To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of
Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Strafford Elementary School in said Strafford on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

PLEASE NOTE: Articles 2-20 will be taken up at 7:30 p.m.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Public Welfare including Old Age Assistance and Soldiers Aid.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 and the State will allocate \$6,000.00 for Class II construction on Strafford-Dover Road.

6. To see if the Town will accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$914.06 and the State will contribute \$6,093.74.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to replace old snow fence.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.00 to purchase a rock rake for use in the highway department.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to rebuild or replace all bridges that are necessary.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the operating expense of the Bow Lake fire trucks.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$179.35, which is 1/200th of 1 % of the equalized valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Disease.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Civilian Defense.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$620.00 for street lighting.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 toward the expense of re-appraisal of the Town.

17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to join the New Hampshire Municipal Association and raise and appropriate the sum of \$33.77 for annual dues.

18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

19. To see if the Town will grant any discount on property taxes paid in full within thirty days of date of issue of tax collector's warrant.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF ROAD AGENT

To the Selectmen and Citizens of Strafford:

The following report is to try and give you some idea of what the Road Agent has been doing.

The large number of ice storms and heavy snow in February made the winter of 1962 a very expensive one. The use of bulk salt helped in keeping our black roads bare. Salting is much cheaper than sanding and more effective except in extreme cold weather.

I have started clearing large stones and boulders from the dirt roads. This will help in plowing, traveling and drainage. I hope this program will be continued this year.

All the black roads in Crown Point were tarred this year. In two years we have tarred all the town black roads. The new mix and place roads should be tarred every four or five years and the older roads every three years.

Two bridges have been rebuilt using treated oak plank and they should last for several years. There are five more bridges to be rebuilt and that work must be done this year. One will be replaced with a large culvert. It would not be advisable to use a culvert to replace any of the other bridges. It will cost around \$2,000 to complete this project and there should be a special appropriation for this as it is too large a sum to take out of the highway maintenance appropriation. This project is a must.

I strongly recommend that the town purchase a rock rake for use on the dirt roads. It is asking too much of any Road Agent to buy all the necessary equipment to maintain the roads when he only has the job from year to year.

The snow fence program should be continued. The high winds of early January did much damage to some of the old fence.

After a careful study it was decided not to use reclaimed oil on the dirt roads because it creates a lot of mud in the spring making for very greasy roads. Some towns that used it had to gravel the roads to make them passable. Calcium chloride was tried on some hills with fair success. The increased cost of chloride makes this a very expensive program.

The heavy rains of the late fall did much damage to many roads requiring over 150 loads of gravel to fix them.

I would like to thank all the townspeople for the cooperation during the past year and to thank all the town officers for their help and support.

PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 220 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set, man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules:

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
4. Have something to keep the fire under control - pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

In 1962 we had 3 fires, burned 1½ acres and issued 70 permits.

The Strafford School opened in September with only one change in personnel. Mr. Paul Bolich replaced Mr. Wadsworth Winslow as supervisor of vocal and instrumental music. This seems to indicate that there is mutual satisfaction between school personnel, pupils and citizens of Strafford.

WENH-TV, Channel 11, continues to supplement the educational program of your school. This year a course in reading and a course in art have been added. Optimum use should be made of this source of programs to enrich the curriculum.

The school district of Strafford will be one of the few districts in the state of New Hampshire which can boast a decrease in the 1963-64 budget over the previous year. This is due in part to a decrease in enrollment of secondary tuition pupils and to an agreement made by the teachers last year they would not request an increase for 1963-64.

Additional library books have been purchased with district funds to supplement the number of volumes that originated with funds given to the school by the Cen-Bow-La, Inc. last year.

Also, during the past year, thirteen volumes were donated by the Strafford Women's Club, twenty-four by the Strafford P.T.A., and a sizeable order was purchased with school funds received through the sale of magazine subscriptions. Individual contributions of both money and books have added to the library which now numbers approximately six hundred volumes.

These have been catalogued and arranged according to the Dewey Decimal classification, thus giving your children library facilities almost equal to those enjoyed by pupils in much larger schools.

This is a legislative year and the citizens of Strafford are encouraged to become well informed with legislation for education and through their local representatives support legislation which will be beneficial to your school and community. The need for greater state aid to education is imperative.

Mr. William Lynbourg is to be commended for the condition in which he keeps the building and Mrs. Caverly also should be commended for the fine lunch program that the children enjoy.

In conclusion, I should like to express the appreciation of myself and the school board for the cooperation given during the school year by the citizens, teachers, and pupils of Strafford. I would also like to thank the board for their cooperation.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

In the following report I have attempted to clarify the duties of the School Nurse, and to explain briefly the school health program.

My schedule must of necessity be a flexible one. However, it allows for at least one visit per week to each of the schools in the area, and a second weekly visit is frequently made to each of the two largest schools, Barrington and Epsom. The schedule is set up in this manner:

Barrington — Monday

When a second visit seems necessary it is made on Thursday afternoon.

Epsom — Friday

A second visit to this school would be made on Tuesday afternoon.

Northwood — Wednesday

Nottingham — Tuesday

Strafford — Thursday

Changes are made as needed to accommodate the immediate needs of any particular school. In which case, the principal of the school scheduled for a visit is notified. This makes it possible, in the event of an emergency, for the nurse to be located by any of the schools without undue delay.

All pupils are examined as soon after the start of the school year as possible. Height, weight, teeth, tonsils and eyes are checked then. The hearing test may also be given at this time or be done in the spring. Inspection of hair and scalp is done at least twice yearly.

Notices of defects are sent home, and these children again checked at a later date to determine the number of corrections which have been made when recourse to the health resources of the state seems advisable, referrals may be made by the school nurse, and she provides application forms.

First aid at the school is given by the nurse if she is present. Otherwise it is given by the teacher and later checked by the nurse if this appears to be warranted. Also, any child showing symptoms of illness or disease is seen by the nurse if possible. The parents are notified of the child's condition, and it is their responsibility to provide transportation home; although under certain circumstances the nurse may see fit to take the child home.

Home visits are made, either in response to a request by the parents, or when it is felt that a personal discussion with the parents might be of benefit to all concerned. As of December 31, 1962, a total of 101 home calls had been made.

I have been very graciously received by the parents, and they have been most cooperative in providing the necessary care for the children. It is this cooperation which makes a real success of the health program. I am deeply grateful for it.

I also wish to express appreciation to Mr. Martineau, the School Board and Teachers for their helpfulness.
