#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of Carroll,

qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Conway Elementary School Auditorium at Conway, New Hampshire, March 10, 1964, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers.

- Art. 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:
- Section a. Town officers' salaries
  - b. Town officers' expenses
  - c. Election and registration expenses
  - d. Municipal Court expenses
  - e. Expenses of Town Hall and other Town buildings.
  - f. Police Department
  - g. Fire Department
  - h. Insurance
  - i. Civil Defense
  - j. Office expense
  - k. Health Department, including hospitals
  - l. Vital statistics
  - m. Town dump
  - n. Town maintenance of highway, summer and winter
  - o. Town Road Aid (TRA)
  - p. Libraries
  - g. Town Poor
  - r. Old Age Assistance
  - s. Memorial Day
  - t. Soldiers' Aid
  - u. Parks and Playgrounds
  - v. Damages and legal expense, and land damage
  - w. F.I.C.A. (Social Security) town's share
  - x. Interest on temporary loans and bonds
  - y. Class IV Urban (to apply against principal of bond issue)
  - z. Payment on bond issue
  - a-1 Perambulation of town lines
  - b-1 Blister rust and care of trees
  - c-1 New equipment
  - d-1 Capital Reserve for survey of streets and tax map
  - e-1 County tax
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the town such sums of money as may be needed, such sums not to exceed the combined School, Town and County tax budget, in anticipation of taxes raised for Town, County and School purposes.

- Art. 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to set aside the sum of \$5,000 toward the Capital Reserve Fund for Survey of all the roads, streets, ways and highways belonging to the Town and tax map, which fund was established in 1963, from any cash surplus that may exist at the end of each year until such Capital Reserve Fund has reached the amount of \$40,000, said authorization to start in the current year. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 in 1964 toward the reappraisal of all real estate in the Town, said appraisal to be made at the earliest convenience of the Tax Commission, in 1965, said \$10,000 to be appropriately one-half of the amount needed. No recommendation by Budget Committee.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to sponsor a group life, accident, medical, surgical and hospitalization insurance benefit or any combination of such benefits for regular employees of the town and their dependents under which plan said employees agree to pay the premiums. In such case the town treasurer is authorized to withhold from the compensation of such employees who agree to such plan the amount of the premiums and pay over the same to the company furnishing such benefits. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to construct new approaches to a grade crossing instead of the present overhead railroad bridge in Redstone, subject to Public Utilities Commission order dated December 18, 1963. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$360 to support group life insurance benefits to town employees. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will adopt the provisions of Chapter 36:1 Laws of 1963 which allows Tax Collectors to accept advance payments on property taxes. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town of Conway will install street lights on Route No. 302 & 16 beginning at North Conway Cemetery and going South to Howard Johnson's Restaurant in North Conway and raising and appropriating a sufficient sum of money for the same. Agreeable to a petition signed by Charles E. Birch and others. Not recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500 for the purpose of purchasing an addressograph machine to be used in the Town Office. Recommended by Budget Committee.

- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair the Conway section of the so-called Ridge Road, or Little Chatham Road, between Chatham and Fryeburg, these last-named Towns having already repaired their respective sections of said road, now considered important for fire protection and emergency use. Agreeable to a petition signed by Fred P. Fernald and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the purpose of uniting with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the cooperative development and promotion of the North Country's economy. Agreeable to a petition signed by Richard G. White and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to exempt from taxation for the year 1964 the air navigation facility known as White Mt. Airport owned by Wylie L. Apte provided such facility is available for public use without charge and the owner holds a certificate from the New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission that it is necessary for an effective airways system. The property to be exempt shall include the surfaces maintained and available for take-off, landing, taxiing, open air parking of an aircraft and any navigation or communications facility and any passenger terminal building available for public use without charge pursuant to RSA 72:38 as inserted by 1963, 79:2. Agreeable to a petition signed by Malcolm S. Clark and others. No recommendation by Budget Committee.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to have its Selectmen enter into a lease with Wylie Apte along with other surrounding towns in leasing of the White Mountain Airport Strip and Taxi Ways, and to see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$600 to reseal the hard surface runway with special Airport Runway Sealer. Agreeable to a petition signed by Roland Morse and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 16. To see if the voters of the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars to be used for the operation and maintenance of the information booths located in the Villages of Conway and North Conway, which sum is to be paid over to the Chamber of Commerce of Conway and Chamber of Commerce of North Conway. Agreeable to a petition signed by Robert D. Lucy and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 (five hundred dollars) to help defray the expenses of the Water Safety Program as carried on by the Conway Chapter of the American Red Cross. Agreeable to a petition signed by J. Shumway Marshall and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars to provide a portion of the cost of the

installation of a sidewalk in the North Conway Park. Agreeable to a petition signed by Carroll Reed and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

- Art. 19. To see what sum the Town will vote to appropriate for the support of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport for the current year.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Historical District, pursuant to Chapter 31, Section, 89a, New Hampshire Revised Statutes of 1955, in the Village of North Conway, to be bounded and described as:

Beginning at a point on the Westerly side of Main Street due West of the intersection of the Northerly line of Grove Street and Easterly line of Main Street, thence due West 250 feet to a point to be marked, thence Northerly to a point on the South line of a street, thence Westerly along said South line of the street to land now or formerly of Boston and Maine Railroad, thence Westerly to an iron pin at the Northwesterly corner of land now or formerly of Gibson, thence Westerly along land of Gibson to an iron pin, thence N3° 42′ 30″ W six hundred fifty-four and 45 hundredths (654.45) feet to an iron pin in a Southeasterly direction to an iron pipe on the North side of land of the Town of Conway, thence Eastern on said North line until it intersects the Westerly line of Main Street thence Southerly on said West line to the point and place of beginning.

To see if the Town will vote to create a Historic District Commission of six members, the membership of which shall be a member of the Park Commissioners of the North Conway Park, a member of the Board of Selectmen, a member of the Town Planning Board, and three members appointed by the Selectmen at large. Agreeable to a petition signed by Carroll Reed and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

- Art. 21. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- Art. 22. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town."
- Art. 23. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Trustees have met regularly with the best interests of the library in mind. Upon the resignation of Mrs. Earle Burnell, Mrs. Bradford Boynton was appointed to the board, representing the Center Conway area. While no major repairs were done this year, some storm windows were added which should help in keeping out the cold from the north side. A vacuum cleaner was purchased, also a magazine rack. ## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- 3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year-round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- 4. Children-caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Conway for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

## SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Library and Trustees of Trust Funds.

## FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Comparative Balance Sheets—December 31, 1962-December 31, 1963: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1962 and December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Surplus of \$43,064.70 to a Net Debt of \$81,903.81, in 1963.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$43,542.33, plus a revenue surplus of \$15,414.99, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$58,957.32.

## Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1963, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

## Statement of Bonded Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of outstanding bonded indebtedness as of December 31, 1963, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

## AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated

by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

## GENERAL COMMENTS

## **Current Surplus:**

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$10,031.49, from \$87,064.70 to \$97,096.19, in 1963, as shown herewith:

The Selectmen and Tax Collector should carefully go over the uncollected tax lists and such taxes thereon as appear to be uncollectible should be abated by the Board of Selectmen.

The two-year period provided by law for redemptions from tax sales has expired on the taxes which remain unredeemed from the tax sales for the levies of 1960 and prior years as indicated above. The Tax Collector should therefore deed to the Town the properties represented by these tax liens.

## Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations

(letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Conway for their assistance during the course of the audit.



### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

### 1) REORGANIZATION OF SUPERVISORY UNION

The Interim Commission on Education recommended several important changes to the New Hampshire Legislature that could improve New Hampshire's educational system. Among these were: (1) reorganization of school districts into larger administrative units; (2) the establishment of AREA high school districts; (3) reorganization of our state institutions of higher learning, Keene, Plymouth and the University of N. H. under the administration of one enlarged board of trustees; (4) a broad base tax program that would relieve, somewhat, the disproportionate tax load borne by the local districts.

The Interim Commission devoted most of its time and study to the reorganization of school districts, since no major change in the structure of supervisory unions had occurred since 1919. They recommended that the state's 48 school supervisory unions be reduced in number to 34. That each union should be a natural social and economic region with an adequate taxable valuation and an enrollment large enough to permit the efficient use of school facilities and to provide essential educational services that are either limited or non-existent in the smaller school unions.

The New Hampshire State Board of Education created a Master Plan for the state as a whole and on December 4, 1963, it ruled that School Supervisory Union 9 would be reorganized to include the school districts of Freedom, Madison, and Tamworth. The new Supervisory Union 9 now includes the following school districts: Albany, Bartlett, Chatham, Conway, Eaton, Freedom, Jackson, Madison and Tamworth. The Board assigned an assistant superintendent of schools to our new school union, allocating the sum of \$2500 from state funds for this particular position.

The assistant superintendent of schools will have specific training and experience in the supervision of the elementary school programs. He or she will give advice, counsel and assistance to teachers, pupils, and parents as a means of improving the educational growth and development of children, solving pupil problems of retardation and maladjustment, adapting the program of studies to meet the needs of the children, bringing resources outside the school to classroom teachers, pupils and parents. In general, to evaluate the instructional programs in terms of established objectives and approved standards. To improve communications between teachers and between schools relative to what is to be taught and how learning is best brought about.

### 2) CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION OFFICE MOVES

### TO NORTH CONWAY

In the early fall the staff of Supervisory Union 9 will move to its new quarters in the "Mason" house in North Conway. This building is owned by our school district and will provide excellent space for the staff of the enlarged supervisory union.

### 3) KENNETT HIGH SCHOOL ADDITION

Although the construction of the new addition to Kennett High School proceeded at a slow pace during the summer and fall months, the construction process has been accelerated and we have been assured that the building will be completed and ready for occupancy in ample time for the opening of school in September.

The new school will contain substantially the same facilities that were originally proposed. Special rooms for music and art were added later as a recommendation of the State Department of Education. These two courses (Art and Music) are required in order to meet the minimum high school standards as a comprehensive high school.

A special brochure will be prepared at a later date giving you more detailed information about this new addition.

### 4) OLD SCHOOL TO BE RETIRED

A school house that has served the School District of Conway since the turn of the century as an elementary school as well as the first years of a high school will no longer be used for school purposes. The present junior high school (grades 7 and 8) that is currently occupying this building and one classroom in the Precinct Building will be moved to the East Wing of Kennett High School. Having the seventh and eighth grades in the high school will provide greater flexibility in course programming and a more effective utilization of plant facilities and professional staff services.

### 5) SALARY SCHEDULE REVISED

The School Board has revised the teacher salary schedule increasing the minimum starting salary by one hundred dollars, from \$4400 to \$4500. This is in keeping with the general increases for such positions throughout the state. However, real consideration should be given next year to rewarding our many excellent experienced teachers for their years of dedicated service to our schools, since their salaries have not kept pace with those of experienced teachers in schools of comparable size in our state.

### 6) CURRICULUM REVISION

Modern mathematics is the reasoning approach to mathematics and offers a systematic analysis of arithmetic. No longer can memorization, rote learning, and practiced techniques replace logic and reasoning in mathematics. New mathematic courses have been introduced in grades one, two, and three and will be extended to include grades four, five and six in 1964. This will complete the revision of the mathematics curriculum since the programs in grades seven through twelve were introduced several years ago.

The following teachers have taken part in an in-service extension course in Fundamental Concepts of Modern Mathematics: Beulah Parent, Olive Ball, Elizabeth Newton, Gail Peters, Vera Chase, Ann Croto, Viola Young, Charles McCrady, Myrtle Gosselin, Arlene Fisher, Karol Crawford, Dorothy Blodgett, Anna Garland Joan Mathurin, Joseph May, Winifred Reynolds, Celia Kennett, and Betty Walker.

We are trying to expand and enrich our mathematics curriculum at all grade levels. Some phases of algebra and geometry, formerly reserved for the ninth and tenth grades are now being taught in the elementary grades. At Kennett High School, some of the abler students are able to complete college courses in mathematics during their senior year.

The changes which have taken place in the world of science in the last decade are both impressive and dramatic so that it may well be considered a "revolution in science." New scientific knowledge is being developed at an explosive rate and the pace is not expected to slacken. It just isn't possible to know or teach more than a fragment of any field of learning and the science curriculum will have to be revised so that (1) all facts and inert knowledge is weeded out; (2) elimination of some topics altogether; (3) teach some material at earlier level; (4) emphasize the ordering or structuring of knowledge within a subject field; (5) make learning in all science courses more durable. The course content in Biology and Chemistry is in the process of being revised and our basic aim is to develop in each student a spirit of inquiry and a mode of thinking that will lead toward intellectual competence and educational self-direction.

### GREAT FRIEND - GREAT LOSS!

Mrs. Mildred Fulton, after serving eighteen years as secretary to the Superintendent of Schools, will retire on June 30th. No school employee has been more faithful, more dedicated, or worked longer and harder for the best interest of the school system than has Mildred Fulton. She has been more than a secretary-bookkeeper. She has really been an administrative assistant with a profound knowledge of school affairs and school policy, never too busy to help parents, teachers, pupils and board members in finding answers to questions, or solutions to problems concerning our schools. Perhaps her value to our school system can best be understood when we know that two people will be employed to replace her. In her retirement years we wish her an abundance of good health and well being. It has been said that no one is indispensable or irreplaceable, but if any person came close to it, Mildred Fulton would have to be that person.

I wish to thank the entire staff at Kennett High School for their excellent work despite the difficulties of overcrowded condition. Special thanks to Glenn Hale and the Precinct Commissioners for allowing the School District the use of the Precinct Building during these past six years. I want to express my appreciation to the school

board and all school district employees for their continued effort to make this a better school year than the last. For we know that where the schools are headed is far more important than where they have been.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

### 1962-1963

The annual health services offered the children of the Conway Schools consist of vision and hearing testing, physical and dental examinations for grades 4, 7, and 10 at Memorial Hospital; and those participating in sports are examined at the school. School physical inspections include teeth, height, weight, posture, nutrition, health habits, hair, skin, and first aid.

Our school program is greatly assisted by the State Department of Health clinics. The orthopedic clinic is held twice a year at the Memorial Hosptal. Other clinics, participating are the Hanover clinics, Child Guidance, Heart Association, Convulsive, and the New Hampshire State Sight program. The dental program for the incoming first grade. Patch testing for tuberculosis for grades 1, 4, 7, 10 and 12, followed up by chest x-ray for those who need it. This is done by the Tuberculosis Association.
