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## TOWN WARRANT

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Orange in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orange on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote: A Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, a Tax Collector, a Road Agent, a Constable, One Trustee of Trust Funds for one year, one Cemetery Agent, one Overseer of Public Welfare, Fence Viewers, Measurers of Wood, Bark and Lumber and all other officers that the Town may judge necessary.

ARTICLE 2. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for the payment of town charges for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 to pay Town House expense.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Summer maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for Winter maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town Truck.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purchase and installation of a Hydraulic Lift for the Town Truck.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$207.53 for Town Road Aid and the State will contribute \$1,383.51.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$40.00 for Insurance on the Town House.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for Insurance on the Town Truck.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Old Age Assistance.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the Town Library .

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for the maintenance of the Town Cemeteries.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5.00 for the decoration of the Soldiers Graves on Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to hire the Canaan Fire Department for services in case of fires in Orange, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for this purpose. Said sum to be placed in the Orange Fire Trust Fund.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes to pay necessary town charges.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to pay interest on borrowed money.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Deeding Agent to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds in the Town.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid in full within fifteen days from the date of tax bill, of 3 percent.

ARTICLE 20. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and other Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting not included in the Warrant.

ARTICLE 22. The polls shall not close earlier than five of the clock in the afternoon.

## REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

The following is a summary of Health Activities conducted by the N. H. Division of Public Health, Public Health Nursing, for children in the town of Orange.

The immunization programs have been covered by clinics conducted in Canaan and Lebanon. Notifications were made of these clinics through the schools and press.

The school children attending Canaan schools were given the Sterneedle Tuberculin Test at school if the permits were signed requesting same. The positive reactors of the tests were followed through chest x-ray clinics or private physicians.

The residents of Orange are welcome to attend clinics in Canaan, Enfield or Lebanon conducted by the N. H. Division of Public Health and N. H. Tuberculosis and Health Association.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND

### DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump—its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.
