

Record of Carroll County Convention

The Carroll County Convention met on January 10 in Division One of Representatives' Hall, agreeably to notice given by the Speaker, and organized, electing the following:

There being no further business, it was voted, on motion of Mr. Hoyt, of Sandwich, to adjourn subject to the call of the chair.

February 14, 1923.

A meeting of the Carroll County Convention, notice of which was given by the Speaker, was called to order by Chairman George A. Blanchard, ten members responding to call of the roll.

The Convention was addressed by the following in favor of the appropriation for the estimated budget of the Farm Bureau for the next two years:

February 23, 1923.

The Carroll County Convention met at the County Farm at Ossipee. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, and all responded except Mr. Hale of Wolfeboro, Mr. Currier of Conway and Mr. Willey of Brookfield. On motion of Mr. Hoyt, of Sandwich, that the delegation gather what information possible as to the requests of the County Commissioners and the Farm Bureau, the County Commissioners gave an estimate of the appropriations required for the ensuing two years.

Mr. Arthur Kenison, Clerk of Court, asked for certain changes in regard to the Clerk of Court's office.

Mr. Hoyt of Sandwich made a motion that the commissioners give, as soon as possible, an estimate of the probable cost of changes in the heating plant at the County Farm.

Meeting adjourned subject to call of the chair.

February 28, 1923.

The Carroll County Convention met in Division two of Representatives' Hall immediately after the morning session, called to order by the chairman. Eleven members answered the roll call.

On motion of Mr. Clow of Wolfeboro, the con-

vention adjourned subject to the call of the chairman.

March 6, 1923.

The Carroll County Convention was called to order at 7.15 p. m. by the chairman. Clarence Ela was chosen clerk pro tem. Eight members responded to roll call.

In answer to a question by Mr. Hoyt, Mr. Lockwood spoke on the appropriation asked by the Farm Bureau.

Messrs. Willey and Robinson spoke on extension work; Messrs. Lockwood and Smart on Farm Agent work; and Messrs. Clow, Chandler, and Forest, President of the Carroll County Farm Bureau, spoke on Farm Bureau work. Mr. Thomas inquired in regard to the Boys' and Girls' Club, and Mr. Chick spoke on this club work.

The meeting adjourned to meet March 7, at 3 p. m. CLARENCE ELA, Clerk pro tem.

March 7, 1923.

The Carroll County Convention was called to order by the chairman in Room 104, State House, at 3 p. m., nine members responding to call of the roll.

The convention was advised by County Commissioner Nathan O. Weeks in regard to the heating plant at the County Farm. Mr. Weeks, for the County Commissioners, recommended an appropriation of \$5,000 for next year, which they thought would cover the cost of a new boiler and piping throughout the house, and also to cement the floor and place steel ceiling overhead and brick walls where necessary, to

be made of second hand brick already on hand, if economical to use same as concrete wall if it appears to be less expensive. County Commissioner Samuel A. Hidden stated that the people they have heen talking with in regard to a new boiler claim that the present boiler burns far too much fuel, and although safe at present, is liable to be condemned at any time on account of its age. Mr. Hidden stated that in the opinion of people that have examined the present boiler, that a new one would use one-third less fuel. A new boiler such as necessary for the building was estimated by Mr. Hidden to cost about twelve hundred dollars.

Chairman Blanchard declared the convention in executive session at 5 p. m. Mr. Chick of Madison made a motion that we appropriate the sum of three thousand dollars for the year 1923 and a like sum for the year 1924 for the benefit of the Farm Bureau. It was seconded by Mr. Smart of Ossipee. Same was placed before the convention and motion carried.

Mr. Smart of Ossipee made a motion that we appropriate the sum of forty-seven thousand dollars for the year 1923, and a like sum for the year 1924, and from this amount the County Commissioners shall allow the Clerk of Court an amount not to exceed six hundred and fifty dollars out of the appropriation of the year 1923 for repairs and furniture at the office of the Clerk of Court. The motion was seconded by Mr. Chandler of Conway, and placed before the convention, and motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Hale of Walpole the Convention voted to adjourn, subject to call of the chair.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

To the Citizens of Carroll County:

In compliance with requirements of the State law, we hereby submit our annual report for the year ending December 31, 1924, with statement of the financial condition of the county, and reports of Treasurer, Superintendent of the Farm, Solicitor, Clerk of Courts, Sheriff and other officers.

During the past year we have continued the improvements at both Alms House and Court house by having had both places thoroughly painted inside and out, together with other necessary repairs. In November the water supply gave out at the Farm, which necessitates the building of a reservoir. This has already been begun. Cement and other materials have been purchased and excavation started and will be completed in the Spring. We have already paid bills, approximately, to the amount of \$800 and the estimated cost is \$2,500 for which we have no appropriation.

It will also be necessary to make extensive repairs at both barn and stable during the coming year.

The net debt as compared with last year's, has been reduced \$4,913 41.

We are glad to report that Mr. and Mrs. Mason are to continue as Superintendent and Matron of the Alms House, and wish to express our appreciation of their past services, and to thank all other employees engaged in the care of inmates, and of the Farm, also all County officers and Selectmen of the several towns for their assistance and support.

COUNTY SOLICITOR'S REPORT

To the County Commissioners:

At the May term, 1924, there were found three indictments for breaking and entering against three boys from Maine; one for bigamy and three for larceny of goods of the value of \$20.00 and upwards. Two of the boys from Maine, being out on parole, were delivered back to the Maine authorities and the other boy was given a sentence in our Industrial School. The larceny indictments against the other boys were continued for sentence, upon a plea of guilty, as the boys had been confined in jail for about six months, and this seemed adequate for their crime. The bigamy repondent was committed to the State Hospital for observation and upon the report that the man is not mentally responsible, he is still there and the case awaiting the May term in 1925.

At the October term, 1924, there were found six indictments for breaking and entering cottages against three men, and upon a plea of guilty, one was committed to the State Prison, one was committed to jail and the other given a suspended sentence. There was an indictment for non-support and the respondent was given a suspended sentence upon agreement to care for his family. There was an indictment for an attempt to commit rape and, after conference with all interested parties, on account of insufficient evidence it was disposed of by accepting a plea of guilty to an aggravated assault, with a suspended sentence.

During the spring of 1924 there was a wave of cottage breaking. Sheriff Leavitt and his deputies were quick to follow up the clews and after much hard work succeeded in apprehending the guilty ones and they were placed in jail and the wave stopped. I cannot commend to highly Sheriff Leavitt and his deputies for the very good work on this and many other cases during this year.

The violations of the liquor law have not been as frequent as some would have us believe. Here our officers have been very vigilent and dilligent in their efforts and many raids have taken place and fines imposed in our several Police Courts. I feel that we have the matter well in hand and that the law is slowly but surely being vindicated.

Your Solicitor has prosecuted a few cases of persons running cars while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

Quite a number of cases that formerly were disposed of in the Superior Court are now handled by our Police Courts and the result is that the law is swifter in its execution and the time of Superior Court is given over to its regular work.

I desire to commend the Sheriff and his several Deputies for their uniform kindness and sympathetic work given for the past two years.
