- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for civil defense and appropriate money for the same.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the health department.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town dump and appropriate money for the same.

- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the town sidewalk and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter care of Akers Pond Road and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Akers Pond Road.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to build a burial vault on the East side of the new cemetery annex and raise money for the same.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to have a municipal court, in accordance with RSA 502, Vol. 4, 1953.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the salary of the justice appointed to said court.
- 18. To see if the town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for expense of said court.
- 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to spray the town for insects and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountains Region Association.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to accept the proposal of of the Public Service Company of N. H., for the purchase of the Municipal Electric Distribution System and authorize the selectmen to employ legal counsel in connection therewith.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to advertise and sell the deisel equipment, buildings, and such other salvage items that are not sold to The Public Service Company.

23. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before the meeting.

Report of the Superintendent

1962-63

To the Members of the School Board and Citizens of Errol: For a Superintendent of Schools long in office two reports are easier to make than the others, his first and his last. Since I have announced my retirement in August of the current year this is probably my last public communication. During my twelve years as your Superintendent we have constantly been harassed with the problem of finding good teachers and the high cost associated with the employment of such. Happily, the school district has always been willing to raise the necessary funds so that until this current year the Board has always had sufficient money to employ any teachers who were available.

Another problem constantly before the Board was whether or not to continue the operation of the high school and seek approval by the State Department of Education. On each occasion when the matter was placed before the voters at the annual meeting the district voted, practically unanimously, to take whatever steps that were necessary to keep the school open and have it approved. At the last annual meeting (March, 1962) however, although no vote was taken to keep the school open, a motion was made to cut the budget by \$6,218.75. The School Board construed this as a vote against continuing the high school and began to plan accordingly.

When their plans were announced so much opposition was encountered the Board deemed it wise to call a special district meeting which was done on June 19th.

At this meeting the State Commissioner of Education, Mr. Charles Ritch, and his assistant, Mr. Frank Brown, were present and your Superintendent. After a question and answer period it was voted to employ three teachers for Grade 7 through 10 and set up courses which would be approved. The vote implied a willingness to expend such amount as was needed to carry out the above directive. The Board has performed the task set for it at the special meeting, proper teachers were found at a not excessive salary, Errol High School is duly approved for Grades 9 and 10 for the school year 1962-1963 and the Board now finds itself short of funds in the amount of \$3,000.00. This sum is established in an article for a deficiency appropriation in the warrant for the annual meeting.

In view of past votes by the district the Board has prepared a budget which should be sufficient to duplicate the present program for another year. From the remarks of the Commissioner at the June meeting the question may well arise as to whether or not such a program will be approved for 1963-64. So that there may be no confusion in the mind of the Board members it is deemed expedient again to place the matter of continuing the school before the voters of the district. This is being done by inserting a proper article n the warrant.

It seems that the voters must be familiar with all other possibilities in the matter, particularly the proposal to suspend operation of Grades 9 and 10 and furnish conveyance to all high school students, Grades 9 through 12, who wish to attend a given, agreed upon high school. The accompanying grade placement chart will show the number of young people involved.

Other than to place before you the foregoing matters as briefly as possible the purpose of this report is to introduce the statistical and financial data required by the Statutes. Within the framework of the possibilities and handicaps which face a small school system I believe we have had very good schools during the current school year. Preliminary tests and measurements show that adequate progress is being made and we anticipate the same results during the remainder of the year. I believe this has been the best year of the twelve.
