There are bills against the town for school books and school supplies for the current year, also a bill for legal service and advice, Sargent & Hollis, amounting in all to some \$150. We were unable to get proper vouchers in season hence they remain unsettled at the close of this year's accounts. These comprise, substantially, all the outstanding bills against the town so far as we know.

During the year there has been presented to this town for payment some \$1,200 in bills for breaking roads in the town during the

fiscal year 1892 and other bills for electric lighting in the Lakeport district, and for legal services, etc., etc., estimated to amount in all to some \$3,000.

On March 1, 1893, the close of the fiscal year 1892, there was cash in the treasury, in round numbers, \$500 and there was due from collector's books some \$3,500 or over, every cent of which was raised and appropriated by the people of the town for the payment of the bills of the town.

In the act of division, this money in the treasury and the uncollected taxes are given to the City of Laconia, as we say, in trust as it were, to be used for the purposes for which the people raised and appropriated it. The city officials claim otherwise, hence both town and city refuse to pay the bills and writs have been served on us by the Laconia Electric Light Company for their bill of some \$550 and another writ by William G. Cram of Lakeport, for a bill due him of some \$4.80

On the 23rd day of August, 1889, as is alleged, Carrie G. Colby and Ellen Morrill of this town, and a Mrs Dame of Lynn, Mass., while traveling upon the highway in this town (now in the City of Laconia) and near the Weirs Bridge received injuries estimated by them, at the time, at \$4,500. A suit was begun against this town last September by Mrs. Colby with damages claimed at \$2,000 and is now pending.

The case of Eleanor B. Hatch against the town for injuries received upon the highway with damages claimed at \$10,000, which was pending in court at the division of the town, has been settled during the year upon payment of the town of \$1,200.

## The School Board for 1893.

---

According to the laws of New Hampshire the school board must give an account of their stewardship in the care of the public schools in the town of Gilford.

We will say the school board have *tried* to do their work faithfully.

For further information of parents, et als. we print the following "School By-Laws," which were placed in each school room :

1. That teachers will fill out their registers properly before handing them to the school board.
2. That teachers keep a correct account of school books ; also hand in their monthly reports.
3. That scholars' deportment cards be handed in weekly for parents to sign.
4. That teachers furnish the school board with a program of his or her daily exercises, with the time of each designated.
5. That teachers be impartial in their school-room work.
6. That good order be maintained in all the schools.
7. That temperance, good morals and manners, and patriotism be taught regularly (in some way) in the different schools.
8. That written examinations of the various branches taught occur monthly, and be preserved for future reference.
9. That teachers be *humane* in their methods of punishment.
10. That pupils practice speaking each term, to encourage confidence.
11. That *supplementary* readings, also written and oral spelling be taught regularly each week, during the term.
12. That pupils be taught letter-writing, also the habit of thinking and observing
13. That pupils exercise *carefulness* in the use of their books and all school-room property.
14. That pupils refrain from *vulgarity* and *profanity* in and around the school-room.

The above shows SOMETHING of what we have attempted to accomplish in the schools the past year.

We think our teachers have done good work generally. The teachers influence comes next to the home influence. *What* an opportunity for sowing good seed—punctuality, promptness, cleanliness, truthfulness, sobriety, order, etc., provided the teacher but gains the “good will” of her pupils.

We wish our teachers might attend our State Normal School, where *methods* are taught of “How to Teach” at the present time; though *this* alone will not suffice; but good common sense, tact and good judgement, alone make the successful teacher; with *aptness* for a first requisite.

Our scholars, in the main, are as bright and smart a set as can be found in any town. We have *always* found (we speak from observation) that a *child* who was under WHOLESOME restraint at home, *seldom* if *ever* gave trouble in the school-room.

If parents *would*, when children come home with reports about school consult the teacher, or quietly visit the school, *before* taking sides or listening to *outside* talk, they would get at the *right* of the matter in nine cases out of ten. It is a sad fact, that but few of our parents WILL visit their respective schools, and the *saddest of all* is, that any instance of unpleasantness, which may have occurred in our schools the past year, is due, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY to home training or influence of such children.

As may be seen, we have tried to move out of the “old ruts” a little in the school-room work. Some of the *older* pupils declaring, “They had never written a composition before”.

A better method in the use of text books is needed.

Look in statistical table for new columns added—dismissed, tardy. Some schools make a bad showing here. These things can be obviated *in a measure*, by requiring a *note* from parents and guardians in such cases. The scholars have not been very prompt about returning deputation cards after they were signed.

In our State Normal School is taught, (among a great many other things,) the HORRORS of tale-bearing. It should be introduced in our schools. There is altogether *too much* of it practiced. It’s the YOUNG who we can influence for good. In conclusion we will say: There has been the USUAL amount of gossip and fault finding, (BY THE FEW), for *all of which* the committee feel *very grateful*.

We think it would be a good idea for the district to raise the sum of fifty dollars for the purpose of making some of these repairs this year.
