# Town Warrant

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
  - (e) Town Hall and other Buildings.
  - (f) Damage and Legal Expenses.
  - (g) Health Department.
  - (h) Town Dump.
  - (i) Vital Statistics.
  - (j) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.
  - (l) Interest on Bonds.
  - (m) County Tax.
  - (n) Payment on Bonds.
  - (o) Civil Defense.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of Cemeteries.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise one thousand four hundred dollars (\$1,400.00) for street lighting.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Maintenance.
8. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town road maintenance.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
10. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$92.42 to the White Mountain Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages for the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and otherwise advertising and publicizing the North Country Area in cooperation with immediately surrounding towns.
14. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-partisan ballot.
15. To choose by Non-partisan ballot the following town officers:
  - (a) Town Clerk.
  - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
  - (c) Town Treasurer.
  - (d) Three Road Agents.
  - (e) One or more Auditors.
  - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
  - (g) One or more Sextons.

(h) Overseer of Poor.

(i) Trustee of Trust Fund.

(j) One Library Trustee for three ensuing years.

To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with such other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the school district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 in addition to the amount already raised and appropriated for the current school year for the payment of unanticipated increases in the cost of supplies, tuition, transportation and repairs, and that this amount be made available to the School Board prior to the end of the current school year.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# Superintendent's Report

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To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District  
of Stewartstown:

## Introduction

A year ago at this time the attention of many of us was focused upon the developments taking place in the General Court which had to do with education. On the one side was the possible passage of several proposed measures which was going to affect quite markedly the administration of our schools as well as substantially increase the cost of their operation. On the other side was the possible relief, to some extent, of the tax burden on the property owner through increasing by some means the financial support to the local school districts from the state level.

With the legislative session now over, an examination of the action taken by our Lawmakers reveals that education fared surprisingly well. Such provisions as increasing the borrowing capacity to finance urgently needed building programs to provide for larger enrollments, and for help from the State in the retirement of the bonds issued for this purpose, will be of great assistance in meeting mounting constructional costs. And the increase in the amount of funds made available from the state level for general aid to the local districts, also, together with the greatly improved formula used in determining their distribution, is going to help very materially in maintaining high educational standards.

## Teachers

With the shortage of teachers becoming more acute yearly, we are indeed fortunate to have veteran teachers in all positions. Mrs. Dorothy E. Blodgett, a graduate of Gorham Teachers College in Maine and who has had many years of experience in this area, has been employed to teach Grades 3-4-5 at the West Stewartstown School. Principal Velma H. Gray and Cleora M. Richardson teach the Grade Groups 6-7-8 and 1-2 respectively at this same school. On the East Side of town Pauline E. Keach teaches Grades 1-4 at the Hollow School and Claire G. Owen teaches Grades 5-8 at the Cedar Brook School.



### School Nurse — Health

With the additional services being rendered each successive year to help pupils more efficiently maintain that state of good health so essential to a happy and successful overall school life, the magnitude and importance of work done by our school nurse, Mrs. Ethel Sturgis, becomes more and more apparent. As is known, polio immunizations have been given to the primary grades and are now available to all children, ages 1-15 inclusive; as well as for pregnant mothers at school clinics. Arrangements have been made, also to give a complete physical examination to every pupil every four years in addition to the one now received at the pre-school clinic.

With the fine response received from parents and pupils to the advantages of the dental clinic conducted over a period of many years at Dr. Dickson's it is regrettable that due to the increased cost with the change in offices it seemed best to discontinue this important work. It is hoped very much that something may be worked out whereby this valuable service may be resumed.

### Buildings — Equipment

In keeping with the policy of providing and maintaining facilities and equipment which will be conducive to effective learning and teaching, continued improvements and repairs have been made during the past year. A new celotex ceiling put up in the classroom at the Cedar Brook School furnishes additional insulation and makes the room much more attractive. The installation of a sink with running water in each of the classrooms on the first floor at the West Stewartstown School assists very materially in teaching Art in these rooms. The building of a cupboard, too, between the range and sink in the School Lunch Quarters at the same building provides much needed storage space for materials and equipment used in conducting the program. And such miscellaneous repairs as have been made and painting that has been done in several places in all the buildings presently used have kept them in a good state of general maintenance.

The replacing of the old wood burning stoves in the rural schools with new oil burning heaters has improved greatly the heating of these buildings. With the installation of these automatic thermostatically controlled heating units, greater comfort is enjoyed by the teacher and pupils and conditions which contribute materially to better school work and health are provided.

Auditors

Due to the relatively long length of time that the present coal stoker has been in use at the West Stewartstown School, and with a new boiler installed there last year, advantage was taken of the opportunity to buy another little used machine in good condition of the same make at a very reasonable price. With the difficulty oftentimes experienced in obtaining replacements for broken and worn out parts, as well as to get delivery of new equipment when urgently needed, it was believed best to have this second stoker on hand in case of an emergency.

### School Lunch Program

The marked increase in the number of pupils now taking advantage of the School Lunch Program at the West Stewartstown School, over that when the serving of meals was begun there some over a year ago, bespeaks the success of this program. Much credit is due the operator, Mrs. Eva Day, for the stellar work done in promoting the growth of this school activity, which contributes much to the building of good morale and the overall happy and healthful life of the school.

### Notes on the Budget

The School Board's Budget for 1956-57 is \$41,675.00 in comparison to the \$37,656.00 raised and appropriated by the district to operate the schools for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$9,500.00 from State Aid, which leaves a balance of \$32,175.00 to be raised through taxes by the town as compared to \$33,582.00 for this year. It might be well to point out here, however, that the amount voted for the budget at any annual district meeting may be increased by action taken under special articles in the warrant, and that what is finally raised by taxation is determined by the overall sum voted less what State Aid is received. For the most part the increase in the budget for next year is explained by provisions for salary increases and for additional cost of supplies, fuel, repairs, transportation, and tuition.

The Budget of the Budget Committee is \$42,675.00, which is \$1000.00 more than that submitted by the School Board. This additional amount is included to defray expenses incurred for the current year over and above those anticipated due mainly to increased cost for supplies, repairs and tuition. As will be noted in a copy of the warrant at the beginning of this report, the School Board has included a special article for the purpose of raising these additional

funds needed to meet the financial obligations of the district between now and June 30.

Detailed information in the budget breakdown will be found on subsequent pages in this report.

#### **Enrollment and Attendance**

As has been the case during the past two years, the enrollment of pupils in our schools continues to grow as there are 117 enrolled at the present time as compared to 113, 110, and 97 for the three respective preceding years. A breakdown of the present enrollment shows there are 73 at the West Stewartstown School, 18 at the Cedar Brook School, and 26 at the Hollow School. The average percentage of attendance at these schools during the past year in the same order as listed was 96.21, 94.97, and 94.91, while the average number of tardiness per pupil for the period was 1.35, .00, and .32.

#### **Tuition Pupils**

For the first time in three years the number of pupils enrolled in schools outside the district is larger than that of the previous year, as there are now 38 as compared to 31 last year, 38 the previous year, and 42 the preceding year. A breakdown of the number of pupils for which the district is paying tuition for the current year shows that it is equally divided between Colebrook Academy and Canaan High School, Vermont.

#### **Conclusion**

I wish again to thank the members of the School Board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help and cooperation received in our work together to keep standards high in our schools.
