THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, N. H., in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Highways and Bridges and make appropriations for the same.

4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Class V Highway and make appropriation for the same (\$131.05).

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$54.00 for Lakes Region Association for issuance of printed matter, etc., in cooperation with other Towns and make appropriations for the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise or set aside a certain sum of money to be used to purchase a piece of land on Newfound Lake. The same be set aside as a Memorial to the men and women from Hebron who have answered their Country's Call, and make appropriation for the same.

7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to contracting, for snow removal, to accept or hear bids and elect or approve agents, or instruct the Selectmen

to appoint and contract for the same and to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray this expense.

8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to putting a water system on the Common and to raise or set aside any sums of money, that may eventually be used for this purpose.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
