## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dummer in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Willis School House in said Dummer on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for general expense of the Highway Department.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.
7. To see if the town will vote to accept T.R.A. and make appropriation for the same.
8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor.
9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance.
10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of cemeteries.
11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of town libraries.
12. To see if the town will vote to give discount on taxes.
13. To see if the town will raise and appropriate any sum of money for the White Mountains Region Association.

14. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of taxes, and to renew notes.

15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Civil Defense.

16. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Social Security.

17. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to apply on long term notes.

18. To see what action the town will take toward fire protection and make appropriation for same.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of the Dummer School District:

## Foreword

Several legislative acts were passed during the last session of the legislature which should be of interest to the voters of the School District. Some of this legislation has implications that might have a far reaching effect on education in this state. A brief summary of this legislation follows:

The Interim Commission on Education is in the process of making an extensive study of school district organization, per capita tax, services of Supervisory Unions, cooperative school district incentive aid, school attendance, and other related educational areas. This study will probably be a basis for future legislative acts in regard to education in the state. As this committee has just begun its task your Superintendent would like to encourage all the voters to be conscious of developments in this area. From time to time press releases will be available on this study. Mrs. Douglas Horton from Randolph is serving as a member of this Commission.

Educational television received an appropriation of \$25,000.00 (for each year of the biennium) for operating expenses. The sum of \$15,000.00 was made available on a matching basis with the local districts for additional operating expenses. In certain areas of the curriculum this will enhance learning to a substantial degree. At the present time we are facing poor reception but this problem will be reduced or eliminated.

An act encouraging the education of intellectually retarded pupils at the local level was enacted. This Act provides that "School districts may establish classes as approved by the state board or may pay tuition to such an approved class maintained by another school district or by a private organization. The state shall pay to a school district a portion of the cost of education of each child in an approved class at the rate of 1/2 the state average cost per pupil for elementary schools. School districts maintaining special classes approved for the education of these children may charge tuition at a rate higher than the limit in RSA 193:34, provided the rate is approved by the state board. Appropriation—\$50,000 for fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 and \$75,000 for fiscal year ending June 30, 1963". Several districts within the state previous to this legislation have exercised leadership in this educational area.

### **General Observations**

After making numerous visits to the Willis School I have come to the conclusion that a good educational program is in evidence. Tests, data and personal observations indicate that the pupils are attaining mastery of basic skills. Mrs. Sias does a wonderful piece of work in planning and carrying out her duties.

Our pupils in Grades 7 and 8 in Berlin appear to be doing quite well. The change made several years ago in sending these pupils to Berlin will have a more pronounced effect as they continue in their school work.

### **Budget and Warrant**

The proposed budget for 1962-63 totals \$22,305.95. This represents an increase of \$887.97 over last year's proposed budget and \$1,305.95 over last year's actual adopted budget. The major increase is due to a higher tuition rate—\$457.00 and \$350.00 over last year's rates of \$436.00 and \$300.00 for High School and Junior High pupils.

Almost all other budget items have gone up a little. This is due mainly to higher costs which reflect back in our budget. Your School Board and I reviewed the budget carefully, keeping in mind that we wanted to keep our present standards. Although difficult to estimate at this time, our balance will probably be about \$100.00.

### **Enrollment and Attendance**

Our attendance dropped considerably from the previous year from 94.8% to 91%. With a small enrollment the attendance percentage will fluctuate substantially. However, our tardiness record dropped considerably, from 30 to 9. I would like to commend the pupils for their efforts in overcoming a poor tardiness record.

### **Buildings and Equipment**

Several major pieces of equipment were added to the playground. This new equipment gives us extensive playground facilities considering the number of pupils enrolled.

The building is being kept in good repair. No major repair expenditures are being planned in the proposed budget. However, during the course of a year, a great many small jobs have to be done. I think it wise to keep our buildings in good condition and not postpone the small jobs.

### **Tuition**

At the present time we have seven pupils in Junior High and twelve in High School. This represents an increase of two pupils for tuition purposes. It is expected that Berlin will keep next year's Junior High tuition figure of \$350.00

for a two year period. In 1964-65 we can expect a Junior High tuition rate of \$375.00.
