- To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to install electric lights from the residence of the late Nettie Robinson to the John Archibald Lane on Prescott Road, so called.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to specify which of the library building funds the sum of \$700 from the Sanborn estate is to be given.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1539 for State Aid construction of the N. Epping and Fremont road, provided the State shall appropriate the sum of \$1539 for the same purpose.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to convert outstanding short term notes into long term notes.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8500 to build a fire station, money to be raised by long term notes.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to continue the sewerage from Mary Donovan residence to the town dump.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

I herewith submit my report as Health Officer for the year ending January 31st, 1935.

We have had the following contagious diseases reported: syphilis, one; typhoid fever, one; tuberculosis, three; mumps, two; whooping cough, four; scarlet fever, ten; measles, forty-five.

I sent up for analysis ten pint lots of milk taken from dealers, with the following report: seven satisfactory, one excessive colon organism, one deemed adulterated with dirt (sediment), one very bad, having not only an exceedingly high bacteria count, but also dirt (sediment). The dealer who had the very bad milk has gone out of business and the others

have been warned that they must sell pure, standard milk or suffer the consequences.

In regard to the town water, a committee was chosen to try and locate some better water. They attended to their duties, several locations were tried with little success. The town water was tested about once a month and was reported good, except excessive iron. I have had several complaints about toilets and sewerage, which have been investigated.

I would recommend that the town at the annual meeting appropriate enough money to lay and cover pipes to take care of sewerage from the residence of Mary Donovan to the town dump. If this is done it will eliminate a whole lot of complaints.
