

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town High-

ways.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for purchase of a snow plow.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate any money for Memorial Day.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and negotiate the extension or renewal of the notes securing such loans, when it is necessary.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$243.00, the State to contribute \$1143.77 for Town Road Aid.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$350.00 for the Wilmot Volunteer Firemen, to apply on payment of pumper and hose.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate \$100.00 for Town dumps.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

- 11. (Requested.) To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1943 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
- 13. To bring in your ballots for delegates and alternates to the National Conventions.
