STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Westmoreland in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Westmoreland on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee under the authority of the Municipal Budget Act. This budget may be considered item by item or as a whole but may not be increased more than ten percent in any item as a whole.

4. To hear the report of Agents and Auditors and take any action relating thereto.

5. *To see whether the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$652.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of Elliot Community Hospital.

6. To see if the Town will vote for snow removal and sanding on either Class V or Class VI roads or take any other action relating thereto to raise and appropriate money for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote for Class IV and Class V roads; construction, reconstruction or betterment aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$695.48 the State to contribute \$4,636.56.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to what is required by law for highways and bridges.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Lewis P. Johnson to be known as the Lawrence J. Johnson Trust Fund for cemetery. The \$200.00 to be held in trust.

The income from the Trust to be used solely for the perpetual care of the Lawrence J. Johnson and Mary Woodward Johnson cemetery Lot No. 4 in the East Westmoreland Cemetery.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be held in Trust. The income to be used solely for the perpetual care of the Howard M. and Doris D. Barkley cemetery Lot No. 32 in the East Westmoreland Cemetery.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be held in trust. The income to be used solely for the perpetual care of the Charles A. and Delia B. Burdick cemetery Lot No. 31 in the East Westmoreland Cemetery.

12. *To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or borrow the sum of \$2,500.00 to put a permanent top on Mt. Gilboa Road from the railroad crossing to Route 12.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 as requested by the State for white pine blister rust control.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$183.42 (six cents per \$1,000.00 of the Town's equalized valuation) to the Monadnock Region Association, an Agency to advertise, promote and preserve the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 towns in the Monadnock Region.

15. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

16. To vote on the question "Shall Sweepstake tickets be sold in this City or Town?"

17. To see what disposition the Town will vote to make of the income of the Jotham Lord Fund.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the support of the Library.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for the upkeep of the cemeteries.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the maintenance of the Police Department.

21. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to Gates and Bars the cross road leading from Route 63 to the Ma-Adams Road or take any other action relating thereto.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to close subject to Gates and Bars the road starting at its junction on Route 63 near the Walter Reynolds camp westerly to the Old County Road at the Hunt Place.

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to petition the Superior Court to close subject to Gates and Bars the following County Roads in the Town of Westmoreland. Road No. 1, the Reynolds Road so called starting at the Corner School House running southerly past the Reynolds Place and the Barrows Place to the Chesterfield Town Line. Road No. 2, the Hunt Road so called starting at a stone bound on Poocham Road running southerly past the Hunt Place to the residence of Herbert Sachs.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to close subject to Gates and Bars the road leading from the River Road just north of the Donald Blood barn easterly to its junction with the so called Reynolds Road.

25. *To see if the Town of Westmoreland will deed back to Roscoe R. Perry that land known as the Barker Park (or Barker Grove) which was deeded to the Town in 1925 by Samira E. Perry and said Roscoe R. Perry with the hope that said land would offer a picnic area particularly for Old Home Day. Due to changing times the lot has gone unused for many years.

26. *To see if the Town will vote to grant permission to the Westmoreland Athletic Association, Inc., a non-profit, charitable organization, to play basketball in the Town Hall according to rules and regulations as mutually agreed upon by the Association and the Selectmen of the year 1962 for an indefinite period to be terminated by a majority vote of the voters present at an annual Town meeting or do anything in relation thereto.

27. *To see if the Town will vote to erect acoustic tile on the dining room ceiling in order to make dinners and public functions more attractive to visitors and raise and appropriate \$600.00 for this purpose.

28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

29. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

TOWN MEETING

March 12, 1963

The meeting was called to order at 9:20 A.M. by Moderator Paul D. King who read the Warrant. A motion was made, seconded and voted that Article No. 1 remain open for the duration of the meeting. The Moderator then declared the polls open.

There being very few people present, no other action on the Warrant was taken until 10:05 A.M. after more people had assembled. The polls and meeting were declared closed at 6:30 P.M. by the Moderator.

It was moved, seconded and voted that Articles No. 2 and No. 3 be taken up together, item by item.

It was then voted to raise and appropriate the following sums:

Article No. 4. It was voted to accept the reports of agents and auditors as printed in the Town Report.

Article No. 5 Eleanor Clement moved that the amount of \$200.00 as called for in the proposed Budget be increased to \$587.00. The motion was seconded and defeated by an overwhelming majority in a voice vote.

Articles No. 6, No. 7, and No. 8 were all discussed and approved under Articles No. 2 and No. 3.

Article No. 9. Mr. A. F. Hudson moved that this Article be approved. Seconded and approved by voice vote.

Article No. 10. It was voted to use the income from the Jotham Lord Fund for the support of the Library.

Articles No. 11 and No. 12. These were covered under Articles No. 2 and No. 3.

Article No. 13. This Article was declared by the Moderator to be illegal as written. After some discussion it was changed to read as follows, and approved.

“To see if the Town will vote to grant permission to the Westmoreland Athletic Association, Inc., a non-profit, charita-

ble organization, to play basketball in the Town Hall according to the rules and regulations as mutually agreed upon by the Association and the Selectmen of the year 1962 until the next annual Town Meeting.

Article No. 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 as requested by the State for White Pine Blister Control.

Article No. 15. It was voted to accept the sum of \$150.00 from Viola V. Tuttle as a Trust Fund, the income from same to be used for the care of Herbert S. and Julia Hall burial lot in South Village Cemetery.

Article No. 16. It was voted to accept the sum of \$50.00 from John Kusnick as a Trust Fund, the income from same to be used for the care of his cemetery lot No. 15B in the East Westmoreland Cemetery.

Article No. 17. Mrs. Robert Ball moved to amend this Article to read \$3,100.00 which she said was a "firm offer" made by the appraisal firm under consideration. This was approved. A ballot vote was then called for on the amended Article. There were 102 ballots cast: yes 18, no 84. The Article was therefore rejected.

Article No. 18. This Article was included in the Budget and \$165.00 was voted to be raised and appropriated.

Article No. 19. It was voted to take no action on this Article as the Steam Town operated at this place has been discontinued. It was pointed out that the dust conditions could be remedied by the application of calcium chloride.

Article No. 20. After considerable discussion it was voted to raise and appropriate \$200.00 in addition to the \$100.00 called for in the Budget.

Article No. 21. This Article brought out a lot of discussion and comment. Constable Blanchard gave a detailed explanation of the reason for this request. It was then moved and seconded that no action be taken. A ballot vote was called for, 84 ballots were cast: Yes (no action) 45, no 39.

A motion was then made and seconded to reconsider this Article. A ballot vote was called for, 95 ballots cast: Yes 53, No 42.

A ballot vote was then called for to vote on the Article as printed. 97 ballots were cast: Yes 50, No 47. Therefore the purchase of the equipment was approved.

Article No. 22. It was moved, seconded and voted to change the wording of this Article to read in part "to purchase a new or used road grader". A ballot vote was called for. 80 ballots were cast: Yes 55, No 25. The purchase of a grader was therefore approved.

Article No. 23. It was voted to give the Selectmen the authority requested in this Article.

Article No. 24. It was voted to give the Selectmen the authority requested in this Article.

Article No. 25. Mr. Talbot Hood moved that the Town of Westmoreland go on record requesting the Selectmen to adjourn all Annual Town Meetings until seven (7:00) o'clock in the evening of the same day. Defeated by show of hands vote: 33 No, 24 Yes.

Mr. Hood then moved that the Selectmen prepare a legally acceptable ballot for use during regular voting hours, in which all voters may decide in favor of or against future Town Meetings to be held at night This motion was seconded by Mrs. A. F. Hudson and approved by a voice vote.

Mr. David Adams asked to see if the Town will vote to ratify, approve and confirm the action of its Fire Department in joining our Town to the Southwestern New Hampshire District Fire Mutual Aid System in 1958, in agreeing that our Fire Department may give and receive outside aid as provided by Chapter 154 N.H.R.S.A. as amended. This was approved by voice vote.

Mr. Wesley Staples moved that the Town elect one Road Agent at the next Annual Meeting. The motion was seconded but defeated by a voice vote.

Mrs. Eleanor Hood moved that the Town go on record as in favor of a State Sales Tax for aid to education. This motion was seconded and approved by voice vote

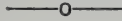

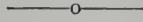

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their efforts and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump—its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with “Smokey the Bear” and “Keep New Hampshire Green” and growing in 1964.

Under Articles No. 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 John H. Terry, Jr. was nominated for Moderator Fenn B. Newell was nominated for Clerk; Richard D. Rhodes, Sr. was nominated for Commissioner for three years; Lois M. Delano was nominated for Treasurer and Theodora A. Gerould was nominated for Auditor.

In each case it was voted that the nominations be closed. The Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot bearing the names of John H. Terry, Jr. for Moderator; Richard D. Rhodes, Sr. for Commissioner for three years; Lois M. Delano for Treasurer; and Theodora A. Gerould for Auditor. The Clerk cast one ballot for each and they were declared unanimously elected.

The Moderator was instructed to cast one ballot bearing the name of Fenn B. Newell for Clerk. The Moderator did so and Fenn B. Newell was declared unanimously elected Clerk.

Article No. 6. It was voted to accept the report of the Auditor as printed on Page 57 of the Town Report for 1962.

Mr. Lesure reported for the Committee on the matter of a sidewalk from South Village Route No. 63 to the school. It was the Committee's opinion that the Village District should not get into this as it obviously is a Town project. It was also reported that some improvement there would be made this year.

It was also reported that the Resuscitator and four tanks of oxygen had been purchased with funds raised through the efforts of the Firemen, Mrs. R. D. Ball and Mr. Everett Warner, and was now the property of the Town and available at the Fire House. It was voted that the Clerk thank Mr. Warner for the painting he donated for this project.

Article No. 7. It was voted to authorize the commissioners to borrow money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.

Article No. 8. It was moved, seconded and voted that any funds remaining in the Treasury after all obligations are paid, be placed in a Savings Account until such time as needed for future projects.

A rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Gertrude Makinen for her valuable work as Commissioner since the formation of this organization in 1957.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:45 P.M.

2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officers, and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To choose agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
5. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.
6. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.
7. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Walpole School District.
8. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the

appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to enter into a long term contract with the School District of Keene, under the terms of RSA 194:21-a, and any amendments thereto, and to authorize the Westmoreland School Board to negotiate such a contract for a period not to exceed twenty years.

10. To see if the district will create an area school district planning committee and to elect members thereof or determine that they shall be appointed by the moderator.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SCHOOL MEETING

March 16, 1963

Agreeable to the warrant, the legal voters having met at the time and place mentioned in the warrant, the meeting was called to order by the moderator, John H. Terry, Jr., at 2 P.M. The warrant was read and the following articles were acted upon:

Article 1. Article 1 was left open until the polls close at 7 P.M.

Article 2. Robert Moore made the motion which was seconded and voted that this article be taken up with Article 8, as it is included in the budget.

Article 3. Mrs. Tal Hood made the motion which was seconded and voted that the report of the auditors, as printed in the Town Report, be accepted. Robert Moore made the motion which was seconded and voted that the balance of Article 3 and Article 4 be held over and taken up under Article 10.

Article 5. Mrs. Paul Hatt made the motion which was seconded and voted that the district authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

Article 6. Thomas Barrett made the motion which was seconded and voted that the school board be authorized to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.

Article 7. Robert Cox made the motion which was seconded and voted that the school board be authorized to negotiate a tuition contract with the Walpole School District.

Article 8. Mrs. Robert Ball made the motion which was seconded and voted that the district vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85,911.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriations of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the

selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 9. Robert Moore made the motion which was seconded that no action be taken on this article. (All other towns in the supervisory union have taken no action under this article. (Supt. Keach read from the law book, explaining more about the article.)

Articles 3, 4 and 10. Carl Barrett, Robert Cox and Richard Larson were the members of the committee appointed by the moderator to investigate the comparative savings of exclusive tuition contracts and transportation, in excess of one year, with the Keene and Walpole School Districts, and report at the next annual meeting.

Carl Barrett made the motion which was seconded that the Westmoreland School District hereby authorize the Westmoreland School Board to negotiate an exclusive long term high school tuition with the Union School District of Keene, N. H. Such contract is envisioned by this meeting to be ten years more or less as the Westmoreland School Board is able to favorably negotiate.

Mrs. Ball made the amendment that the words, "including grades 7 through 12", be used instead of "high school." After a discussion, this amendment was withdrawn.

The original motion was then voted on by voice vote. The ayes had it. Motion carried.

Mrs. Hood then made the motion which was seconded that the school board prepare charts showing comparative costs and advantages of educating the 7th and 8th grades in or out of town and to have it ready for the next annual school meeting.

This was amended to read "information" rather than "charts".

The motion was then voted, that the school board prepare information showing comparative costs and advantages of educating the 7th and 8th grades in or out of town and to have it ready for the next annual school meeting.

By a voice vote, the ayes were in the affirmative. Motion carried.

Thomas Barrett, wishing to get the consensus of opinion, made the motion which was seconded that the school board be given the authority to negotiate a tuition contract for the 7th and 8th grades with Keene or Walpole, if necessary.

By a voice vote, the no votes were in the affirmative. Motion not carried. The voters expressed their opinions that the school board already had this authority.

Carl Barrett made the motion which was seconded that the school board be excused from attending cooperative meetings in Walpole.

By a voice vote, the ayes were in the affirmative. Motion carried.

The meeting was declared adjourned at 7:00 P.M.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Westmoreland :

I herewith submit my annual report as your Superintendent of Schools :

The enrollment forecast for September, 1963 was 160 pupils. Our actual enrollment was 149 pupils, and the January 20, 1964 enrollment is 152.

Westmoreland enrollment is subject to rapid changes; for example, there has been an increase of ten pupils since December 1, 1963 to January 20, 1964. These rapid changes make it extremely difficult to accurately determine whether or not our present building can provide adequate facilities for all the pupils in the near future. Based on present enrollment and the school census, we will need additional space for one grade in September, 1965 or plan to tuition grade eight pupils.

From the standpoint of providing a better educational opportunity, tuition is the answer. It is also more expensive than adding a room or rooms and hiring additional teaching staff. It is up to the voters to decide between better educational opportunity for their children and the money that can be saved.

An article in this year's school district warrant requires an important decision by the voters. If the voters vote in favor of the article, they are authorizing the school board to negotiate a twenty-year tuition contract with the Keene School District.

Keene High School will be the high school where Westmoreland pupils must go if they are to have their tuition paid by the district.

We have been having considerable trouble with the furnace. It is a complicated device that does an excellent job when all the components are operating. However, any small difficulty activates electronic safety devices that automatically stop the complete operation. It is hoped that the problem will be solved in the near future.

Westmoreland teachers participated with the other teachers

of Supervisory Union No. 60 in a workshop held at the Walpole High School on September 3, 4 and 5. The teachers studied and discussed ways and means of how to keep the public better informed in regard to what is being done in the schools.

Last year was our first year of using homogeneous grouping for our reading classes. Our achievement test results showed improvement and we expect still more improvement in reading as we continue the program.

This year we are also using ungraded groups in the mathematics classes and in addition are teaching so-called "modern mathematics" at all levels. This approach places more emphasis on the "Why" and recognizes the importance of understanding mathematical concepts and processes.

The budget submitted at the annual meeting last March estimated no end-of-the year balance. The actual balance was \$2,906.57. In addition, foundation aid was increased from an estimated \$8,511.00 to \$9,658.49, an increase of \$1,147.49. This amount with the balance gave a total of \$4,054.06 which was used to reduce the amount to be raised by taxes from \$74,520.68 to \$70,465.50.

We are fortunate to be able to present a budget that is slightly lower than the one presented last year. It is also noteworthy that the amount to be raised by taxes is some \$4,000 less than last year.
