## Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Stark Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current expenses.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Election and Registration expenses.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Insurance.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100 for Police Department expenses.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for Fire Expenses of the Town.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for:

(a) General Expenses of the Highway Dept.

(b) Snow Removal

(c) Maintenance of Tarred Roads

(d) Town Maintenance

(e) Town Dump

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$348.06 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$2,320.38.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

11. To see what the Town will vote to raise for Town Poor.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library purposes.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Interest charges for the ensuing year.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote

to raise for upkeep of cemeteries.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$570 for Street Lights for the ensuing year.

16. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount of Two Percent for payment of taxes, if paid within ten days after tax bill has been presented.

17. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to appoint the Road Agent.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$62.77 for the White Mountains Region Association,

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100 for White Pine Blister Rust Control program.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the Selectmen's Salary \$50.00 (each). This has been recommended by the Advisory Committee.

21. To see if the Town will vote to give Tax free for three years to people building new Homes.

22. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$15,000 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V road within the Town: No. 65, North Road, from junction with No. 51, North Road in Stark Village to junction with No. 41, Christine Lake Road, in Percy Village, about 2.06 miles in length, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the town of Stark.

23. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

## SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

Fifty-seven students had scalp and hair inspection during the first week of school and were weighed and measured.

Fifty-four vision and fifty-seven hearing tests were given by the school nurse early in the fall. Findings:

Vision Defects—3 (2 corrected by Sight Conservation Program, 1 privately); Hearing Defects—3 (2 had follow-up privately, 1 received hearing aid through Crippled Children's Service).

In October 53 students and two teachers participated in the new tuberculin testing program, The Heaf Test, which was administered by Dr. William Prince, of the Bureau of Communicable Disease Control. The one positive reactor had follow-up by Dr. Kerr at a Whitefield, N. H., clinic.

I regret that we were not able to have any dental inspections this year. Probably this year's physicals will show the sad results.

Three polio clinics were conducted this year, two in Groveton and one in Stark. Nineteen inoculations were administered. The school children are very well immunized against this disease now. Very few parents refused to grant permission for this important protection.

Three Triple Toxoid Clinics were conducted in the spring. Nineteen were immunized.

The Krause Webber Test was given to 55 students. Results showed that the greater majority passed this test for physical fitness.

Physical examinations were conducted at the town hall by Robert Hinkley, M. D., assisted by Eleanor Kenney, R. N., State Public Health Nurse and the school nurse. Fifty-one students were examined. Findings were as follows:

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS 1961-1962

### To the School Board and Citizens of Stark:

I herewith submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools. Such a report calls for the condition of the buildings, and other financial and statistical information which will present a true picture of the school situation. Most of this data is included in the following pages.

The Stark building was painted during the past year and certain other repairs were made so that this building is in excellent shape. The Crystal building needs a few minor repairs which will, no doubt, be made before the year is ended. Grounds at both buildings would be greatly improved if black surfacing could be laid on the driveways and in the immediate vicinity of the doorways. However, funds have not been found to be available for these projects.

Academically both schools are doing very well. An excellent replacement was found for Mrs. Whitcher in Mrs. Natalie Lenno. Since the number of children is only eleven they do have the benefit of individual instruction. At the Stark building Mrs. Martin and Mrs. Jones have continued their fine instruction. The best evidence of this is the continuing favorable showing

that the young people make when they go on to high school.

There has been no loss of time but there has been some confusion with the changeover in the ownership of the bus. It is quite probable that the transportation for next year will be put up for bid. Interested parties should contact the School Board or this office.

The result of the vote at the last annual meeting showed plainly that the voters of the district wished to maintain two separate buildings. The Board members should be commended for the excellent schools that they have provided for the children of both communities.
