RICHARD KATZE FOR THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The past year has been one of many firsts (or at least rarities).

Sullivan is currently a debt free Town. We have paid off our TAN (tax anticipation note) a number of months ago, (saving us \$6,000.00 a year in interest charges).

As you probably know, we have acquired a parcel of land by tax deed. \$73,000 was owed to the Town and we sold it for \$89,500.

The Selectmen are attempting to run the Town as one would run a successful business. I believe that instead of reacting to one catastrophe and calamity after another, and doing our best to apply yet another Band-Aid, Joe and Ed who both have years of experience navigating through the business world and dealing with countless personalities of co-workers and employees, have devoted an enormous amount of time and talent to accomplish this result.

A new Town Hall could be in our future — details will be available at the Town Meeting and I think that it's a rare opportunity that shouldn't be passed up. I'll try to encapsulate what is envisioned. We have matching funds to build the new Town Hall. If the Town contributes the proceeds from the sale of Pinetum (\$89,500) toward theproject, that amount is already pledged to complete the project. That still leaves the Town with the old Town Hall which we can sell or use or rent or whatever the voters decide on.

In closing let me Thank Ed and Joe who have been in the front lines daily, seven days a week and who have taken the heat and shared the praise while I have been stuck in a Pharmacy six days a week for most of the year.

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for deposit to the Capital Reserve for major repairs to Town buildings.

ARTICLE 15

Voted, by voice vote, to authorize the Selectmen to sell any real estate acquired by the Town during the period until next Town meeting and that the Selectmen be authorized to sell and convey such real estate by auction, sealed bid or in any other manner as justice may require.

ARTICLE 16

Voted, by voice vote, the Town will grant to the Planning Board the authority to conduct site plan review of industrial, commercial, multifamily and change of use developments as defined by State Law.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN OF SULLIVAN 1996 TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in the said State of qualified in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Sullivan Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday the Twelfth (12th) day of March next at 11:00 AM of the clock to act upon the following by written ballot: the polls not to close before 7:00 PM.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers and School District Officals for the ensuing year.
- 2. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article I to conform to the language in the RSA 674:17 as follows: "Purpose and Authority: This Ordinance has been adopted in accordance with RSA 674:17 in order to insure that the Town of Sullivan shall have the benefits of land use regulations in order to lessen congestion on our streets; to secure safety from fires, panic and other dangers; to promote health and the general welfare; to provide adequate light and air; to prevent overcrowding of land; to avoid undue concentration of population; to facilitate the adequate provision of transportation, solid waste facilities, water, sewage, schools, parks, andchild care; and to assure proper use of natural resources and other public requirements." Yes or No.
- 3. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article II to add the following section: "D. The areas near Chapman Pond, Bolster Pond, and the Ashuelot Rivers are protected under the provisions of the Comprehensive Shoreline Protection Act (RSA 483 B) and are subject to that law." Yes or No.
- 4. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article III, section A 2 to read as follows: "The following uses are permitted by a special exception from the Sullivan Board of Adjustment in accordance with Article VI." Yes or No.
- 5. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article III, section B 4 to read as follows: "Minimum Road Frontage200 feet." Yes or No.
- 6. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article IV, section I to read as follows: "Permanent Foundations: All one and two including manufactured housing shall be placed on a permanent continous foundation. Manufactured housing may be placed on a floating slab as defined by the most current BOCA National Building Code and shall be properly skirted." Yes or No.
- 7. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article IV, section K to read as follows: "K. Septic and Water Systems: Location of septic and water systems shall comply with existing state and local regulations. Approval of new septic systems shall be a prerequisite for building permit approval on new dwelling units." Yes or No.
- 8. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article V, Section A to read as follows: "When required. A building permit shall be required under the following

circumstances:

- 1. To erect or place any type of building or any structure which will be over 100 square feet.
- 2. To construct any addition or structural alteration
- to an existing building.
- 3. To alter any non-residential structure to make it suitable for residential use.
- 4. To move an existing building to a new site on the same lot or to move or link two or more existing structures to a single site if the resulting structure is greater than 100 square feet.
- 5. To construct a building to be used for commercial purposes.

A permit shall not be required for normal maintenance or repairs to, or redecoration of a building."

and to delete Article V, section C "Application for accessory building permit." Yes or No.

- 9. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article IV G and Article IV H to add the following sentence: "Applicants should also consult Article III B forthe proper dimensions, setbacks, and density requirements; and Article V A for building permit requirements." Yes or No.
- 10. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance Article VI, section A to read as follows: "Creation: The Board of Adjustment is created to (1) hear appeals from an administrative decision made by the Selectmen and any other Town Administrative Officers regarding the Community Planning Ordinance; (2) to grant special execptions; and (3) to grant variances." Yes or No.
- 11. Are you in favor of adding the following article to the Community Planning Ordiance: "Article VI, section D. Variances: Wherea variance is called for under the provisions of the Communtiy Planning Ordinance, applicants must convincingly demonstrate to the Board of Adjustment ALL of the following:
- 1. That denial of the variance will result in "unnecessary hardship" to the owner seeking it, and
- 2. That no decrease in the value of surrounding properties will result if the variance is granted, and
 3. That granting the variance would benefit the public
- interest, and
- 4. That the proposed use is not contrary to the spirit and intent of the community Planning Ordinance, and
- 5. That by granting the variance, substantial justice will be done." Yes or No.
- 12. Are you in favor of amending the Community Planning Ordinance article VII to read as follows: "Remedies provided in RSA 676:15 and RSA 676:17 are hereby made available to the Selectmen except that no fine shall exceed \$100 per day for each day a violation continues." and deleting Article V, section G which repeats the fines stated in Article VII. Yes or No.

- 13. Are you in favor of adding the following definition to Article XI:
 "Multi-family Housing. Multi-family housing is any housing unit containing more than 2 dwelling units." Yes or No.
- 14. Are you in favor ofdeleting the current definition of a building in Article XI and substituting the following:
 "Building. Any structure having a roof or intended for the

building in Article XI and substituting the following:
"Building. Any structure having a roof or intended for the
shelter, housing or enclossure of persons, animals or materials,
equipment etc. This will include towers, pools and parking lots."

- 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 for the Purchase of a Sander for the Highway Department or take any action relating thereto. (Approved By: Budget Committee and Selectmen)
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for deposit to the Capital Reserve for Major Repairs to Town Buildings or take any action relating thereto. (Approved By: Budget Committee and Selectmen)

- 33. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to expend the sum of \$91,500 (which has been privately contributed and pledged to the Town for such purpose) together with such additional sums as may be contributed or pledged, for the construction of a new Town Hall; and also to appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to expend to such purpose the sum of \$88,500 received by the Town in January 1996 through the sale by the Town of the so-called Pinetum property. This appropriation shall be a non-lapsing account per RSA 32:7 VI, and may be encumbered by the Selectmen until December 31, 2000, when it shall lapse. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$30,000.00 which has been privately pledged to the Town for the purpose of carrying out the relocation of the Highway Department in connection with the new Town Hall project, and to appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to expend such sum for such purpose. This appropriation shall be a non-lapsing account per RSA 32:7 VI, and may be encumbered by the Selectmen until December 31, 2000, when it shall lapse. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to exchange with the United Congregational Church of Sullivan certain lands and land rights, consisting of 2.3 acres more or less, presently owned by the Town between the Church and the Meetinghouse Cemetery for certain lands and land rights, consisting of 3.7 acres more or less, presently owned by the Church located on Centre Street between the Church and the Sullivan Fire Station, for the purpose of establishing a suitable town-owned parcel of land for the construction of a new Town Hall on Centre Street, and to authorize the Selectmen to sign the contract and any deeds necessary to carry out the intention of this article, or take any action thereon. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this article.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to have the Chief of Police Appointed by the Selectmen instead of being Elected.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for deposit in a Dry Hydrant Capital Reserve or take any action relating thereto. (Approved By: Budget Committee and Selectmen)
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the providing of meals to needy Sullivan residents furnished and distributed by the Community Kitchens Inc. or take any action relating thereto (Not Recommended By the Budget Committee or Selectmen)
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to reopen the so called Old Ellis Mill Road which was subject to gates and bars at the 1982 Twon Meeting Beginning at the junction of Ellis Road and the Old Ellis Mill Road to the driveway of land owned by Elaine M. Wheeler.

- 40. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,000 which was added by voice vote to the Cemetery Maintenance Fund, but intended for the Cemetery Expansion Capital Reserve Fund, from the General Fund to the Cemetery Expansion Capital Reserve Fund, or take any action relating thereto.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any Real Estate Acquired by the Town during the period until next Town Meeting and that the Selectmen be authorized to sell and convey such Real Estate by auction, sealed bid or in any other manner as Justice May Cause.
- 42. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Agents and Committees as printed in the Town Report.
- 43. To transact any Business which may Legally come before this Meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of Town Affairs for the ensuing year.

SULLIVAN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

1995 was a busy year for the Sullivan Office of Emergency Management. This office is involved in a number of projects, started in "95", that have helped to bring the Town up to standards that are required by the State and Federal Government. Progress has been slow on a few of the plans and programs, but I am confident that they will be completed in 1996. An average of 10 to 15 hours a week was spent working on these programs, and training.

The following is a brief summary of the training programs and projects this office has been working on.

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL PLAN

This plan is required by the Federal Government under the Superfund Act known as SARA Title III. We are required to create emergence plans for harzardous material accidents that could occur in town as well as keeping records of hazardous materials in Town as part of the COMMUNITY RIGHT TO KNOW. The first draft of the hazardous materials plan was submitted to the Concord Office for review in May and then again in July. I received notice from the State in December of a few items that have to be added to the plan. At this point the plans should be completed in the next few months.

E-911 SYSTEM

The "911" SYSTEM for Sullivan has been a slow and tedious project. Mapping for the Town was done in August and in January of this year we received the set of maps which show the location of our homes. Needless to say there are many corrections that have to be made. Each of the 4 maps have homes that are not in the correct locations, off by 300 feet or more. At this time the 911 system is working in Sullivan. You will get an answer if you dial 911, but the operator will not have access to your name or address. There is still much work that needs to be done before the system is complete.

SAFETY PROGRAM

As required by the State Department of Labor, the Town (as an employer) is required to have in place a written Safety Program, and a "Safety Committee", or as it is called The Joint Loss Management Committee. This program and committee had to be in place by January 1,1996. Failure to do so would result in a penalty to the Town of \$1,000.00 per day. I am pleased to say that we were able to meet the January 1 deadline. The next step is start the Safety Inspection Process. We will cover safety issues with the Employees and volunteers of the Town's various Departments and also inspect Town Buildings.

FIRE DEPT. BY-LAWS AND PROCEDURES

This office has assisted the Fire Department with the up dating of the Department's By-Laws and is now working with the members to up date the Standard Operating Procedures. The procedures will then become included as part of the Town's basic Emergency Plan.

TRAINING

To better serve the Town as Director, I have attended a total of 60 hours of training classes and seminars at the State Office of Emergency Management in Concord, and I have completed 4 courses offered by FEMA, through the Federal Emergency Management Institute in Maryland. There is no cost to the Town for this training.

Sullivan Housing Rehabilitation Project a \$350,000 Community Development Block Grant

The Sullivan Housing Rehabilitation Project is a \$350,000 grant which the applied for on behalf of its low to moderate income residents in June, 1994. \$18,000 per household is available for single family and multi family homes are eligible as is the replacement of mobile homes under certain circumstances. Southwest Region Planning Commission is presently administering the grant at the request of the Town.

1995 was a productive construction season yet fell shor of its expected goals. Only twelve units, or about half of the projected number, were found eligible for rehabilitation. Most construction budgets exceed the \$18,000 allowance which required considerabele effort on behalf of both the homeowners and the Planning commission to acquire additional funding elsewhere. It should be noted that every homeowner took pride in contributing to the work performed at their homes in order to keep costs down.

Because of the successful aspects of those homes rehabilitated, the Selectmen are considering a request to the NH Office of State Planning for a six month time extension. The Citizen's Advisory Committee which reports directly to the Selectmen is also considering alterations to the grant's Program Design which may allow previously ineligible applicants to participate. The overall goal is to give the residents of Sullivan a second chance to utilize these funds before returning them to the State for use in another community.

Cemetery Report - 1995

One new lawn mower was puchased from Guyette Sales & Service. This is the mulch maker type with large wheels .

The Cemetery Committee is still working on plans for the expansion of the Centre St. Cemetery extention. Hopefully, by this spring construction will be able to continue. The original cemetery is nearly full to capacity with only a few remaining lots.

The Old Cemetery has had some grave stones knocked over and a few broken. A few trees were trimmed back and dead leaves were raked away from several hidden stones.

I look foward to the on-coming yeat of maintaining the two cemeteries and monument. I maintained the cemeteries for less money than was appropriated for the 1995 budget, so the excess was turned back in.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

December 31, 1995, marked the conclusion of a very productive year for your Planning Board. These accomplishments include a new Master Plan, site plan review regulations, andamendments to our Community Planning Ordinance.

After years of labor, surveys, consultations, and much deliberation, the Town's 1980 Master Plan has been completely revised and rewritten. This includes a new base map and property lines map as well as updated goals and objectives. The Master plan points to a need to rebuild our community center, adopt a building code, and continue on our course of maintaining a rural residential environment.

The Board was able to review the 1989 Community Planning Ordinance and has made 13 proposed changes to be placed on the March ballot. While most of these changes simply bring the Town's Ordinance in line with changes in the State Law, there are proposed changes in the frontage requirements for new subdivisions and a new building permit system. The changes will also clarify the role of the Board of Adjustment. The Board decided to hold back a change in the acreage requirement for a new zone until 1996.

In July, the Board adopted the Town's first site plan review regulations. Our first use of the regulation came in December.

In 1995, we conducted 5 preliminary consultations on proposed subdivisions. However, only one subdivision was completed during this year. The rest were either withdrawn or will be brought back during 1996.

We reviewed two applications for driveway permits. We granted one and held the other until 1996.

During 1995, Board members attended several workshops and seminars on various land use subjects. Highlights included the annual Law Lecture Series and the annual State Planning conference.

This year also marked the intrduction of our newsletter <u>Across Lots</u>. This is an effort to inform the Town of our activities especially prior to any public hearings.

Recruitment of new members remains a problem. Currently, we have four vacancies for alternate members. please contact me if you would like to serve on the Board.

Town of Sullivan Conservation Commission Annual Report 1995

This was a very busy year for the Conservation Commission. Several local issues and concerns arose, many of which required field assessments and remedial action. Again, I would like to give hearty thanks to those dedicated citizens of Sullivan who donated their valuable time to the efforts of conservation in this community: Becky Cummings (Secretary), Dr. David Hall, Jean Hoffman, Virginia Howard, Joe Ovsenik, and Roger Sweet. Special thanks goes to Joe Ovsenik, who retired from the commission after many years of grateful service, and Roger Sweet, who provided strong moral support and acted as liaison to the Planning Board.

Advised Planning Board & Selectmen: Several Planning Board and Selectmen's meetings were attended in order to advise on wetlands, curb cuts, roadside trees, salt use, the town cemetary and the Town Forest. Written contributions were made to the Master Plan revision, and hearings attended in order to answer any concerns about Sullivan's natural resources. Support was given to the large lot zoning proposal, in order to help conserve Sullivan's back land and offset service costs from increased development.

Attended Meetings: The Natural Resource Advisory Council of the Southwest Regional Planning Commission was attended on a monthly basis. Further work was completed on a regional natural resources management plan, with the assistance of the acting chair, Ann Sweet. The semi-annual meetings of the Monadnock Regional Conservation Commission were also attended and activities in Sullivan was reported on . Finally, the annual meeting of the NH Association of Conservation Commissions was attended by one member, and reported on the commission as a whole.

Offered Walks: Three walks were offered for the citizens of Sullivan. On April 23rd., several twon members hiked up the new trail system on Boynton Mtn and saw lots of moose sign; on July 31st., future (?) Sullivan resident Craig Stockwell guided over a dozen hikers across his property to the Bear Denss in Gilsum; and on October 22nd., Roger and Ann Sweet took several people up Otter Brook to Ellis Reservoir, while Chris Pratt gave an outstanding history tour of the cellar holes and dam sites. Many thanks to Ann and Roger Sweet, Craig Stockwell and Chris Pratt for assisting in the planning and coordination of these events.

Wetlands: Several permits were reviewed and advised on this year. Some entailed careful site reviews by the connission, and one required mediation with the state on a possibles violation. The latter reminded all commission members of the potential loss of time and money to developers who violate wetlands laws, not broause of regulatory paperwork but because of the engineering setbacks that result when doing work in saturated soils.

Solid (and not so solid) Waste: Three reycling days were arranged with the City of Keene for Sullivan residents to dump their hazardous wast during designated collection days. Due to some confusion about dates and adcertising, we received three days for the price of one! Several Sullivan residents took advantage of this opportunity, although more taxic materials no doubt remain in closets, barns, and sheds in Town. Lood for another Hazardous waste collection exchange in 1997. A second oil contamination problem in so many years arose this year in Sullivan. Advice, soil testing, and consulting services were arranged through the commission. Future clean-up efforts are planned for 1996.

Town of Sullivan Conservation Commission Cont. Annual Report 1995

Reviewed and Filed Reports: Monthly legislatuive reports from the NHACC office were reviewed and reported on. Proposed changes to the wetland rules were commented on in person, by phone and by letter. Efforts to minimize the regulatory burden of these procedures fueled much of the commission's concern and subsequent feedback. However, potential violations to the wetlands rules (especially in regards to forestry practices) were also reviewed and acted on. In this way the commission continued to serve as a watchdog in the community to help ensure that sound conservation practices will leave our Town's natural resources intact for future generations.

SULLIVAN FIRE & RESCUE DEPARTMENT

The Fire & Rescue Department responded to 40 calls in 1995:

The State now requires a permit for all open fires, including brush, barrel and campfires unless there is complete snow coverage. State law prohibits the buring of stained or painted building materials.

It has been a busy year at the library. In addition to the above statistics Sullivan Public Library made 169 inter-library loan requests. Of these, 143 were able to be filled. Other libraries requested materials from us 52 times. We were able to fill 50 of these requests. The majority of these requests are made through our computer link to the State Library. The State Library also delivers these materials via its own delivery system, saving us costly postage fees. Without this service we would be severely limited in our ability to offer this service to our patrons.

The library still belongs to the Nubanusit co-op, as well as the <code>CO-op's</code> video section. This allows us to provide videos that we would not be able to do otherwise. The meetings provide the librarian with valuable information in which to better serve our community.

In March a toddler story time was begun. It occurs on Thursdays and is well attended. In September a story club for elementary school aged children was started. This group meets Mondays and has a regular attendance. The summer reading program theme was westerns. Twenty-seven children participated in both of the story programs. A total of 285 books were read by these children.

The Friends of the Library sponsored a lovely Easter party for the children. They also threw a nice party for the summer readers. The Friends have worked hard this year to support the library and I am thankful for all they do for us.

This summer videos were again placed at the Hilltop Campground as a community outreach. This has been a nice opportunity for the library.

Dan Corindia did repairs, scraping and painting to the back addition this summer for his Eagle project.

A new roof was put on thebuilding this summer. We did not suffer any water damage with the winter snows this year.

In October the Trustees of the Library sponsored a program called "The Town's Attic". It was very well attended. Chris Pratt described some of the town's treasurers that are in the library attic and elsewhere in town. He also presented a proposal to build an addition onto the library. The addition would help us comply with ADA regulations and provide a better home for some of our town's historical treasures.

In September Ian and Rory Burke began volunteering regularly on Saturday mornings. They are a big help with some of the necessary chores around the library; I appreciate their help very much.

The library building is the meeting place for a number of groups in town: the Planning Board, the Conservation Committee, the Friends of the Library and the Supervisors of the Checklist.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON FINANCIAL PRESENTATION

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Sullivan Sullivan, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Sullivan as of and for the year ended December 31, 1994, as listed in the table of contents. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Town's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the general purpose financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general purpose financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1B, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Assets Account Group, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Assets Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the omission described in the preceding paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Town of Sullivan as of December 31, 1994, and the results of its operations and cash flows of its nonexpendable trust funds for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The combining and individual fund financial statements listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Sullivan. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S COMMUNICATION OF REPORTABLE CONDITIONS AND OTHER MATTERS

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Sullivan Sullivan, New Hampshire

In planning and performing our audit of the Town of Sullivan for the year ended December 31, 1994, we considered the Town's internal control structure in order to determine the scope of our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements. Our review of these systems was not intended to provide assurance on the internal control structure and should not be relied on for that purpose.

Under the standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the internal control structure that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the Town's ability to record, process, summarize, and report financial data consistent with the assertions of management in the financial statements. A material weakness is a reportable condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities, in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited, may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might constitute reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses as defined above.

The following condition was noted that we do not consider to be a material weakness:

The Town voted Article 16 of the March 14, 1989, annual Town Meeting to transfer 30% of Land Use Change Tax collections to the Conservation Commission Special Revenue Fund as authorized by New Hampshire RSA 79-A:25 II. The Town's current policy is to transfer the 30% of the amount collected during the year to the Conservation Commission Special Revenue Fund after year end. Although the amount was not material, it was not transferred due to oversight. We again recommend that the Town transfer the funds immediately after the receipt of the Land Use Change Tax collections so that this situation will be alleviated in future years.

We are pleased to report that, during the course of our review of internal controls, no material weaknesses in the Town's accounting systems and records were identified. Minor weaknesses or other considerations coming to our attention were generally procedural in nature and dealt with administrative or recordkeeping practices. In these instances, we made specific recommendations or


provided instruction to those individuals involved during the course of our audit fieldwork. Areas discussed included:

- A. Notices of redemptions as described in RSA 80:70 are not always being sent to the Register of Deeds within 30 days after full redemption is made as required.
- B. During 1994, the Town received money from the sale of timber which was cleared from the cemetery expansion lot. The Town transferred this money to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be deposited into the Cemetery Expansion Trust Fund. This amount has been recorded as deferred revenue in the Trust Fund. We recommend the Town obtain legal advice on the allowability of this transfer which was not voted at Town Meeting.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of management and others within the administration. This restriction is not intended to limit distribution of this report, which is a matter of public record.
