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

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### State of New Hampshire TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 10th. day of March, 1964, to act upon the following subjects: The Town Meeting will open at the conclusion of the School District Meeting; which is called for, at 6 p.m.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,100.00 for highways and bridge repair.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$600.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Road No. 62 White Pond Road such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Windsor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate \$19.49 as the 'Town's share.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$40.00 for Police and Forest Fire expenses.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the upkeep and painting of the Town House.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$30.00 for Street Lighting.
  - 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate

\$100.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemetery.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for the reconstruction of a bridge at Black Pond entering Guidance Camps, Inc.

12. To see if the Town will vote to grant permission to the Selectmen to withdraw \$500.00 plus accrued interest from the Capital Reserve Fund to be applied to the cost of the new bridge at Black Pond entering Guidance Camps, Inc.

13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2,500.00 for the purpose of reconstructing the bridge leading into Guidance Camps, Inc., such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of The Municipal Finance Act of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Windsor.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to be applied to the Capital Reserve Fund for future Bridge Construction.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

16. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

17. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this city or town?"

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the tenth day of March, 1964 at six o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.


