To the inhabitants of the town of Gorham in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year. (On the ballot.)

Article 2. Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town? (On the ballot.)

Article 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government.

Article 4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Protection of Persons and Property.

Article 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health.

Article 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Summer Roads.

Article 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Winter Roads.

Article 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting.

Article 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Read Aid.

Article 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

Article 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Welfare.

Article 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

Article 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to celebrate the return of war veterans on the 4th of July, in conjunction with the American Legion.

Article 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Recreation.

Article 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts.

Article 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Water and Sewer Maintenance.

Article 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

Article 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Skating Rinks.

Article 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Unclassified Expenditures, including auto permits.

Article 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising.

Article 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.

Article 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on temporary loans and short term notes.

Article 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Dredging.

Article 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Roof for Gorham Hill Spring.

Article 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for extension of Water Line, Bangor Road.

Article 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Air Compressor and Equipment.

Article 27. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for extension of Water Line to the Knights of Columbus Building, Berlin Road.

Article 28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment on short term notes.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on temporary notes in anticipation of taxes, covering period from March 10, 1959 to the Annual Meeting of 1960.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the Inventory Blanks when taking the inventory.

Article 31. To see if the town will approve the acquisition by the United States Government of about 16,500 square feet (.038 acres) of land situated in Gorham, such land to serve as residence and headquarters for U. S. Forest Service personnel and described as follows: A piece of land approximately 100' x 165' located on the north side of Main Street in lot 164 and bounded on the west by land of Edna Cheney; on the north and east by land of the Public Service Company of New Hampshire; and on the south by Main Street.

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to have a committee of three (3) residents of Gorham which is to include one medical man, appointed by the Selectmen, to investigate the desirability and cost of installing equipment which will add the proper amount of

fluoride to the town water supply, said committee to report its findings and recommendations at the 1960 Gorham Town Meeting.

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to adopt the non-partisan ballot system for the election of town officers, according to the provisions of Chapter 59, Section 73, Revised Statutes Annotated, Laws of New Hampshire.

Article 34. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 35. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The polls shall be open from nine of the clock in the forenoon to six of the clock in the afternoon.

A petition was received from the Gorham School Board and Building Committee for the purchase of equipment required for the Gorham High School additions.

We recommend that the sum of \$15,000.00 be raised by the issuance of serial notes to be paid off in 5 years.

A petition was received from the Gorham School Board for permission to use funds on hand to match Federal Funds to be used in the purchase of Science equipment.

We recommend that the sum of \$1,500.00 be taken from funds on hand, resulting from the current school budget, to purchase this equipment.

A request was received for money to put a roof over the Gorham Hill Spring.

We recommend that \$3,500.00 be raised for this project.

A request was received for money to extend the Bangor Road Water Line.

We recommend that \$1,100.00 be raised for this project.

A request was received for money to purchase an air compressor and auxiliary equipment such as a pavement breaker and jack hammer attachments.

Since the Town of Gorham does not own this type of equipment and currently has to rent equipment when needed we recommend that \$5,900.00 be raised for the purchase of this equipment.

A request was received for money to provide water to a proposed Knights of Columbus building site, if the Shopping Center now being contemplated should become a reality.

We recommend that the Selectmen be authorized to negotiate a temporary loan of \$1,600.00 for this project if the need arises.

We recommend that the money for the following items be taken from Cash Surplus:

The request for funds as received from the Recreation Commission was increased by the Budget Committee with the recommendation that this increase be used to provide an opportunity for increased participation in the swimming program by the Cascade Area children. Estimated Income:

While the School Board is not required to file the estimated income until June 10, 1959, the following figures are submitted as being an accurate estimate at this time: Balance, \$6,500.00; Construction Aid, \$9,750.00; Tuition receipts, \$21,500.00; Misc. \$2,675.00; Total \$40,425.00.

* The starred items are required by law to be raised as determined by the proper authorities. The District determines the salaries of the District officers. The Supervisory Union Board decides the local share of the Superintendent's salary and other Union expenses. The share paid by the several Districts toward the Superintendent's salary for 1958-59 is as follows: Dummer, \$168.00; Gorham, \$3,321.60; Jefferson, \$427.20; Milan, \$494.40; Randolph, \$158.40; Shelburne, \$230.40. The State Treasurer also reports the amount of the per capita tax, while the Teachers' Retirement Board assesses the amount for teachers' retirement and the State Employees' Retirement Association assesses the amount for the Superintendent's retirement and other District employees that belong to the system. In those towns that are under Social Security, the amount to be paid by the District is established by law.

Report of Recreation Commission

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham:

The Recreation Commission, a five man board appointed by the Selectmen, is in its ninth year of operation.

The Gorham Recreation Department is now in its second year-round Recreation Program.

In 1957 a Recreation Advisory Council was formed to work closely with the Recreation Commission and the Superintendent of Recreation in all their Recreational activities. Its efforts have been devoted to raising Funds for the purpose of converting the Old High School to a Recreation Center and developing a Recreational program of interest to the Community.

The Recreation Advisory Council was fortunate to receive a \$5,000 grant from the Harriett M. Spaulding Trusts Fund on a dollar for dollar basis. In October of 1958 the \$5,000 was raised by the Advisory Council and matched by the Spaulding Trusts Fund. This money was used at the Recreation Center for that part of the renovations which has been completed.

The 1958 attendance record shows that many more people have found the activities at the Recreation Center, Libby Memorial Pool, and on their playgrounds to be attractive. Many of the participants in the program have shown their appreciation for the opportunities through continued participation, letters, and remarks directed to the Recreation Department during the year.

Through the cooperation and interest of everyone in Gorham, all working together for the common good and the improvement of our Recreational opportunities, it has been possible to submit this report of our progress during the past year.

TEEN CANTEEN

REPRESENTATION: There are eight representatives on the Teen Canteen Council. Representation is constant except in the event of withdrawal or graduation. When the latter occurs, the vacancy is filled by a member of the incoming Freshman class elected by the members at large. The present representation is as follows: William Kaschub, Junior, President; Brian Stone, Senior, Vice President; Jackie Turcotte, Junior, Secretary; Carole Smith, Sophomore, Treasurer. Other members: Dennis Reisch, Junior; Phillip Pennell, Sophomore; Ann Ruggles and Richard Avore, Freshman.

FINANCES: Financial reports shall be made weekly at the council meetings. Money is banked in a local bank. Checks are to be signed by the Superintendent of Recreation and the Treasurer of the Teen Canteen Council.

The Teen Canteen has recently voted to purchase furniture for the Recreation Center with money from the Treasury. It has sponsored Fourteen Dances at the Recreation Center.

REPORT FROM THE WHITE MOUNTAINS REGION ASSOCIATION

1958 was a busy year for the White Mountains Region office, particularly in the information and transportation fields.

In view of foreseen drastic consequences, the Region took a very active part in representing our towns in fighting transport curtailment, particularly with regard to the railroads. We appeared at hearings in Concord, North Conway, and Littleton, and engaged in a considerable amount of travel and correspondence in the effort to prevent the Boston and Maine and the Maine Central railroads from cutting out their passenger service. While only limited success resulted, it should be pointed out that such curtailments will go through without even a delay if they are not strongly contested. We have also taken an active part in proceedings before the Civil Aeronautics Board in attempting to secure better air service for northern New Hampshire; the final decision on this is not yet in. In the meantime, we have worked with bus companies to publicize their service in the hope that bus travel may take up some of the slack.

Demands for White Mountains literature of all types continue to increase, and we have been considerably crowded to satisfy them. The new N. H. Montreal office, turnpike information booths, and new sources contacted while out of state have all upped the quantity of literature we need to distribute. As satisfying the requests for folders about our region means dollars to our towns, it is extremely important that we receive enough funds to supply the need.

We have continued our customary and tested programs of 4-H awards, Youth Awards in science, and of liaison with all types of organizations and departments who in one way or another are working for the benefit of our area and our state. We have confidence that 21 years has proved them worthwhile. We have continued to travel to areas outside our state to carry the White Mountains message, and have cooperated with attractions operators and others who are doing the same job in different ways.

We'd like to remind every town again in this legislative year that holding the line in taxes in New Hampshire will be possible to a large extent only as much as we continue to bring in out-of-state visitors to help finance our main sources of revenue (Ex: they pay over 40% of the gas tax and others). To do this, we have to continue to reach out and bring them in, and put up the small sums (which return many times over) that publicity costs. It's for our own benefit, and it **does** pay off. At a small outlay to any one town, an area publicity program operates that benefits all our towns. Our surveys in four consecutive years have shown consistently 2½ to 3 times the town monies coming back to the area out of just a few inquirers surveyed.

Your town's part in this work is important, and is appreciated. This is one way where we in New Hampshire can still do things for ourselves
