### Town Meeting Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lyman, in the County of Grafton, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lyman Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, 1950, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before three o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500 for the maintenance of winter roads.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100 for the compensation of the Tax Collector.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000 for general expense of the highways.

- Article 7. To see what sums of money the town will vote raise and appropriate for the library, cemetery, interest on temporary loans, police department, fire department, town poor, and Old Age Assistance.
- Article 8. To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each town officer, also for traveling expenses and at what rate per mile.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50 for the purchase of the barn on the Jacob Williams place for storing sand.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$225 to paint the outside of the town hall.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$125 to repair the tool shed.
- Article 11-A. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$454.03 for the same.
- Article 11-B. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$10 for Memorial Day.
- Article 14. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers' salaries and town officers' expenses.

- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to grant a discount of two per cent. on all taxes paid on or before such time as the selectmen may designate.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50 for small tools for roads.
- Article 17. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate that may be acquired through tax collector's deed.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to exchange the present truck for a new one and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to buy a grader, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to buy a bulldozer, and to raise and appropriate necessary money for the same.
- Article 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell the old snow plow.
- Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37.05 to the White Mountain Region Association, being ten cents per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation for 1949, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- Article 23. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass votes relative thereto.

Article 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lyman for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1949, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

#### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector and Town Clerk.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets
Dec. 31, 1948—Dec. 31, 1949 (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1948 and December 31, 1949, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the financial condition of the town changed from a net debt of \$155.33 to a surplus of \$1,129.04 during 1949.

#### Analysis of Change in Financial Condition:

(Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1949, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$832.69, plus a net revenue surplus of \$479.88, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$1,312.57.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1949, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1949, is indicated in Exhibit F.

#### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officals charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and

totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

#### Town Treasurer:

The Treasurer has followed the practice of signing order checks in blank before their issuance by the Board of Selectmen, entering such checks in her cash book after they have been paid and returned by the bank. It is recommended that this practice be discontinued and that the Treasurer countersign checks only as issued by the Selectmen. Checks should be entered in the cash book by the Treasurer immediately after countersigning.

#### Unexpended Balances of Appropriations:

The following unexpended appropriation balances carried from 1948 were closed out upon recommendation of the Board of Selectmen:

Libraries \$ 20.00 Flag Pond Bridge \$ 210.50

The unexpended balance of the appropriation for road equipment, in the amount of \$500.00, was carried to 1950.

#### Unredeemed Taxes:

All property on which the town holds tax liens which remain unredeemed for more than two years after the date of the tax sale should be deeded to the town by the Tax Collector.

#### CONCLUSION

The accounts and records of all town officals which we examined were found in good order and the accounting procedure, with exceptions as herein noted, conformed to the uniform system prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officals of the Town of Lyman for their assistance during the course of the audit.
