### WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rollinsford in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the thirteenth of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1 To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, One Selectman and Overseer of the Poor for a term of three years, One Road Agent, and Chief of the Fire Department.
- ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- ART. 4. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1945 levy, except poll taxes, paid on or before September 1st. next.
- ART. 5. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

- ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), towards the payment of a suitable war memorial in memory of those from this town who participated in the Spanish American War and in World Wars 1 and 2, the balance of the necessary cost having been raised by the citizens of the town working in behalf of this project.
- ART. 7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Appropriations will begin at eleven (11) o'clock sharp.

## REPORT OF CHIEF ENGINEER AND FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Citizens of Rollinsford:

With pleasure I herewith submit my report for the past year.

In compliance with the vote taken at the last annual town meeting, the committee appointed to ascertain the proper requirements and units necessary for an efficient new fire truck and pumper for our town's needs, not to exceed \$7,500.00, have decided that, due to factors beyond the control of fire truck manufacturers, it be wise to prolong the time of purchasing such a truck until after the release of various items now frozen by the Federal Government. Such items are considered very essential for any new truck which would be called upon to meet our fire fighting activities and especially on jobs requiring draught from brooks, wells, etc. Therefore no new fire truck has, as vet, been contracted for and awaits future action. We, as a committee, further report that much time has been spent meeting with various representatives of several fire truck manufacturers but to no avail, due to the above good reasons. There still remains no doubt that a proper new fire truck is much needed when a suitable and efficient piece of apparatus can be purchased for our town's fire protection.

At three fires this past year it was deemed necessary to call upon the South Berwick Fire Department to respond with one of their pumping units for coverage. They responded when called and helped in all ways possible, for which we greatly acknowledge with sincere thanks.

The committee appointed to investigate water holes in the outlying districts for pumper use report progress but due to various reasons have no report to present as This project in itself is apt to become a complex matter and rightly should be handled by the Selectmen on account of the abutting land owners and any tax question which might become involved. I would suggest that land owners abutting brooks, designated proper for suitable water holes, be consulted prior to the investigation of the probable costs of creating such water holes on any or all brooks. The questions of tax abatements, if any, lies within the jurisdiction of the Selectmen of the town and should be handled by them before any committee submits cost figures covering water holes on brooks. In my opinion this cooperation of abutting land owners should precede all other inquiry. by committees or suitable cost figures presented. Just to save later disputes if nothing more.

Water damage to land, abutting brooks, can result once these brooks are dammed for water holes and the cooperation and consent for such projects should be discussed and ironed out before any constructive action is attempted or figures presented. Due to the above facts no conclusive action has been taken to date relative to establishing water holes suitable for fire purposes when demand occurs, with a new truck available.

Grass and brush fires in our town have been held to the minimum and no serious damage has resulted therefrom. Our citizens have cooperated in all ways relative to fires of this class and in most all cases have obtained the required fire permit before kindling a fire to burn. There still remains a few citizens who persist in taking a chance to burn without a permit and sooner or later they will be sorry for so doing. They know they are liable for damage caused while burning without the required permit. Protect yourself with a permit before kindling a fire in the open. If in doubt as to whether a permit is required or not for any particular fire consult your Forest Fire Warden. It is easy to start a fire but often hard work and costly to extinguish them when they burn out of control. Play safe. It is apt to prove less costly in the end.

It might be in order, at this time, to caution that the law pertaining to the dropping of lighted matches, cigarettes, cigars and other material from a vehicle on the highways, is still in effect and enforced. Many roadside fires can be and are caused from this unnecessary and needless habit. Be careful.

Due to the continued shortage of manpower to fight all fires, we are once more appealing to everyone for real caution by eliminating fire hazards in the home, industrial plants, fields and woods, and elsewhere, thereby reducing the number of fires and their resultant costly wake.

Fire department equipment, as well as new apparatus, is very hard to obtain and can only be had with a high government priority, when such is obtainable under any conditions. Many citizens, other than firemen, have at various times assisted us in fighting fires. Their valuable services are hereby acknowledged, as well as others, who have in any way contributed their services toward eliminating hazards and controlling fires due to the absence of regular fire department manpower, due to the war effort. We thank you one and all. May we expect your continued support and assistance to the end, that all loss from fire may be controlled. We shall appreciate your continued assistance.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Rollinsford:

I am privileged to present my sixteenth annual report. As is the custom throughout the State the statistics given mainly cover the school year ending June 30, 1944.

If you will study the statistics you will note a slight increase in the number of pupils enrolled and a better average membership. This latter figure shows a more stable population. Note also a significant drop in the number of tardy marks. The per cent of attendance improved. We do not expect perfect attendance. There are bound to be days when an ailing child should be kept at home. We have a nurse available and a quiet room with a comfortable couch for sick children but home is still the best place for such children. We cannot always judge the weather correctly and school may be in session some inclement days when children living at a distance from the school should remain at home. The parents will have to use their judgment as that of the superintendent is not infallible.

We had a smaller entering class in September so grade two was also assigned to Miss Brown to make the teaching loads as nearly even as possible. Grades seven and eight are somewhat crowded but not to the extent to demand another teacher.

The teaching situation is just as acute this year as it was last. We have been fortunate to retain good teachers and to secure excellent new ones. It was with deep regret that we relinquished Mrs. Anne Tighe owing to ill health. She took a great interest in her school and even helped to plan and carry out the graduation last

June while still too ill to be in school. Mrs. Edna R. Ordway, who had been teaching in our Union at North Madbury, replaced Miss Elsie Hachey, who secured a position near her home. Mrs. Helen Hennessey comes to grades seven and eight from a fine position in Massachusetts, which she had to relinquish when she became the wife of Principal Thomas Hennessey of the Chandler School, Somersworth.

The Wentworth Bus Lines is giving you good service in transportation. We are all trying to abide by the requests of the ODT and OPA to eliminate unnecessary stops and bus travel.

Miss Margaret Thomas is again acting as matron in charge of the preparation and serving of the hot lunch. We wish to thank those citizens who have contributed apples, onions, potatoes and other vegetables. The District owns several dozen quart jars which we should like to get filled again next summer. The War Food Administration allows us to purchase milk and sell it to the pupils for two cents per half pint bottle. The distributor is paid four cents, the WFA paying the balance. The WFA also allows a small rebate for lunches the basis of which are certain approved abundant foods purchased locally.

The schools have lost no time in scrap drives or other war time activities, although they are doing good work in collecting tin and paper. In the fall they helped gather milk weed pods used in making Mae West jackets for the sailors. The Junior Red Cross under Miss Hachey functioned well last year and Mrs. Bragg is continuing the good work. The pupils have been consistent buyers of war savings stamps and bonds. Between the opening of schools in September and the Christmas vacation the value of such purchases was over seven hundred dollars.

Your high school pupils are distributed as follows: At Dover, 8 in Grade 12; 13 in Grade 11; 15 in Grade 10 and 15 in Grade 9. At Berwick Academy, 3 in Grade 11; 2 in Grade 10 and 1 in Grade 9. The rate of tuition at Dover is \$107.46 and at Berwick Academy \$100.

St. Joseph's Parochial School reports an enrollment of 110 as of September which compares with 113 last year.

Your attention is again called to the report of your nurse. Notices of defects are sent to parents and personal visits made. However, there are still too many defects ignored, especially those relating to teeth.

The usual presentation of medals by the William Martel Post of the American Legion was made at the June graduation. Charles Drake received the award for the boys and Elizabeth Hamilton for the girls. The graduating class presented the school with a service flag and Nutter's Drug Store a United States flag. Both of these flags are now flying in the main hallway of the school.

Few teachers' meetings have been held but your teachers attended the meeting of the New Hampshire Teachers' Association at Manchester. The superintendent attended a very fine meeting of the American Association of School Administrators held in New York last February. He planned to attend a similar meeting this year but the meeting has been cancelled to comply with the wishes of the ODT.

Our fine auditorium has had its windows screened on the inside and is in constant use for volley and basket ball. We are only organized as a grammar school and only inter mural games are sanctioned.

We are looking forward to the time when we can install a projector for visual education. Such machines should soon be made available, we hope through the war or Navy departments when the war is over. They can be purchased now under school priorities.

Your school has not felt the pinch of war. Supplies and books have been adequate although some books

ordered in September were not delivered until December, owing to the paper shortage. Schools are still the nation's biggest business and after the war needs are met their wants must be supplied. We must continue to keep our faith in the public school system and all strive to make it better. We have appreciated the patience and cooperation of the citizens of Rollinsford during these difficult years.
