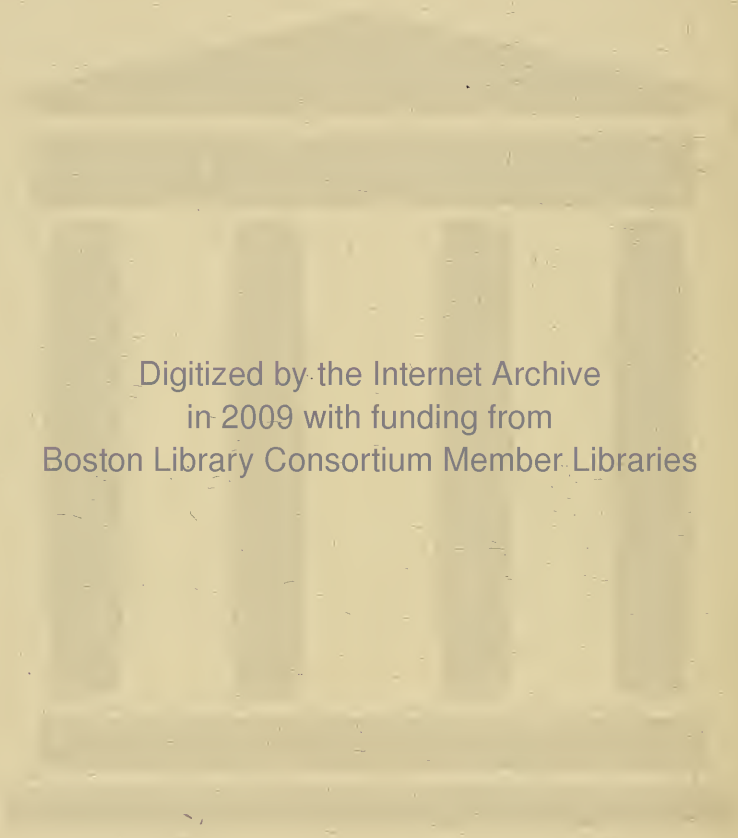

CROYDON TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, (the polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

ART. 1. To choose one Selectman for three years and one Selectman for one year, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, two Auditors, Library Trustee for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years and all such Officers and Agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Town's business for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$4,500.00 for Town Charges for the ensuing year.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for Class V roads, and vote to raise and appropriate \$482.89 for same. The State to contribute \$3,219.26.

ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V highways and bridges and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.

ART. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for summer and winter road maintenance.

ART. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Dump.

ART. 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for purchasing a new site for the Town Dump.

ART. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Expense of the Highway Department.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to buy culverts.

ART. 10 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting brush.

ART. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of Cemeteries.

ART. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Capital Reserve Fund to be used for new equipment.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights and lighting Town Buildings.

ART. 14. To see if the Town will vote to install water in the Town Hall and raise and appropriate a sum of money for same.

ART. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for painting the Town Hall.

ART. 16. Part 1. To see if the Town will vote to pay Social Security on Town Employees and raise and appropriate money for same.

Part 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise the Highway Agent's hourly wages from \$1.75 per hour to \$1.85 per hour.

ART. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.

ART. 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during the year in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for old age assistance.

ART. 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance.

ART. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for salary of Librarian.

ART. 22. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on taxes paid within two weeks of presentation of Tax Bill.

ART. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to put a hard surface in the Town Shed.

ART. 24. To see if the Town will vote to use from Capital Reserve Funds \$376.99 to buy a portable heater for the Town Shed.

ART. 25. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the Jan Harkema lot consisting of 120 acres more or less.

ART. 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$40.00 for promotion of Dartmouth Lake Sunapee Regional Association.

ART. 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the Newport Hospital.

ART. 28. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to prepare for a Bi-centennial celebration.

ART. 29. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Croydon:

Enrollment—Curriculum

This year Mrs. Doris Farrington is teaching Grades 1-3 at the Village School with an enrollment of 19 pupils divided as follows:

Grade 1	5
Grade 2	9
Grade 3	5

Several new pieces of teaching equipment have been obtained—mostly in the field of Arithmetic. These include: filmstrips, counting devices, and other supplemental items. A new series of programmed instruction in number is being used. Both pupils and teacher are enthusiastic—which should result in a more meaningful understanding of number at the primary level.

Building Improvements

Following an inspection in October 1961, the Office of the State Fire Marshall reported: "The present furnace in the classroom should be removed as soon as possible and placed in a separate incombustible room. Although the furnace appears to be installed correctly, the fact that it is located in the classroom constitutes a hazard. We recommend that a masonry addition be constructed specifically as a boiler room with entrance from the outside only."

During the summer of 1962, with funds available from "excess tuition," it was possible to have a masonry addition constructed to house the heating unit. The removal of the heating unit has not only removed a hazard from the classroom, but it has also made more space available and has largely eliminated the noise factor which was a real disturbing element during school sessions.

A cap of insulation was also installed above the classroom ceiling. This has made a real reduction in heat loss.

Both of these projects have increased the effectiveness of the school building.

Conclusion

The school is running smoothly which speaks well for the cooperation of the School Board, staff, and citizens. Your interest is appreciated.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Croydon, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the sixth day of March 1963 at 7:30 o'clock p.m. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

Article 6. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District Officials and Agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to put an addition on the Croydon School to accommodate the 4th, 5th and 6th grades and equip and hire teacher for same. (By petition.)

Article 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
