

WARRANT

(L. S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grantham, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer, and one Overseer of the Poor for the ensuing year, one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds and one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of the poor, and Old Age Assistance.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid for Highways and raise and appropriate money for same.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.

- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1942 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- Art. 9. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the Public Library.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the care of the cemeteries.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the park.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for control of the White Pine Blister Rust to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money if necessary.
- Art. 14. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Synopsis of Forest Fire Permit Law

(Chapter 191, Public Laws)

No person shall kindle a fire upon the land of another without permission from the owner, agent or caretaker thereof.

No person shall kindle a fire or burn any material in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste or cut over lands, or where the fire may be communicated to such land, except when the ground is covered with snow, without the written permission of the Forest Fire Warden or the presence of the warden or person designated to superintend such burning.

Any person, firm or corporation causing or kindling a fire without a permit, when a permit is required, and also any person, by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, is liable to the town for all expenses incurred in attending or extinguishing such fire.

Every person who shall set fire on any land, that

shall run upon the land of another, shall pay to the owner all damages done by such fire.

When permission has been obtained from the land owner, camp or cooking fires may be kindled without permission of the Forest Fire Warden (unless such permission is required by city or town), at suitable times and in suitable places where they will not endanger woodlands. Upon failure to totally extinguish such fires the parties responsible are subject to the same liabilities and penalties as are prescribed for other fires.

Penalty for kindling a fire without a permit, \$200, or imprisonment not more than thirty days.

Penalty for kindling a fire willfully, or in a careless or imprudent manner, \$500, or imprisonment not more than one year, or both.

The Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region

The Legislature of 1937 authorized the establishment of six Regions, each comprising a group of towns suggested by the State Planning & Development Commission. The Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region comprises this town and 37 others in this section of the state. The Region is incorporated as a non-profit corporation and its affairs are supervised by a group of officers chosen annually. The Region employs a full time secretary who is paid by the state (not by the towns). Thus your Region is a set-up established by law and the matter of whether or not it has sufficient financial support to render real service to your community rests with the voters of the towns. During its existence the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region can point to the following accomplishments: Through the publicity it has issued it has brought visitors to every town, some have established summer homes and others have become permanent residents. It has been instrumental in bringing industries to several towns. It has inaugurated plans that have saved historic landmarks. It has sponsored paying summer attractions. It has been active in bringing about a survey of our mineral resources that has resulted in revenue to many towns and has conducted studies of new agricultural products.

By an appropriation not exceeding 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, the Region now asks the support of your town in continuing the program that has brought about the aforementioned results and to institute the following three projects which, if carried through, must result in added income to each of the 38 towns of the Region: (a) A research of the possibilities of establishing industries that will use as raw materials, minerals within our area and make a study of the feasibility of the production, processing and sale

of several agricultural products that in the past have received but little attention. (2) To cooperate with each of the towns in preparing descriptive pamphlets showing the attractions, natural advantages and resources of the community with the idea of eventually incorporating such material into a book descriptive of the whole Region. (3) To establish a system of Recreation Trails following back highways and little used roads leading to scenic areas and desirable locations in each of the 38 towns. Letters of inquiry regarding any matter here mentioned will be welcome and given careful reply. Address, Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region, New London, N. H.

Notice to Dog Owners Chapter 150. Laws of New Hampshire

Section 6—Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually on or before April 30 cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name, and bearing attached to said collar a metal tag distinctly marked with its registered number. Said tag shall be furnished by the clerk at the expense

of the city or town from the amount received from

dog license fees.

Section 18—The mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually within ten days from May first issue a warrant to one or more police officers or constables directing them to proceed forthwith either to kill or cause to be killed all dogs within such city or town not licensed and collared according to the provision of this chapter, and to enter complaint against the owners or keepers thereof; and any person may, and every police officer and constable shall kill or cause to be killed all such dogs, whenever and wherever found.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Members of the School Board and Citizens of Grantham:

It is needless for me to call your attention to the conditions which prevail throughout the country and their consequent effect on our schools. It may be well however, to mention some of these as a matter of public record and for the benefit of those who are not immediately interested on account of not having children in the schools.

BUILDINGS

As mentioned in our report of a year ago the Grantham school buildings have been put in reasonably good shape, both as to paint on the exterior and on the interior. A large amount of the work which was done on the Grantham Village school is in part responsible for our financial deficit. This does not mean to say that we overdid the job at the village school but perhaps too much was done in one year.

A further drain on the little reserve we had was through the transportation of the pupils from the North Grantham school to the village. Some two hundred and sixty dollars was used in this way which has not yet been refunded by the State Board. When the transportation began the State Board was notified but scarcity of money and the unexpected condition has rendered it unable to make remuneration as yet.

STATE AID

The State Aid this year is a little larger than it was two years ago or even last year and will be in the vicinity of \$2300. The State Aid will be, for the rural towns, greater or smaller according as the representatives to the General Court see to it that provisions are made for equalization.

BUDGET

The budget for Grantham, for next year, shows a considerable increase. This will be true of other communities and is a circumstance of the times. This increase of nearly \$1,000 in the required assessment is positively necessary. Part is due to the increased number of pupils attending high schools and the rest to the general increase in cost of materials and teachers. In these particular times the quality of teachers is not necessarily increased nor enhanced by an increase in salary requirements.

HEALTH WORK

As last year, Miss Elizabeth Donovan, School Nurse from Lebanon is looking after the welfare of the children in Grantham. A statistical report of her findings of last year is herewith attached. A considerable number of cases of poor teeth and enlarged tonsils and adenoids are noted but in general the children are perfectly normal.

ENROLLMENT

The enrollment continues about the same as last year with perhaps a little increase at North Grantham. A list of the graduates from the eighth grade last June and the names of those who are attending high school is to be found on another page. I believe the printing of these names will make a public record of the high school attendance and the completion of the eighth grade.

TEACHERS

The teacher situation is most difficult. Other industries are paying high wages in shops which require much less skill and no public comment as to ones conduct and character. What we can do for teachers next year is something I do not know, although as heretofore, we will endeavor to do our best.

CONCLUSION

I am pleased to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the teachers who are with us this year and to the members of the School Board who have the financial and other responsibilities of the schools.
