Warrant for Town Meeting

L. S. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Canaan, County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, a Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Overseer of the Poor, one Library Trustee for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, three Highway Agents, two Auditors, one Town Agent, Chief of Police, Surveyors of Lumber, Fence Viewers, Measurers of Wood and Bark, Weighers of Hay and Straw, Cemetery Agents, and such other officers as the Town may judge necessary to be chosen.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town's expenses, including all departments, or take any action thereto.

Article 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to start this year on construction of a coved sewer system, financing the same from money now being held in trust as a Post War Sewer fund, or take any action thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to lay out and maintain a road, including necessary bridges and culverts to the area South of the B. & M. R. R. tracks opposite the B. &. M. R. R station or take any action thereto. Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 to reconstruct the BULL Bridge, so called, or vote to discontinue this section of road as an open road, making it subject to Gates and Bars, or take any action thereto.

Article 7. To see if the town will anthorize the selectmen to make the following additions to the street lighting system:

A. One light near the Town tractor shed.

B. One light on the Switch Road, so called.

C. One light to extend the system on the River Road at Canaan Center, so called.

Article 8. To see of the Town will authorize the selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Article 10. To see what compensation will be paid town officers, and what limitation of time the Tax Collector may have to settle with the town.

Article 11. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors. Committees or Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

Polls to close at 6 o'clock.

FOREST WARDEN'S REPORT

Help Your Forest Fire Warden Prevent Fires-It Pays!

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire effort. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growth and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment at it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this—

- 1. Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.
- 2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.
- 3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.
- 4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.
- 5. HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES—his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him !

Superintendent's Report 1946-47.

As I re-read last year's report before writing this one there seem's to be little I can add in the way of basic needs or basic operating philosophy for the Canaan Schools. This will be more in the way of reemphasizing the needs. Some steps have been taken in the past year which make a better educational organization. Any system which permits two grades to a teacher instead of three is a step in the right direction. It is still a long ways from deriving full value for money spent both on the matter of transportation and on teachers' salaries. Organized properly Canaan could have a teacher per grade with an average enrollment 25 pupils or more, an ideal situation. It would cost no more for transportation for such a system. A beginning has been made in the matter of better lighting; the West Canaan playground has been improved.

Canaan must either begin to spend freely on building maintenance and equipment or must build new. Either way is going to cost more money than has been spent in the past. Several rooms lack basic equipment of window shades; there isn't one room that could not use them. This matter alone would run into several hundred dollars to do properly. Roofs need repairing, the water systems need renovating, antiquated desks should be replaced. We are still using the double desk, a hangover of the previous century. Only exceptional teachers can work successfully with these as many of you will recall from your days in school! A modern desk costs from \$12 to \$18. Every room needs to be cleaned, repainted and necessary preliminary repairs made. The high school building could use a heating system. All these things, and more, need to be done with the present system and then we will be only presentable. They'll cost money, and plenty of it. Every citizen must give this his best thought. We need to study carefully from our own selfish motives the new State Aid Program; we need all the money from tax sources other than property that we can get, and then some more. How do you wish to spend it? Shall we try to maintain a worn out system with worn out equipment and buildings or shall we let the rest of the state know that Canaan has turned the century and is living for today in preparation for tomorrow? Much has been written on a national scale of the educational experiment on Canaan Street for a few boys. The greatness of the United States is built on the education of the children of everyone at tax expense. Surely 300 boys and girls deserve something more than they are getting! No educational system is too good for our youth; as a nation we can not afford poor standards of education if we wish to survive. How many people have moved into Canaan because of its educational system?

It takes time to plan any building program but it need not take forever. Building costs are prohibitive at present. If they remain that way the State and Federal Government must help to build. Canaan should be ready for any aid it can get. Even the new state aid program might help materially towards a building program over a period of 20 years. There is some talk of Enfield and Canaan maintaining a consolidated high school. Educationally this would be wise. There are financial and administrative details which should be carefully studied. Perhaps an area school including elementary grades should be given thought. There are many possibilities in these programs but more important than any particular one is to get something done in order to get full value for a dollar spent. Alternative plans could be drawn up without taxing the ability of an architect unduly both for Canaan, for Enfield, or for both, combined or separately. Federal money is available now at no interest for planning. There is no reason why we should hesitate any longer to plan various alternatives. Canaan is fortunately situated on a railroad. Bristol isn't, and the railroad is missed. Canaan has an asset which many towns don't have. A new school, a new business or two, a bit of building and Canaan should grow. All take effort, and all are worth what it takes. Increased cash income is seldom refused by an individual; a community might profit by it too.

In all sincerity let's go to work for the best interests of all of Canaan.
