### REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

To the Citizens of Bow:

It is a pleasure for your school board to report an increased number of weeks of school over previous years, although the lengthened winter term may entail some hardship to those pupils living at some distance from school, yet we believe that to the town in general the increase of school advantages is of great benefit.

Your school board have endeavored to conscientiously look after your school children and school property. We have endeavored to obtain and retain good teachers, and we believe they have given reasonable satisfaction.

We have visited the schools at such times as seemed best to observe the work being accomplished, and given direction and encouragement to teacher and pupils whenever we have seen need.

The attendance at North Bow was somewhat injured by measles during the spring term, and Bow Mills School also suffered from whooping cough during the spring and an epidemic of measles in the winter term.

A new series of Readers have been introduced this year, giving new reading matter and increased interest.

We especially urge parents to visit the schools frequently and cooperate with the teachers for the good of the school.

The North Bow schoolhouse has been extensively repaired. The Bog schoolhouse has been shingled. The River Road schoolhouse has been shingled. The Bow Mills schoolhouse has been repaired and painted inside. The River Road schoolhouse needs painting. The Wood Hill schoolhouse needs a new chimney.

One hundred and twenty dollars will be needed to pay tuition of pupils attending Academy and High School. One hundred and twenty-five dollars will be needed to purchase text-books, scholars' supplies and flags.
