TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of New Durham, in the county of Strafford, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said New Durham, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the public library in addition to the amount required by law.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize a discount of two per cent on all property taxes paid on or before July first, 1932.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$726.00 to secure state aid construction, the state to give \$1,452.00.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 to secure state aid maintenance, the state to give \$825.00.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$900.00 to secure state aid maintenance for the trunk line, the state to give \$4,500.00.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to fight white pine blister rust, the state to give twenty-five per cent.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on the credit of the town to pay its just debts.

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of New Durham:

School statistics for the school year 1930-1931 were as follows:

Number of pupils registered, 68; 40 boys, and 28 girls.

The number in the several grades was as follows:

Grade I, 9; Grade II, 8; Grade III, 11; Grade IV, 8; Grade V, 8; Grade VI, 7; Grade VII, 6; Grade VIII, 11. Average attendance was 55; per cent of attendance, 93; number of visits by school board, 17; by the superintendent, 62; by citizens, 47; pupils neither absent nor tardy, 11.

All of the school teachers and workers remain the same as last year.

SCHOOL APPROPRIATIONS

The school officials have prepared a budget to the limit for a good many years. The amount for high school tuitions and elementary tuitions is fixed by law. Sixteen high school pupils and six elementary have been registered for tuitions this year. The state aid law requires a tax of \$5 on a thousand of equalized valuation to qualify for state aid. We are getting approximately \$2,000 from the state at present without which we could not maintain standard schools. The administration items have been kept at a minimum. It would seem that the New Durham School District would not be satisfied with anything less than the budget gives.

The school buildings are in fair condition.

The school officials appreciate the cooperation of all those who are interested in the work of the New Durham schools.

Very earnest commendation is given to the 4-H Club and the leader for the needed project of wiring the Plains school building for electric lights.
