TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Acworth in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Acworth on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a road agent.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$100.00 toward the upkeep of the grounds in front of Town Hall and the Acworth Congregational Church as far as the Charlestown Road. during the summer months.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to close the Dodge Brook road, subject to gates and bars.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to close the road from the Richardson place to the Kasson place.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to close the road from Holden's to McCue's.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of the title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to defray the Town's share of the cost thereof.
- 11. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.
- 12. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensations for which is on a fee basis.

- 13. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreements with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

### ROAD REPORT

In accordance with the recommendation of the committee appointed at last Town Meeting, the March Clark bridge in East Acworth has been eliminated by virtue of a spur road connecting the two roads leading to Lempster. This construction was completed at a cost of \$2,353.11, well within the estimated \$2,500.00 and considerably below the estimated figure of \$6,000.00 as the town's share of a new bridge.

TRA funds this past year went into construction on the unimproved part of the road from Acworth town to Crescent Lake. In order to facilitate snow removal and save on charges for moving hired machinery it was decided to prepare the entire road bed (widening and culvert installation) in 1955 and to apply gravel in 1956. Unless a nearby source of good gravel is located, TRA money available in 1956 will probably fall short of completing the job this coming year.

Construction on the South Acworth bridge was undertaken to raise its safe load limit. Four sixteen inch I-beams salvaged from the East Acworth bridge were used to replace the old wooden stringers. The cost was approximately \$1,400.00. Some minor work including painting of the truss work remains to be done.

Fifteen weeks of 1955 were spent on these construction jobs by Mr. Hemphill and his help, and to that extent road maintenance had to suffer. Ideally, maintenance would be a full time job and construction would be left to others. Practically, the financial resources of Acworth do not allow this and the road agent must divide his time between the two.

In this connection, the Selectmen wish to emphasize that complaints regarding road conditions are properly their burden and not that of the road agent. It is requested that in the future such complaints be directed to the Board.

The Selectmen take this opportunity to publicly express their appreciation for his conscientious workmanship and cooperation, to Mr. Hemphill.

### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Acworth qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 13th day of March, 1956, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and citizens of Acworth, I hereby submit my fourth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Mrs. Bess Sandercock was employed to teach grades three, four, five and six when Mrs. Ruth Weeks resigned to accept a position in Charlestown. Mrs. Sandercock is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and during the summer of 1955 took special training in teaching the elementary grades.

Mrs. Virginia Blake returned as acting principal and teacher of grades one, two, and three. She is continuing her training by taking courses at Keene Teachers College.

The enrollment has shown a considerable increase during the summer and fall. At present there are nineteen in the primary room and seventeen in the intermediate room. It is anticipated that this number will increase for 1956-1957. Only two six grade pupils are expected to go to Alstead and approximately seven first graders are due to enroll.

Miss Florence MacIver continues as school nurse and through her inspections and home visits the absentees from school are held to a minimum and spread of communicable disease is probably reduced.

The hot lunch program has functioned smoothly and Mrs. Murdough has done an excellent job as cook.

Your superintendent and school board are most appreciative of your co-operation and support. I feel that this has been a good year for the pupils and I hope we may continue to offer them good education.

#### SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

This past year has been a most eventful one in the field of preventive medicine. Through the efforts of Dr. Jonas Salk and his co-workers a vaccine to be used in the prevention of Poliomyelitis was licensed and made available to all children in the first and second grades in schools throughout the country. This was a tremendous step toward stamping out poliomyelitis.

Co-operating under a nationwide program the State Department of Health conducted large clinics for the administration of the vaccine. In order for a child to receive the innoculations of the vaccine it was necessary for the parents of the child to sign a permission slip. Despite some of the unfavorable reports about the vaccine the response of the parents toward the program was very good. The enthusiasm of the children toward these innoculations was amazing. No unfavorable reactions were reported in our area.

Further clinics for the administration of Salk Vaccine are being planned. Children through the age of fourteen years are to be included in the next clinics.

It seems wonderful to think that at last there is available an immunizing agent capable of preventing paralytic polio and its many tragedies. This is certainly a very important step in guarding the health of our children, now and in the future.

Interest on the part of the parents is so very essential to the success of these programs. As always the parents have cooperated. It is a very great pleasure to work with you and with your children. Combined interest of everyone is what brings about improved health programs for the children.
