STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the town of Goffstown qualified to Vote in
Town Affairs :*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March, next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To choose three selectmen for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
4. To choose one or more road agents for the ensuing year.
5. To choose one cemetery trustee for the term of three years.
6. To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Rogers free library.
8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to decorate soldiers' graves.
9. To see if the town will vote to build a receiving tomb at the west village cemetery, and make appropriation for the same.
10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for all necessary town charges, for the support of schools, for building new and repairing highways, sidewalks, and bridges for the ensuing year.
11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay existing debts of the town.
12. To hear reports of agents and auditors, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

The number of epidemic cases coming to our knowledge has been 110, as follows: Typhoid fever, 2; measles, 104 (42 cases at the Hillsborough county farm); scarlet fever, 1; diphtheria, 3: 1 fatal.

Regarding the typhoid fever cases, which occurred at the village, their source seems very obscure, as the drainage seemed perfect. The water at the village being offensive at the time, the Board sent specimens to Prof. Angell of Derry, whose analysis showed the water to be good, and free from injurious properties.

Where the first case of measles in the village arose, is disputed, but the way it spread is extremely obvious. At the farm the disease came through a prisoner.

The case of scarlet fever was at the farm, and its source was not ascertained.

One case of diphtheria occurred at the village, and its source was not ascertained to the satisfaction of the Board. The other two cases occurred at Grasmere; source was bad drainage.

Several verbal complaints and one written complaint have been received and investigated.

REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE INDEPENDENT DISTRICT.

The school year begins with the fall term, and we are now in the middle of the year and half way through the winter school. This report will therefore contain the statistics for the year ending Aug. 31, 1896.

Number weeks schooling during the year, 36. The officer taking the census reports in the district, between the ages of 5 and 16, 88 boys and 93 girls, a total of 181. There have been enrolled as scholars during the year between those ages, 218; whole number enrolled during the year of all ages, 119 boys and 117 girls, a total of 236. Average attendance in high school, 40; lower grades, 148; total average, 188,—95 per cent. Not attending school between 5 and 16 years of age, 15; mostly children between 5 and 6.

The falling off in attendance is due to the removal of families from the place on account of the depression in business.

The high school was under the charge of Mr. J. A. McDougall, assisted by Miss Bertha Pattee. Rev. Mr. Wentworth has also

instructed a class in Greek without charge to the district. His influence has been very helpful to the school, especially to those scholars who have fitted themselves for entrance to higher institutions of learning.

A class of six graduated at the close of the spring term. On the last Sabbath of the school year the Rev. Mr. Wentworth gave an interesting address to the class.

The graduating exercises were held in the hall and were of a high character, winning the approval of the large audience that gathered to listen to them. A reception was given to the class at the house of Dr. Blaisdell. An alumni association was formed with Miss Carrie Hoyt as president, and it was determined that the reception be held hereafter at the hall.

The graduates were Frank Fletcher, Harry Blaisdell, Willie Hadley, Susie Thompson, Emma Campbell, and Edith Pierce. Harry Blaisdell is now pursuing his studies at Kimball Union, Meriden, Arthur Merrill is at Phillips Exeter, Susie Thompson and Emma Campbell are at the Bridgewater normal school, and Edith Pierce is teaching. Arthur Blaisdell, that he might prepare himself for college more readily, left here and entered Phillips Exeter.

After a service of three years, Mr. McDougall resigned and accepted a position as principal of a grammar school in Northampton, Mass. Mr. McDougall was a successful teacher. His scholars were always studious and orderly. He was not only a good teacher but a helpful man in society, active and interested in whatever promised to advance the happiness and usefulness of others. He carries with him the commendations of the committee and the best wishes of parents and scholars.

The present school year began with the fall term with Mr. C. A. Crooks as principal. At the close of the term ill health compelled him to resign, and he was succeeded by Mr. Henry Stark. With this exception the teachers are the same as last year.

Mr. Stark is a well known citizen of the town, a former pupil in this school, and a graduate of Dartmouth. He is giving excellent satisfaction.

Miss Ada Loughead had charge of the grammar school during

the fall term and most of the winter term. Near the close of this term she was called to her home in Franklin Falls by the sickness of a sister, and being offered increased salary in a school there, she tendered her resignation here. She was a superior teacher, quiet in her ways, persistent in her purpose, clear in her thought, and trained by her normal school instructor in the best methods of school work. She was succeeded by Miss Lizzie Flint. Miss Flint is a resident of this town, a graduate of the high school, and of Moody's school at Northfield. She has had some experience in teaching, and won high commendation from her school officials. We believe she will prove a capable and efficient teacher. This is the only break in our corps of teachers during the year.

The grammar and intermediate rooms have not done their best work. They have allowed themselves to waste too much of their time in faultfinding, and study lost its interest. The teachers have labored faithfully and conscientiously, and deserve better treatment than has sometimes been accorded them. There has been improvement of late, and we hope a better spirit may prevail, and better results be attained. There are many bright and well disposed girls and boys in these rooms, and they must not allow the thoughtless and the roguish to engross their attention, and hinder their progress. It is not too late yet, by hard work, to make amends for the past and secure commendation and promotion. If any fail, it must be attributed to their own thoughtlessness and lack of application. From this time on let each one do his best.

REPORT
OF THE
SCHOOL BOARD OF THE TOWN DISTRICT.

The school board submit the following report :

This is the forty-seventh annual published report of the schools of the town of Goffstown, and while we notice at the present day some of the things complained of in the first report, we see a vast difference in our schools from that day. One thing complained of then was poor schoolhouses. In the main our schoolhouses now are in good state of repair, and we have endeavored to keep them in a healthful condition, as far as regards sanitary measures.

In regard to the selection of teachers we have endeavored to secure the best we could with the means at our disposal and place those best capacitated for certain schools in them, and we think in our selection we have been very fortunate, as we have had but little trouble to mar the pleasure of the school year. Our teachers have been conscientious and painstaking and have labored for the interest of the school. In some schools we have been able to retain the same teachers through the year, to the great advantage of the school. Another thing we have endeavored to bring about is a more practical instruction and to lay more stress upon the fact that with many of our boys and girls all the schooling they get is in the common school ; and with this we are pleased to note a great improvement in writing, letter-writing, language lessons, practical grammar, and practical arithmetic.

Again: the spirit of patriotism and love of country, reverence and regard for the flag, is being more and more inculcated.

In the Parker and Mast-road districts neat flag-poles have been set and appropriate flags bought through the efforts of parents and scholars, and a day set apart for a flag-raising was thoroughly enjoyed by all present.

We would recommend the raising of enough additional money to give us thirty weeks of schooling for ensuing year.

We wish to thank you for the interest taken and your co-operation and support for the past year, and hope it will increase in future.

MOUNTAIN.

Spring and fall terms, taught by Miss Emma D. Todd, proved very successful, as her former ones in this district have always been. Both parents and scholars seemed to take great interest in the school.

Winter term taught by Grace M. Shearer. School small, only four in attendance the last part of term. A very commendable degree of improvement was manifest, showing good work through the term.

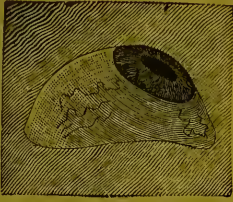
