

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay town charges in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to put \$2,000.00 of the 1957 surplus into the Capital Reserve Fund.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on Class V highways and appropriate \$280.19 as the town's share.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$53.57 for the Lakes Region Association.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$50.00 for use of the Sanbornville dump.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for the Gafney Library in Sanbornville.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or trade the Tractor Plow.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a combination Grader and Loader and raise the sum of \$1,500.00 and authorize a withdrawal of \$4,650.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund to pay the balance.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue plowing private driveways at the end of this winter.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Everyone apparently fears fire but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in or near woodland. Official figures show that more than 98% of all forest fires results from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects are far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forest, the protection forest provides for game, and the supply of ground water. They upset the local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Yoru local warden and his deputies are doing an excellent job in trying to prevent this shameful waste, but they must have the cooperation of the public and this means YOU. Remember there are laws that cover the making of a camp fire, also the burning of rubbish or debris, and also the burning of brush whether this is on your land or land of other people, and to disobey these laws can cost you a great deal of money. So please see your local warden and he will tell you how to burn the rubbish, also when you can burn it, and also issue you a permit to do so if conditions are right.

In the "Keep America Green" program there is a story of two bad boys who cause most of our forest fires. The first one we call "I don't care", he is the person that builds a fire anywhere, never gets a permit to burn brush, or has a safe place for his home incinerator. He also is very careless with matches and cigarettes. The other one is called "I don't know any better" and the best way to describe him is he is a plain dunce. It is only with your help that these two bad actors are controlled. Their carelessness can be the cause of our valuable woodland being destroyed by fire. Even your homes can be burned by their carelessness.

It is up to you and you to report these two characters to your local forest warden whenever you see them operating. Remember it is with your cooperation that this shameful waste of timber and money can be stopped.

BROOKFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICT REPORT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Brookfield, N. H., qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 11th day of March, 1958, at One (1:00) O'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the voters of the Town of Brookfield, N. H. will vote an appropriation of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) each a year toward the transportation of High School pupils. Commencing the next School year 1958-1959.
- 10. To choose a Truant Officer and Enumerator for one year.

- 11. To see if the school district will vote to hereafter use a check-list for the election of its officers, beginning with the 1959 annual district meeting, and will adopt as its school check-list the Town check-list, as provided in RSA 197-12a, as inserted by laws of 1957, chapter 57.
- 12. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty one Dollars (\$21.00) to be used, in conjunction with funds to be raised and appropriated by other school districts in Supervisory Union No. 36, for the purpose of conducting a study of the feasibility of the formation and operation of a cooperative school district by not less than five of the seven districts involved, namely Brookfield, Effingham, Freedom, Madison, Ossipee, Tamworth and Wakefield. The above sum is based on \$3.00 per pupil, grades seven to twelve inclusive, according to the average daily membership of these grades for 1956-57. The use of this appropriation is contingent upon appropriations made on a similar basis by not less than five of the seven districts named above.
- 13. To elect three members of the cooperative school study committee to act in conjunction with the school board members.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting on this date.

The above comparison shows that the expenditure per elementary pupil exceeds that of the state average. The cost per pupil for the year 1955-56 was \$516.12. The cost per high school pupil is \$128.86 per pupil less than the state average. This is due largely because the state average cost includes transportation.

The tuition cost for the current year will exceed the amount appropriated by about \$1,200.00 due to a larger number of pupils than was anticipated at the time the budget was prepared.

Recently the school boards of Supervisory Union No. 36 becgan a study of the feasibility of forming a cooperative school district of the majority of the districts. This has been undertaken in view of the fact that several of the high schools which are attended by our pupils are crowded and there is no assurance that our boys and girls will be accepted as tuition pupils in the future. Such a cooperative organization may well offer important educational advantages to the children in this area. Reports of the study will be made to citizens of the school districts as progress is made.

The fine cooperation of the school board and citizens is gratefully acknowledged.
