Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Lower Hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building on Collins Street, on Tuesday, March 12, 1963 at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, and to act upon the following articles:

Article 1. To elect by Non-Partisan Ballot: a Town Clerk; One Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a Term of Three (3) Years; a Town Treasurer; a Collector of Taxes; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; Three (3) Constables; One member of the Budget Committee for a Term of Three (3) Years; One member of the Park Commission for a Term of Three (3) Years; a Road Agent; and any other Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the Protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highways and Bridges, for Support of the Town Poor and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Board of Selectmen to borrow money in Anticipation of Taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

Article 4. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the following Special Appropriations: Cross Beach Special - \$160.00; Highway Special Construction - \$195.93; Veterans' Memorial Park Special - \$400.00; Causeway Bridge Special - \$2,960.21; New Lands Special - \$3,000.00; Sidewalk Construction - \$903.20 and Resident Physician - \$1,500.00.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town Officials and Employees.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Town Manager Plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated.

Article 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 (Six Thousand Dollars) to be used for the salary and expenses of the Town Manager, in the event that the Town votes favorably to adopt the Town Manager Plan as provided by Article 6.

Approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to obtain by purchase or by eminent domain proceedings the necessary land to layout a highway to Cross Beach, so-called, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 (One Thousand Dollars) for said purpose.

Approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 9. Upon petition by Bruce G. Brown and 13 others: To see if the Town will vote to have a Three (3) man committee appointed by the Selectmen, to study the possibility of obtaining by gift or other means, the various cemeteries within the Town of Seabrook now not owned by said Town. This article is not intended to mean the individual lots within these cemeteries.

Said committee to report its findings at the next Annual Town Meeting.

Article 10. Upon petition by Manford H. Doucette and 13 others: To see if the Town will install a street light on Pole No. 718 located on True Road, Seabrook.

Article 11. Upon petition by Walter J. Griffin and 12 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-four Dollars (\$44.00) to install and maintain a street light at the intersection of Methuen Street and Atlantic Ave.

Approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 12. Upon petition by Edward J. Hess and 12 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-four (\$44) Dollars to maintain a street light on Pole No. 1095 located on Pine Street.

Approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 13. Upon petition by Charles H. Felch and 11 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44.00 to install and maintain a street light on Pole No. 51J located on Railroad Avenue.

Approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 14. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

Article 15. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1961 and December 31, 1962, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$14,924.76 in 1962.

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended Dec. 31, 1962, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$9,123.30, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$3,571.23, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$12,694.53.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1962, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1962, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1962, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made up from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$75.24, from \$43,679.97 to \$43,604.73, in 1962, as shown herewith:
