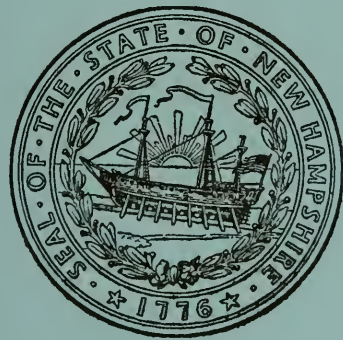

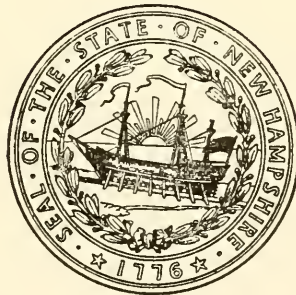

# TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the town hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$50,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of the town and on the credit of same, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected within current municipal year.
4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the same time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds or by any other means.
6. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that portion of Route 302 between station A-64 and station A-72, and the portion of the old Dundee road between the present Dundee road and the so-called government or Dundee Highland road, and that portion of this same road near the East Branch River meaning that section that runs by Dan Drew's camp and back to the Highlands Road, and that section of the old road that crosses the land of Dr. G. H. Shedd.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as its share of the proposed Fryeburg, Maine, airport; this sum to be paid over to the airport authority only when it is apparent to your Selectmen that the project will be carried through.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00 to be used for repairing flood damage of October 24, 1959 to town highways.
9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## CIVIL DEFENSE

In the Civil Defense Organization in Bartlett we have approximately fifty members plus the volunteer fire departments. At the beginning of the year we had an organizational meeting at which the people were assigned to the various units in the organization. Pamphlets were distributed through the Post Offices entitled "Facts About Fallout Protection" and they should have been received by every family. Cards were also distributed explaining the Alert and Take Cover Warning signals used not only in Bartlett but in the rest of the country as well. Some Medical Supplies and Surplus Army Cots were purchased and stored in the Bartlett School Building and in the Town Office. We purchased some Gas Masks and put these on the fire engine in Bartlett and in Glen. We had a man from Concord conduct a school in Bartlett on the use of Radiation Detection equipment at which eighteen people who attended four nights received certificates.

I have applied through the Surplus Property Unit in Concord for a tank truck and an auxiliary generator for the School. If tests are satisfactory we would like to purchase a radio to be installed in the school (cost to the town \$150) so that regardless of an emergency failure of the telephones we would have communication through Conway with State Headquarters.

## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

1959 saw many changes in our library. Its location was changed to the school making it available to the school as well as the public.

Our new quarters have been completely painted, new shelves built, and a blower for heat installed.

All this was possible through a special appropriation from the town and through several money-raising projects. A tag day, food sale, supper and coffee breaks were held. Donations were received from the Emblem Club, V.F.W. Auxiliary, and Melrose Hickory Hawks. Many hours of work were donated by volunteers to help paint the new room. A desk, curtains, books and magazines were donated. The Glen Grange gave us a subscription to the N. H. Profiles. A subscription to the National Geographic was also given. We were able to purchase a much-needed set of Encyclopædia Americana which we are paying for over a 3-year period.

Because of our town's interest in improving our library standards we received a state-aid grant of \$150.00 used to purchase approximately 45 books of Junior High and Senior High non-fiction.

365 books have been added this year, mostly through donation.

There were 3,024 books taken out in 1959. An increase of 728 over the previous year despite the fact we were closed for four weeks to move.

We are now open an additional hour each week — Monday evenings 7:30 to 8:30. This evening hour has been very popular with the high school students and people who work during the day.

Physical improvements needed for 1960 are, a sign by the road, an outside step, a juvenile display table and a catalogue card filing cabinet. Our special project for the year will be to catalogue the books.

According to the "New Hampshire Library statistics for 1958" the average per capita expenditure for libraries in towns of 2000 and under is \$1.62. We are paying \$ .37 per capita. This places us 144th of the 173 libraries in towns of 2000 or less population. This is far below what is recommended to maintain an efficient library. The 1959 statistics will show quite an improvement.

It is hoped that there will be an increase in the budget each year until we can maintain a library that will truly meet all our needs.

# REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

-----

## PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note:

58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners.

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent-minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple—

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars, and cigarettes from moving vehicles — use your ash tray.
5. Don't burn at home — Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

# Report of Superintendent

## To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:

The Bartlett Elementary School continues to offer a sound and basic program that meets the needs of most children. Standard tests in achievement, which are given every year in all grades, indicate normal progress in all academic areas. The strong emphasis in our school has been, and will continue to be, the teaching of the skill subjects.

I wish to commend the youth of Bartlett for their fine attendance record and particularly low drop-out rate at Kennett High School. This would indicate that there is a real understanding of the need for a high school education. It would also show that the parents have been doing some good work in "guidance." Guidance is a new and important service that has been added at Kennett High School.

At a time when many school districts are having difficulty securing qualified teachers, Bartlett can be happy in knowing that they have a staff of capable, qualified teachers.

During this first semester several of our teachers were enrolled in an in-service course in History and Government of New Hampshire. Some will continue with a second course in Creative Writing. This involves a great deal of a teacher's spare time and these in-service courses are paid for by the teachers and not the school district.

Mr. Philip Darby was employed as Supervisor of Music and devotes a full day in Bartlett. This year, for the first time, pupils are afforded the opportunity of taking instrumental music lessons without cost to the parents.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board, the teachers, and School District employees for their sincere efforts in making this a most rewarding educational experience for the youth and children of our community.

# Report of School Nurse

1958 — 1959

I will try to summarize in the following paragraphs some of the important activities of the School Health Services.

Communicable disease control is exercised as far as possible by the exclusion of children showing signs and symptoms of illness. In the event that no school exposure has occurred, it is desirable for children exposed to the first case of measles or whooping cough in the community to be excluded without waiting for development of signs and symptoms of the illness.

Thirty-four physical examinations for grade one, four and seven were done at the Memorial Hospital in the Fall. This includes weighing, measuring and temperature, with examinations by doctors. The teeth are checked by a dentist. Blood and urine tests are made and whatever extra the doctors think necessary, such as x-ray or white blood count. The reports of these examinations are sent home to the parents by mail. If an unusual defect is found the nurse makes a home visit and discusses the defect with the parents.

The Well Child Conference held in Bartlett during the winter was well attended. Seven school children received Triple Toxoid, six received Polio Vaccine shots and one child received Smallpox Vaccine.

In May, 1959, thirty-four pupils had the Patch Test for Tuberculosis. Two of these were followed up by chest x-rays. The cooks and bus drivers also received chest x-rays.

The Pre-school Incoming First Grade Conference was held in May, 1959. The children had their eyes tested and their teeth were checked by the State Dental Hygienist.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to everyone who has helped to make this program possible.
