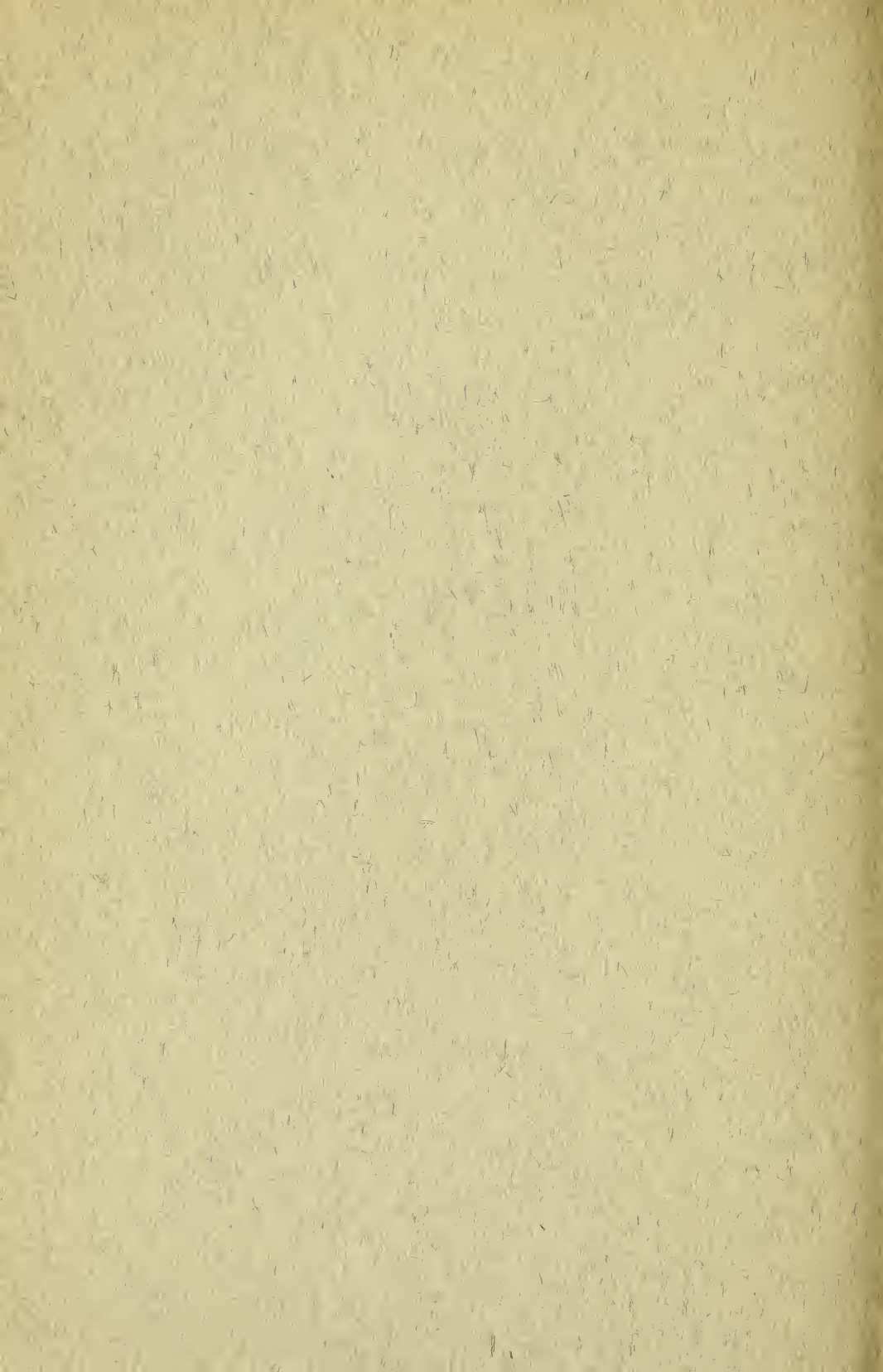

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.

4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

5. To see if the Town will allow a discount of three per cent upon all property taxes paid on or before June 1, 1942, of two per cent upon all property taxes paid on or before July 1, 1942, and of one per cent on all property taxes paid on or before August 1, 1942.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of one-quarter of one per cent.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.

9. To see if the Town will accept State aid for construction of Class 2 road, known as the Fourth New Hampshire Turnpike, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$561.00 and receive from the State the sum of \$2,244.00.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800.00, plus interest on \$2,400.00, to apply on Town debt.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$38.37 for issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region, said appropriation to be disbursed by the Selectmen.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

14. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from the Highway leading to the John Sargent Place, so-called, across the Hood Farm to the Hodge Place.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the purchase of six chemical fire extinguishers and supplies for the same. Said extinguishers to be in the care of the Town Safety Committee.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the annual sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for the

purpose of purchasing United States Flags and placing same on the graves, of all Veterans buried in this Town, each year before Memorial Day, May 30th.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35.00 to purchase and keep in repair forest fire equipment.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and ratify the granting of a right-of-way by the Selectmen to New Hampshire Electric Cooperative, Inc., for the purpose of constructing and maintaining its electric lines over and across property owned by the Town.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to purchase an adding machine for use of town officers.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to continue street lighting.

21. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.
