Town Warrant

(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Cornish qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House on the twelfth day of March 1929, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To elect one selectman and one trustee of the trust funds and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Memorial Day.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of cemeteries.
- 6. To see what action the town will take in making up any deficiency in the William Mercer Fund.
- 7. To see if the town will raise the necessary amount for maintenance of state roads.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to apply for state aid on highways.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate the sum of fifty dollars for electricity for street lights on Cornish Flat.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate three hundred dollars for E. L. Huse, M. D., the ensuing year to insure the services of a doctor for the people of Cornish.

- 11. To see if the town will raise or appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars to repair the road from Dingleton bridge through Mill Village to about twenty rods west of the iron bridge near Verne Ayer's house.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to gravel that part of the road on the west side of the church at Cornish Flat, from the village to the top of the hill south of the Kibby house, or as far as the amount raised or appropriated will give a substantial covering of gravel to the road.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars for the permanent repair of the Meriden-Windsor stage road from the Chase cemetery past the corners near Austin Brothers to the Plainfield town line.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of one hundred dollars, the income of which is to be used annually in the care of the George F. Beckwith lot in the Child cemetery.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars the income of which is to be used in the care of the Balloch and Holt lot in the Trinity cemetery, to be known as the Holt fund.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of one hundred dollars to be known as the D. N. Morgan fund, the interest to be used in the care of the D. N. Morgan lot in the Comings cemetery.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of two hundred dollars to be known as the Emma C. Smith fund, the interest to be used for the care of the Edwin Smith and Henry Kendrick lots in the Comings cemetery.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for the control of white pine blister rust.
 - 19. To hear the reports of officers, agents, auditors

and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Cornish:

My tenth annual school report is hereby offered for your consideration.

The fall term of schools was opened on Tuesday, the fourth day of September. Owing to the small prospective membership at the Brick school and at No. 14 the State Board declined to continue state aid for the maintenance of The local school board therefore voted those schools. to discontinue the schools. They arranged for the transfer of the pupils of No. 14 to the Cornish Flat school, and for the transfer of the Brick School children to the school at Permission was also granted to the school South Cornish. board of Plainfield to transfer ten children from the Plain to the Tracy School. Five schools are in charge of new teachers; two of them by transfer within the district. Six teachers have teaching experience of more than three years and two are inexperienced normal graduates.

There were found by the September census one hundred and sixty-eight children (5-16) living in town. On September 30 one hundred and forty-eight of these were registered in local schools, seven in secondary schools outside, and two attending elementary school outside. Of the eleven children not attending school, nine are below the compulsory age, one (8-14) is excused because of inability to benefit by instruction, and one (14-16) has completed the course of study for elementary schools.

HEALIH

This year the services of Miss Alta MacDonald, R. N., were secured as school nurse. She has had much experience both in hospital nursing and in school health work. She devoted three weeks during the months of October and November to work in Cornish schools. She reports twenty-three visits to the schools, and an examination of one hundred and sixty-eight children. She made thirty-five home visits. She accompanied eighteen children to the dentist and six children to the oculist. Her most important service however was to gain the cooperation of the teachers in the health activities and to make clear to them the necessity of encouraging the children in the practice of those hygienic laws which tend toward the maintenance of perfect health.

GENERAL STATISTICS

For the Year Ending June 30, 1928.

The total membership was 162; the average membership, 138; the per cent of attendance, 94.49. Thirteen pupils were neither absent nor tardy during the year:—Philip Wardner, Ella Cheever, Lawrence Dole, Waneta Manley, James Marden, Roland Keniston, Norris Weld, Mary Deming, Myra Hood, Rodney Palmer, Myrtie Rollins, Mary Kieley, Ray Kieley. Eight Cornish children were registered in Kimball Union Academy, seven in Windsor High, and four in Stevens High. Five Cornish children attended elementary school in Windsor at private expense and one attended Spencer school in Plainfield at the district's expense. The schools were maintained for thirty-six weeks. They were actually in session 348 half-days.

The registers record nine school visits by members of the Board, 190 visits by the superintendent, and 270 visits

by citizens.

NEW SCHOOL BUILDING

During the spring it became evident that the school house at Dingleton had become unsafe for school occupancy. At the annual district meeting in March the sum of \$1700 was raised and appropriated to build and equip a new school house. As the new building was located on the site of the old one, the contract involved the additional expense of tearing down the old brick building. Most careful specifications were worked out for a building that would meet the educational needs of the school but without any elaboration of design. The Board advertised for bids. were received, and the contract was awarded to Geo. D. Graham, the lowest bidder. The building was erected The items of cost will be found in during the summer. the Board's report.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

Your library has indeed been a busy place all the year whenever open for visitors. Each year brings us many new patrons while we miss those who are no longer near enough to visit us. It has been a very real pleasure this year to send out assortments of books to several parties unable to come and choose them. We wish more would ask this of us.

This year most of the Branch exchanging has been done through the mails, costing less money but depriving us of the personal contact with the schools. The lowered postal rates for library books is 3 cents for the first pound and one cent per pound thereafter. A person at a distance might well ask for a dozen or so books at a time and the mailing expense would not be large.

We have had the floors nicely done over and that gives

our rooms a "well groomed" appearance, we think.

Generous gifts of books have been received from several of our friends including Mr. and Mrs. Barrett, Mrs. Thornburgh, W. E. Beaman, Burton Blanchard, Mrs. C. H. Weld and others; also several valuable volumes from the library of our former townsman, Mr. Geo. L. Deming. These include bound volumes of every annual Town Report of Cornish from 1850 to 1911. We are now anxious to complete the file but lack some of the copies. Who will help us? Of all these several gifts we are truly appreciative.

We would like to ask every one of our townspeople to come in, when convenient, and sit by the fireplace in the children's room a while and watch the "Little People" as they plainly demonstrate that they consider this *their* library.

We have regular visitors of two and three years taking books which they choose themselves. We have tried to keep our shelves well supplied for these as well as those of older years. Never a year have we had so many calls for reference books and classics for school use by the pupils, as this year.
