TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Orange in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orange on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote: A Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, a Tax Collector, a Road Agent, a Constable, one Trustee of Trust Funds for one year, one Cemetery Agent, one Overseer of Public Welfare, Fence Viewers, Measurers of Wood, Bark and Lumber and all other officers that the Town may judge necessary.

And then beginning at ONE O'CLOCK in the afternoon to vote on the following Articles.

ARTICLE 2. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for the payment of town charges for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 to pay Town House expenses.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to paint the front part of the Town House only, replace broken panes and glaze.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Summer maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the Winter maintenance of

Highways and Bridges.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town Truck.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$205.99 for Town Road Aid and the State will contribute \$1,373.24.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$90.00 for Insurance on the Town House.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Insurance on the Town Truck.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Old Age Assistance.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the Town Library.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for the maintenance of the Town Cemeteries.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5.00 for the decoration of the Soldiers Graves on Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to hire the Canaan Fire Department for services in case of fires in Orange and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for this purpose. Said sum to be placed in the Orange Fire Trust Fund.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to purchase one adding machine for use by Town Officers.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes to pay necessary town charges.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to pay interest on borrowed money.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$49.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of Perambulating Town Lines.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for the yearly salary for the Trustee of Trust Funds.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and the Deeding Agent to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds in the Town.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid in full within fifteen days from the date of tax bill of 3 percent.

ARTICLE 24. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and other Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting not included in the Warrant.

ARTICLE 26. The polls shall not close earlier than four of the clock in the afternoon.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN
AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy — both industrial and recreational — is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area — 4,350,000 acres — is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape;

(2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.
