### **Dedication**

The Selectmen of Hillsborough respectfully dedicate the 1959 Town Reports to the memory of Marshall A. Derby for his distinctive record of community service as Judge and Town Clerk.

## Warrant Hillsborough, New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hillsborough, County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Hillsboro-Deering High School Auditorium in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon. Election of officers will take place between 10 o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the afternoon. Articles 2 through 24 will be taken up at 7:30 p.m.

Article 1. To choose one Selectman for three years; Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, Town Clerk for one year; Trustee of the Fuller Public Library for two years; Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one member of the Cemetery Committee for three years, and all other necessary town officers or agents for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear the reports of the town officers to the auditors, the reports of the auditors, agents, committees or other town officers heretofore chosen or appointed and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, town Building, appropriations for street lights, and all current expenses of the town. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and repairing of highways, bridges, culverts, and sidewalks. — Sponsored by the Selectmen and Road Agent.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to be applied to the Capitol Reserve Fund for the future purchase of Highway Equipment. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$2,300.00) to be applied upon the account of the Hillsboro District Nursing Association. — Sponsored by the District Nursing Association.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct and empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses of the town and in anticipation of taxes. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350.00) for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association. — Sponsored by the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Regional Association.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of chapter 83, laws of 1951, as amended by chapter 31, Laws of 1953 and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on notes or bonds an amount of Nineteen Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$19,400.00) for the completion of the Bear Hill Road between Bridge Street and the Henniker Town line, such sum to be raised in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute and amendments thereto and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes and to determine the time and place of payment thereof, under such terms and conditions as they may deem to be in the best interests of the Town.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the hire of a clerk-stenographer by the Selectmen, to handle bookkeeping, general office work, and to keep the Town Office open approximately twenty hours a week for the convenience of the public. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Town Tax Collector commencing the second Tuesday of March, 1961. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$3,800.00) for the purchase of a new truck to be used by the Highway Department. — Sponsored by the Selectmen and Road Agent.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for the support of band concerts by the Hillsboro Band for

the coming season. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the purpose of dismantling and removing the old Grammar School Building. — Sponsored by the Planning Board and the Selectmen.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the reconstruction of Preston Street from Henniker Road to a point just beyond the M. Parker homestead on Preston Street and Butler Street from West Main Street to Myrtle Street. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit. — Sponsored by the State Tax Commission.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey by deed, under such conditions and to such persons as the Board may consider proper, the title to real estate taken by the town in default or redemption from a tax sale. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the upkeep of Town Cemeteries. — Sponsored by the Cemetery Committee.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Hundred and Twenty Four Dollars (\$924.00) to aid the Concord Hospital at Concord, New Hampshire. — Sponsored by the Concord Hospital.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand six Hundred and Fifteen Dollars and Five Cents (\$2,615.05) to complete payment of property reappraisal bill due to insufficient appropriation voted in 1957. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to accept the deed of Selwin Davis conveying a new road, the so-called Harvey Way, to the town upon completion, subject to the approval of the Highway Agent and Selectmen. — Sponsored by Selwin Davis.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to go back to the old system of electing the Chief of Police starting in 1961. — Sponsored by Spurgeon Smith.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for operating a recreation program for children. — Sponsored by the Recreation Council.

Article 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

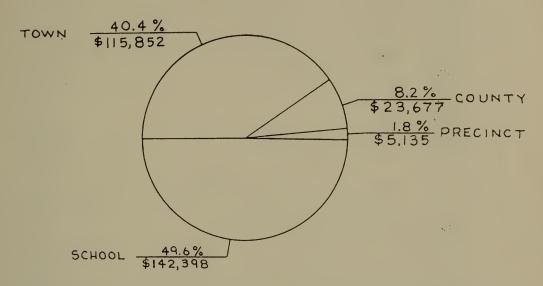

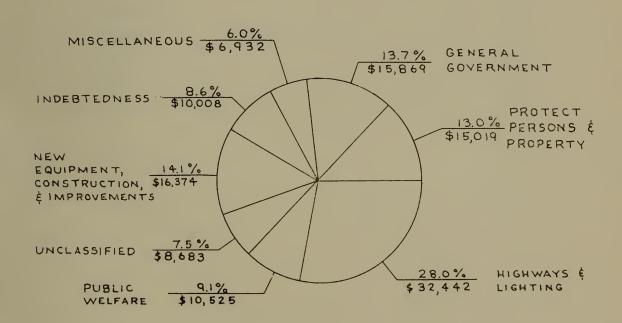

# Prevention is Everybody's Business

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note: 58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners.

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple —

- 1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
- 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- 4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles use your ash tray.
- 5. Don't burn at home use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hillsboro-Deering Coogerative High School gymnasium in said district on the 4th day of March, 1960, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator pro tempore for the present year.
- 2. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year, a memberat-large of the school board for the ensuing three years and a member-at-large for the ensuing five years, and two auditors for the present year.
- 3. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 4. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire for the school year 1960-61.

estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and citizens of Hillsboro and Deering:

It is a pleasure to present my sixth annual report for your consideration.

The enrollment as of September 1959 was 553. This is an increase of 17 over September 1958. Our pupil projection study, which follows, indicates that a similar increase is to be expected in the years immediately following.

Fortunately, the indicated increase will fall in the area of the junior and senior high school and it is anticipated that there will be adequate space to care for the increased number of pupils. It will probably mean that the music groups will have to move back to the gym for their classes, and that the teachers room on the second floor will have to be used as a classroom.

It is too early to become unduly concerned about housing for our pupils, but certainly your School Board and superintendent should find it necessary to keep a watchful eye on the census figures which are compiled each fall.

The total bonded indebtedness for the school district was \$380,000. As of June 30, 1959, this had been reduced to \$270,000. The last payment for bond issue No. 1 for the elementary wing is in April 1971, and the last payment for bond issue No. 2 for the Haslet wing is in February 1972. Payment on these bonds are being made at the rate of \$20,000 per year; \$8,000 of this coming from the State.

Due to the increased enrollment in grades 7-12, it was necessary to purchase 30 desk and chair units for home room stations. It will be necessary to do that again this year for the same reason. In one more year, we will have completed our program of replacing the old lighting fixtures with modern fluorescent lighting. This will not only improve lighting but will reduce the electricity consumption. Our Library facilities are improving each year. Through generous gifts and regular purchases, the facilities are fast acquiring some degree of adequacy.

Through prudent use of the Haslet Fund income, and receipts from the National Defense Act, our laboratories are becoming well equipped as those of you who have visited these facilities can certify. The N.H. Distributing Agency has provided us with both equipment and food, for which we merely pay the cost of transportation.

It has been a real pleasure to observe, in the past few

years, the growth in interest among the pupils of their scholastic attainment. Our test results clearly show that they are working much closer to their potential than here-tofore. Much credit must be given to them for this changing attitude.

Much credit, also, should be given to the faculty for encouraging the youngsters toward this attitude. We are indeed fortunate to have such a fine staff in these times of teacher scarcity. Apparently the strength of our staff is recognized outside of our community also, as this is the first time in my memory that we have been requested to accept five practice teachers in one school year.

For the school year 1958-59 the per pupil cost in the Hillsboro-Deering Cooperative School was \$375.33 as compared with the state average of \$399. These figures exclude transportation and capital expenditures. In comparing our cost with other high schools of the State in 1957-58 we were 35th from the top in a total of 79 schools. In 1958-59 we were 47th from the top in a group of 72 high schools. It is apparent that although our costs have been increasing, they have not increased at as high a rate as those schools above us on the list.

This has been a pleasant year in more ways than one, and I wish to thank the School Board, faculty, pupils and citizens of Hillsboro and Deering for the support they have given the school and me.

# SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

To the Board of Education:

I am submitting an account of the school nursing work for the school year 1958-59.

The pre-school registration for next September, took place in school in the month of May as in previous years with both teachers of first grade present, 44 registered and 9 of them had not yet been vaccinated against small pox; however, I am pleased to state that at his writing every one is now properly vaccinated. Nearly every one had their 3 shots of anti-polio vaccine, and several had their 4th one, or so-called Booster.

Many had their dental work done or are under the process of being done. We held a dental clinic at Dr. Baldwin's offices during this last year. This was made possible through the generosity of the P.T.A. and the amount paid by them was matched by the State. Thirty-eight pupils had all their dental work done with most of them requiring a number of visits to the dentist and numerous treatments, a noble experiment which I hope will be continued next year.

The hearing test was given to nearly eveyone in school—534 to be exact, and several teachers. This was done with our new Audivox Audiometer and the test is given individually. Two were found with complete loss of hearing of one ear only, these 2 have had the attention of an Otologist. Several others were found slightly defective due to temporary causes, and have been taken care of accordingly.

The Lion's Club paid for 3 pairs of glasses for school children and one adult.

We usually have the T.B. Patch Clinic and chest x-ray in our school every two years, and we are due for the next one in the spring of 1960.

Inspection of children in the grades were made at frequent intervals.

162 pupils received nursing care in one form or another. Several were taken to their family physician for further treatment and then taken home and followed-up until they are ready to come to school. We had some Impetigo, not too many cases, as they are followed very closely. We also had a few cases of Scarletina, Measles, and Chicken Pox — no epidemic this year.

Free lunches were provided by the school to 18 pupils.

Thanksgiving dinners were given to 7 children and paid by me with our Salvation Army Fund.

The school census was taken by me in the town of Hillsboro during the months of July and August of 1958. I have reported to school daily, usually after lunch and during the forenoon when called in for someone sick or an emergency.
