School Report.

The closing of the school year entitles the tax payers of Belmont to some knowledge of the progress of our schools. A liberal amount of money was appropriated for the support of schools during the past year, (\$500 more than the law requires) and the result was an increase of seven weeks in the length of schools, and a balance of \$115.02 on hand.

We have, in some instances, paid higher wages than ever before, which has enabled us to secure good teachers. It was thought necessary, owing to changes in the Bennett and Farrarville districts, to discontinue the school in the former, and have a school in the latter district during the fall and winter terms, which we think was an advantage.

We have reason to believe that our schools are in a prosperous condition, though the average daily attendance has not been as creditable to the parents as we might reasonably expect and hope for.

As in former years it was the purpose to have all the schools of equal length. Wherever we have varied from this rule it was on account of local causes which seemed to justify such a course.

Whole number of scholars in town not under five years of age who have attended district schools not less than two weeks 206.

Number of children in town between the ages of five and fifteen as reported by the selectmen, males 88, females 70, total 158.

For a statement of receipts and expenditures, attention is called to the report of the treasurer of the school board. Amount paid for teachers' wages and incidentals, \$1653.91; for school books, \$117.51.

DETAILED REPORT.

No. 1, LADD HILL—First term taught by Miss Eudora B. Kimball. Miss Kimball taught in this district last year, and succeeded so well that it was thought best to secure her services again. The school was successful.

Second term taught by Miss Mary L. Chase. Miss Chase had never taught before, but appeared quite at home in her new vocation. This school was orderly and made good progress. PLUMMER.

NO. 2, UNION—Spring term, Mrs. M. L. Randall, teacher. We believe that Mrs. Randall's work in this school, as in previous terms in town, gives much credit to her as a teacher. Good order always prevails in her school-room.

Fall and winter term taught by Emma S. Page. Miss Page is a good scholar, and has had experience in teaching.

Good progress was made in nearly every study. A little more effort on the part of scholars and co-operation with the teacher is needed in this school.

GILE.

No. 3, JAMESTOWN—Spring term taught by Charlotte A. Cushing. This was Miss Cushing's first experience as a teacher, but she proved herself well adapted to the work, and a very successful term of school rewarded her efforts.

Fall and winter terms taught by Hattie E. Morse. Miss Morse came here a stranger, though well recommended. Her interest in this school and the good result of her labor, prove that we need her future service, and more teachers like her.

*No. 5, VILLAGE—Grammar, taught by W. D. Ingalls, a teacher of experience. Good progress was made and the school at all times presented a neat and orderly appearance.

*INTERMEDIATE—Mrs. Isaiah Piper, teacher. We were very fortunate in securing the services of so efficient a teacher.

Thoroughness and good practical work was the main point of this school, and it was a success in every particular.

*PRIMARY—Taught by Miss Mabel Glines, a student of the State Normal school. Miss Glines proved to be especially adapted to work among children, and the utmost harmony existed between teacher and pupils. Excellent progress was made and a school profitable to both parents and scholars is the result.

INGALLS.

No. 7, BENNETT—There was but one term during the year, which was taught by Miss Susie M. Eaton. Miss Eaton was numbered among our most successful teachers last year, and we made no mistake in placing her in this school. Order and progress good. PLUMMER.

No. 9, PROVINCE ROAD—This school was in charge of Miss Eva E. Lamprey. Miss Lamprey had previously taught here. From what was known of her and the school, we had great hopes of success. As the work progressed it was evident that our expectations would be realized. Without hesitation or mental reserve we express the opinion that the year's work was eminently successful.

P LUMMER.

NO. 11, FARRARVILLE—This school was taught by Miss Bamford, who as an earnest worker gained the respect of the scholars, consequently good advancement was made in all the classes. INGALLS.
