WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Freedom, New Hampshire, in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$6500.00 to defray town charges, consisting of town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, election and registration, town hall expenses, and appropriate money for the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the use of hydrants and appropriate money for the same.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars for street lights and appropriate money for the same.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars for general expenses of highway department and appropriate money for the same.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for Public Library and appropriate money for the same.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars for winter highways and appropriate money for the same.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seven hundred and seventeen dollars and nine cents for class five roads and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars for town needy and appropriate money for the same.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand and four hundred dollars for insurance and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars for old age assistance and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week Celebration and Memorial Day and appropriate money for the same.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six thousand dollars for summer highways and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of eight hundred dollars for the fire department and the purchase of new hose.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for maintaining the town dump and appropriate money for the same.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to use the revenue from 1965 Severance Tax to cover any overages.
 - 18. To see if the town will vote to petition the

State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.

- 19. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and forty-four dollars and thirty-nine cents, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town; to the Lakes Region for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources for the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars for interest on short term notes and appropriate money for the same.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for Social Security and appropriate money for the same.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars to purchase twelve new tables for the Town Hall and appropriate money for the same.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to be given as a donation and divided between North Conway and Huggins Memorial Hospital.
- 25. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to trade the old grader for a new grader and purchase the same on a long term note, said note not to exceed \$18,000.00.
- 26. To see if the town will vote to accept the remaining portion of the ball field as a gift from Albion J. Towle.
 - 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and

appropriate the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars for plowing driveways.

- 28. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for the janitor of the Town Hall and appropriate money for the same.
- 29. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars to tar a section of the West Ossipee Road and appropriate money for the same.
- 30. To see if the town will vote to consolidate the two town road districts into one district, under one road agent.
- 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Nine children in grades one and two participated in the program offered for dental cleanings and application of Topical Fluoride.

With the realization that primary responsibility for the health of children rests with the home it is gratifying to find the child's attitude toward health procedures acceptable as part of growing up. Their regard for 'Their Doctor' as a good friend who tries to keep them well — the enthusiasm they show when they have received boosters for continued protection against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Small Pox, Polio and Measles is a credit to all concerned.

Although dental problems continue to be the outstanding defect found among school children it is en-

couraging to find the number who have had timely dental care. Also the interest in proper nutrition as it effects the child, not only in regards to good teeth but also to optimum health and its relation to the learning process.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to everyone who helped to make this program possible.
