

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenfield in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Greenfield on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- Art. 3. To choose one or more and not exceeding three highway agents for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To hear reports of the Selectmen, Road Agents, Treasurer, Overseers of the Poor, Library Trustees and other Town Officers and take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of the Public Library.
- Art. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs of highways and bridges.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town debts or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1200) to pay for snow tractor or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to oil all the gravel roads built by the Road Agents during 1933 and 1934 or take any action relative thereto.

- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50) to clear the Whittemore Cemetery of bushes, to repair the gate and reset the stones which have fallen or need attention, or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town of Greenfield will vote to accept one hundred dollars (\$100) for the perpetual care of the Russell Lot (John R. and Sons) in Greenvale Cemetery.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a fire siren for the engine house, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to light and maintain the Community Christmas tree or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Sixty dollars (\$60) for the purpose of advertising the resources and natural advantages of the town, said sum to be expended under the direction of the selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will appoint a zoning commission to consist of five members, to recommend boundaries for zoning districts in said town and to recommend approximate regulations therefor, in accordance with the provision of Chapter 42, of the Public Laws.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of dollars for the expenses of the zoning commission if the town votes to appoint such commission under the preceding article.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to pay fifty cents (50¢) per hour to such firemen as shall be designated by the fire chief, for time spent in fighting fires, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$150 to buy a snow plow to be attached to a truck or to take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will accept state aid for construction of the Class II road known as Forrest Road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$739.50, or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$503.23.

- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in connection with a State Fund toward the control of pine blister rust work. This appropriation is in the form of an unemployment relief project. Or to take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for grading off the lot by the Cemetery, or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF GREENFIELD:

I respectfully submit my first annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

The State Legislature of 1933 enacted a provision requiring the State Board of Education to reduce the number of supervisory unions in the state from the sixty existing at that time to the fiftyfive in 1933-1934 and to fifty for 1934-1935. This second reduction resulted in the addition of Francestown and Greenfield to the six towns which formerly comprised Supervisory Union No. 63: Wilton, Greenville, Lyndeboro, Mason, New Ipswich and Temple. The new towns add approximately one hundred children and four teachers but the closing of two rural schools in Wilton leaves a net increase of only two teachers.

The Superintendent's time is not apportioned among the towns in the supervisory union by any fixed rule, but rather he is expected to give attention to each school according to its needs. It is too early to predict what the ultimate results of the change in this Union may be, but it is apparent now that each school will receive less attention than formerly, not only because there are more schools to be visited in a given time, but also because the increase in administrative duties necessarily reduces time available for

We are using standardized tests:

A. To compare progress in the various schools with fair standards of accomplishment.

B. To discover general weaknesses where they may exist in any school and point the way to improving teaching at such weak points.

C. To assist the teachers in discovering the particular weaknesses and needs of individual children and help direct their instruc-

tion throughout the year.

The tests used include the Stanford Achievement Test which covers nearly all of the subjects taught in Grades 3-8. This test is given every year in October and is repeated in May for children whose October scores in the test were low. In Grades 1-3 we use the Gray Oral Reading Check Tests at intervals of five or six weeks throughout the year. We have begun this year to use the Metropolitan Primary Reading Test also in Grades 1-3 and Metropolitan Primary Arithmetic Test in Grades 2 and 3. are given in January. All tests are given by teachers, who follow very exact and minute directions in order that the tests may be given under uniform conditions in every school.

The form of report card was revised this year in order to provide for systematic reporting of each pupil's scores in the standardized tests, so as to give to parents a more complete picture of their

children's success in school.

The school nurse, Miss Margaret Harris, has been following up the physical examination of last June during the summer and since schools opened in September. Her monthly reports show eight school visits, and her activities included complete dental examination, eye tests, and weighing and measuring of all the children; also twelve home visits following up several cases needing correction of vision and minor items. Defects corrected and reported so far are three tonsil cases during the summer vacation.

The budget estimates for the school year 1935-1936 do not differ materially from the budget presented last March. The decrease of \$65 in the estimated cost of transportation and of \$320 in the estimated cost of high school tuition are offset by the fact that insurance premiums, payable every three years, fall due next year, and we are asking for \$50 for new equipment where no appropriation was asked for last year. This item is to take care of the blackboards we propose to place across the front of the Primary Room where there is now a very old and very small board not at all adequate to the needs.
