**TOWN OF BARRINGTON**  
**TOWN WARRANT**

March 13, 1962

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barrington, County of  
Strafford and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote  
in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grade School  
in said Town on Tuesday, the thirteenth (13th) day of  
March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act  
upon the following subjects: with Polls not closing before  
six of the clock in the afternoon.

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ARTICLES OF BUSINESS AT 7:30 P. M.

- Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, one Select-  
man for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer,  
Collector of Taxes, and two auditors, for one  
year.
- Art. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,450.00 for  
the support of the Town Poor, Old Age Assist-  
ance, and other Town charges.
- Art. 4. To raise and appropriate the County Tax.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen  
to borrow up to the sum of \$10,000.00 in antici-  
pation of taxes, if necessary.

- Art. 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for roads and bridges.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the maintenance of Black Roads.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,051.49 for the Town Rural Aid, the State's share to be \$7,009.96.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$200.00 for the Library Association.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$100.00 for the V.F.W. Memorial Day.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$145.22 which is  $\frac{1}{100}$  of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in co-operation with other towns in Lake Region.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for filing cabinet for Town Clerk's records.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for replacement of parts, and repairs for Town snow plow.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote a sum of \$200.00 as a Zoning Board Fund to be used by the Zoning Board for expenses incurred in carrying out the duties, as set forth in the Ordinance: such as Inspection, time and travel; Stationery, Postage, and other incidental expenses.

Item 2.

Receipts from Applications, and Permits, shall apply to the Zoning Board Fund; payable to the Town Treasurer, and carried as a separate account.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Addendum to Article 4, Section 5:

It is necessary to file a written Application with Zoning Board to comply with this Section.

Addendum to Article 5, Establishing Section 5:

(1) The Zoning Board shall charge a fee of \$5.00 for each Permit issued, payable upon presentation of said Permit. Permit must be obtained from the Zoning Board within 30 days of Board action on Application.

(2) A fee of \$2.00 will be required for Authorization Form for any construction amounting to \$500.00 or less.

(3) Failure to comply with this Article will necessitate filing another Application with the Zoning Board.

(4) This Amendment shall take effect immediately upon passage.



Art. 17. To see if the Town will raise the Town Officer's salaries.

Art. 18. To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Budget as voted at the Town Meeting.

## REPORT OF ZONING BOARD

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To the Town Meeting, March, 1962:

The Zoning Ordinance has been in effect for a period of ten years, having been voted upon as of March 11, 1952. The Zoning Board was organized April 25, 1952, with the following members duly appointed by the selectmen, present: Leon Calef, Douglas Stevenson, and Leonard Purvis. This Board remained intact until the Spring of 1959, when Leon Calef and Douglas Stevenson resigned. During this period 124 permits were issued.

In May of 1959, the Selectmen appointed Bernard R. Smith and Frederick E. Densmore as new members of the Zoning Board, and they, with E. Leonard Purvis, comprise your present Board.

Since May of 1959 we have issued 89 Permits, 8 regular Authorizations (for work \$500.00 or less), and 38 Delayed Authorizations (for work done previously, without making application for permit, but complying with the Zoning Ordinance Notice, sent out with the Tax Bill for 1961). There are quite a few, yet, who have not complied, but are in process of complying with the terms of the ordinance, as of January 1, 1962.

Therefore, with the adoption of a Teachers' Salary Schedule by the School Board, subject to the approval of the citizens at the next school district meeting, it will now be possible to have a planned program of salary increases, reducing the teacher turnover to a minimum and insuring a better education for the youth of the community.

Educational TV continues to supplement the educational program of the Barrington School with courses in primary music, science and social studies. It is hoped that a program of beginning French can be included for next year.

The addition of Mr. Winslow as music supervisor for both vocal and instrumental would seem to be a step in the right direction and the support of the district is solicited.

The 1962-63 Budget includes moneys for additions and improvements to your school which have been duly considered by your School Board. As they are presented at the district meeting your support will determine the type of plant and educational program that this community wants.

In conclusion, I would like to express my appreciation for the cooperation given me during the year as your superintendent of schools by the citizens, school board, teachers and pupils of Barrington.

## REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

---

To the People of Barrington :

It has long been recognized that many of the most serious problems which teachers face stem from the relations of the school with homes and community. The ways in which they have reacted within recent decades to these problems have undergone a series of changes which constitute a clearly discernible trend. As long as the schools were conducted as essentially academic institutions and were almost wholly isolated from the community, the relations were confined mainly to school laws and school board regulations, supervision of the classroom, attendance, discipline, and business duties.

The teachers in your community are attempting to give the children the well rounded education they will need to meet the challenge of the world as it is today.

One of the things we have done this year is to purchase a filmstrip library to supplement their regular lessons. Many times it is easier for people to retain knowledge if they can visualize it rather than just being told .

Beginning in February we will be graced by the presence of two young women from the University of New Hampshire who will handle physical education for the girls in all eight grades. There is a great need for physical exercise in this day of easy living and automation which seems to have modern children in its grasp.

The new music program speaks for itself every Tuesday, when the children go eagerly to the auditorium for their weekly music lesson. The enthusiasm of the children seems to be the best evidence of the success of this program.

These are some of the things we are trying to do for the children of the Barrington School, and we welcome any suggestions and visitations from the parents. We are here to serve you and your children to the best of our ability.

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## SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

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To Mr. Martineau, Superintendent of Schools, the School Board, and the Citizens of Barrington:

It gives me pleasure to present the following report of the health program at the Barrington School during the past year.

We have been fortunate in having had no serious illnesses in the school. It is very gratifying to again say that the parents have been most cooperative in having treatment for cases of defective vision, dental care done, and cases of enlarged tonsils checked by their family physicians.

As occasionally a misunderstanding may exist, especially with parents who have moved from other parts of the country, I should like to point out that according to the regulations of the State Board of Education a school nurse is only permitted to give first aid care. We are not allowed to give internal medication to any pupil unless it is by order of the family physician.

In May there was a successful Pre-School clinic, with twenty-three children attending. Thanks to a well-child clinic, conducted by the Public Health Department, and

sponsored by the Barrington Woman's Club, nearly all the children entering in September who had not been vaccinated were done, and were able to complete their polio shots when necessary.

The following is a brief summary of the Health Program:

Vision Tests: 211

Hearing Tests: 152

Heights and Weights: 203

Teeth and Tonsils: 203

Home-visits: 19 (this does not include taking home a youngster with a minor upset)

Of nine cases of really defective vision, all were treated by a doctor. One child received glasses thru the Sight Conservation program. In 11 cases of serious cavities in teeth nearly all have had or are having dental care.

May I extend my thanks to Mr. Martineau, the School Board, all the teachers, and the parents for their cooperation.
