of a bridge at Black Pond entering Guidance Camps, Inc.

12. To see if the Town will vote to grant permission to the Selectmen to withdraw \$500.00 plus accrued interest from the Capital Reserve Fund to be applied to the cost of the new bridge at Black Pond entering Guidance Camps, Inc.

13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2,500.00 for the purpose of reconstructing the bridge leading into Guidance Camps, Inc., such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of The Municipal Finance Act of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Windsor.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to be applied to the Capital Reserve Fund for future Bridge Construction.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

16. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

17. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this city or town?"

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Windsor:

It is a pleasure to present my tenth annual report for your consideration.

I have been pleased to have had the opportunity to meet with the Windsor School Board during the past year. I believe, that because of these meetings, the Windsor Board has a clear understanding of school and financial problems as they affect the Windsor School District.

Again, I think I should call your attention to the consolidation of school districts as it is beginning to take place in this state. The last session of the legislature passed some very definite legislation, not only encouraging this practice but also establishing some ground rules whereby it should take place.

At the present time there are two different studies being made which involve the schools in this union. It would seem imperative that the Windsor School District be represented in these studies and I hope it will be possible for some person from the district to attend these meetings as they are announced.

You will note that your budget for 1964-65 has an in-

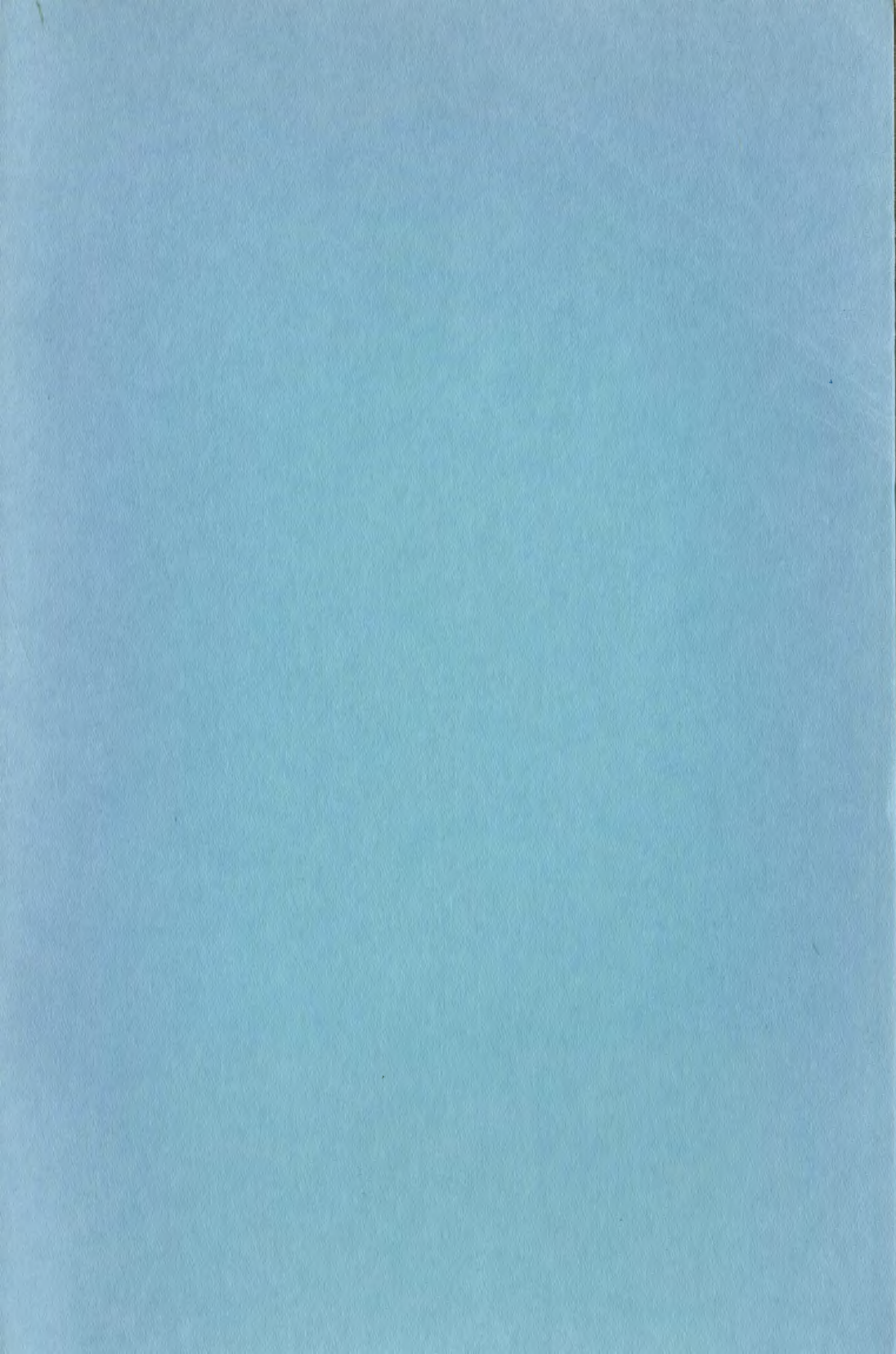
crease of a little less than \$500.00. This is due to the addition of one more tuition pupil and an increase in transportation.
