### CROYDON TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the 13th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, (the Polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1. To choose one Selectman for three years, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, two Auditors, Library Trustee for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, and all such Officers and Agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Town's business for the ensuing year.
- ART. 2. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$4,500.00 for Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To see if Town will accept State Aid for Class 5 Roads, and vote to raise and appropriate \$483.79 for same. The State to contribute \$3,225.26.
- ART. 4. To see if Town will accept State Aid for Class 5 Highways and Bridges and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.
- ART. 5. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Summer and Winter road maintenance.
- ART. 6. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Dump.

- ART. 7. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Expense of Highway Department.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting brush.
- ART. 9. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of cemeteries.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Capitol Reserve Fund to be used for new equipment.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights and lighting Town Buildings.
- ART. 12. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.
- ART. 13. To see if Town will authorize Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during year, in anticipation of taxes.
- ART. 14. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- ART. 15. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance.
- ART. 16. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$40.00 to promote Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- ART 17. To see what sum of money town will raise and appropriate for wages of Town Librarian.
- ART. 18. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$100.00 for Newport Hospital.
- ART. 19. To see if Town will vote to exempt from property taxes for three years, anyone desiring to build a dwelling house, the value of which is not less than \$5,000.00.
- ART. 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of a portable pump and hose.

ART. 21. To see if the Town will allow a discount of 1% on taxes paid within two weeks of presentation of tax bill.

ART. 22. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

### AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook—yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness—our carelessness. This, we—you—and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations—hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you—

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.
- 2. Secure the required burning permit.
- 3. Keep your fires under control.
- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned. Everyone will benefit by it.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Croydon:

#### Enrollment

This year the enrollment at the Village School is twenty-seven divided as follows:

Grade 1 14 Grade 2 6 Grade 3 7

Grade 1 is unusually large with 14 pupils. The Census Report, however, does not indicate that there will be more than normal-sized entering classes in the next few years—usually from 6 to 8 pupils.

#### Sale of Flat School

Pursuant to the vote of the 1961 Annual District Meeting authorizing the sale of the Flat School, the School Board advertised for sealed bids. Two offers were received—one for \$1,001.00 and the other for \$751.00. When the highest bidder withdrew his offer, the Board voted to accept the other offer of Royal A. Wallace. It is believed that Mr. Wallace intends to use the building to store and display his collection of antique automobiles.

#### **Building Improvements**

It was possible to add to the recent building improvements by installing a 66-gallon hot water heater. This provides an adequate supply of hot water—for the pupils and also the general cleaning of the building. It should be noted that the part-time custodians, Mr. and Mrs. Chester Smith, do an excellent job of keeping the building in tip-top cendition.

New door hardware to permit easy opening from inside in case of emergency has been installed. A new fire extinguisher has been added.

#### Conclusion

The school is operating smoothly. The continued cooperation of the School Board, school staff and citizens is appreciated.

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
Article 3. To choose a Member of the School Board

for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necess-sary.

Article 6. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating

thereto.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District Officials and Agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

Article 8. To transact any other businesss that may

legally come before this meeting.
