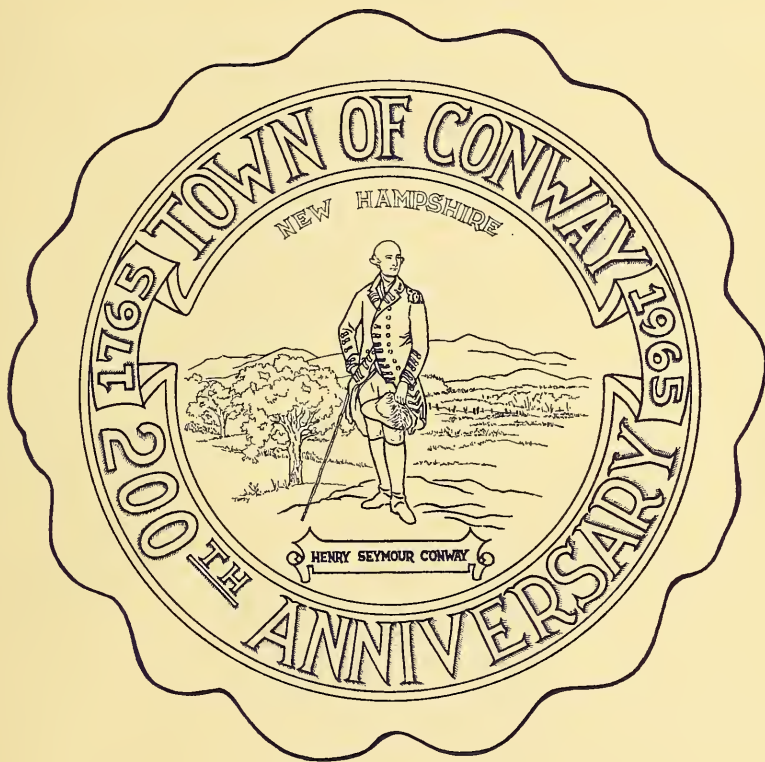

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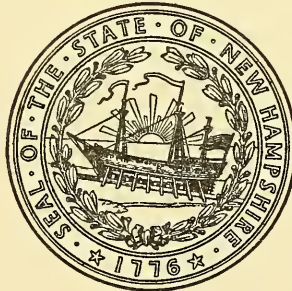

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of Carroll, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Conway Elementary School Auditorium at Conway, New Hampshire, March 9, 1965, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

- Section a. Town Officers' Salaries
- b. Town Officers' Expenses
 - c. Election and Registration Expenses
 - d. District Court Expenses
 - e. Expenses of Town Hall and other Town Buildings
 - f. Police Department
 - g. Fire Department
 - h. Insurance
 - i. Civil Defense
 - j. Office Expense
 - k. Health Department, including hospitals
 - l. Vital Statistics
 - m. Town Dump
 - n. Town Maintenance of Highways, summer and winter
 - o. Town Road Aid — (TRA)
 - p. Libraries
 - q. Town Poor
 - r. Old Age Assistance
 - s. Memorial Day
 - t. Soldiers' Aid
 - u. Parks and Playgrounds
 - v. Damages and Legal Expense, and Land Damage
 - w. F.I.C.A. (Social Security) Town's Share
 - x. Interest on Temporary Loans and Bonds
 - y. Class IV Urban (to apply against principal of bond issue)
 - z. Payment on Bond Issue
 - a-1 Perambulation of town lines
 - b-1 Blister Rust and Care of Trees
 - c-1 New Equipment
 - d-1 Capital Reserve for Survey of Streets and Tax Map
 - e-1 County Tax

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the town such sums of money as may be needed, such sums not to exceed the combined School, Town and County tax budget, in anticipation of taxes raised for Town, County and School purposes.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 48 as amended by Chapter 48-A: 1 through 48-A: 12, effective date Nov. 16, 1959 relative to minimum housing standards. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2055 to asphalt the Bartlett Road in 1965, agreeable to a petition signed by Francis X. Limmer and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000. to complete the second and final phase of the comprehensive plan for the Town of Conway. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000. said sum to be turned over to the Conway Bicentennial Corporation to be used to plan, organize, promote and produce a bicentennial celebration in 1965 for the Town of Conway. Agreeable to a petition signed by Barbara S. Lucy and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 8. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000. to be divided evenly between the Chambers of Commerce in North Conway and Conway, for operation of information booths in both villages. Agreeable to a petition signed by Ralph L. Grindle and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000. in 1965 toward the reappraisal of all real estate in the Town, said reappraisal to be made by the State Tax Commission at their earliest convenience. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,600 to install a drain on Grove Street. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for the purpose of uniting with the 45 other towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the co-operative de-

velopment and promotion of the North Country's economy. Agreeable to a petition signed by Richard G. White and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to help defray the expenses of the Water Safety Program as carried on by the Conway Chapter of the American Red Cross. Agreeable to a petition signed by Shumway Marshall and others. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500 for the Eastern Slope Regional Airport. Recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 to reseal the hard surface runway at the White Mountain Airport with special runway sealer. Agreeable to a petition signed by Lewis Hanson and others. Not recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the selectmen to require open bidding by sealed bids for the annual contract for attendance on the town dump for the year 1965-1966, and all subsequent years. Agreeable to a petition signed by Harvey C. Blake and others. Not recommended by Budget Committee.

Art. 16. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF CONWAY BUDGET COMMITTEE

The Municipal Budget Committee of the Town of Conway, of which there are 19 members, has met 7 times since Jan. 12, 1965. Meetings were held with both the Board of Selectmen and the School Board.

The annual budget of the Town remains substantially the same as last year. Special articles, however, are up about 2½ times over those appropriated last year. An article concerning the completion of a town planning program begun in 1964, deserves mention. This is a most comprehensive plan, the results of which will be voted on at the 1966 town meeting. \$2,000.00 is the amount needed to accomplish this. This is recommended by the Budget Committee.

The Conway Bicentennial Committee has requested \$5,000.00 to help defray expenses of the celebration in July of this year. This article is recommended by the Budget Committee.

The Selectmen believe it is of utmost importance that Conway be reappraised within two years, and have consequently inserted an article for this purpose to be raised and appropriated in 1965, and 1966. The amount needed in 1965 will be \$20,000.00. This article is perhaps the most controversial of all the articles. It is recommended by the Budget Committee.

The annual School budget is up about \$60,000.00 from last year. The bulk of this increase is to pay for additional teachers and salary increases. A special article to cover a deficit on the Kennett High School addition will be forthcoming but at this writing, no specific sum has been determined.

Based on last year's valuation of \$23,344,185.00 every increase in appropriations of \$23,338.00, will raise the tax rate for 1965 by \$1.00 per thousand. On the same basis, \$762,550.00 in new valuation must be added to reduce the tax rate by \$1.00 per thousand. Look well to your ballot at the approaching annual meetings.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and Your District Chief

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2,280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86 per cent wooded and its economy — both industrial and recreational — is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area — 4,350,000 acres — is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine co-operation during the past fire season and with your continued co-operation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

Your librarian and representatives from the trustees have attended meetings in the state. The Conway Library was host to a fall regional meeting. The Curio room has been a workshop and meeting place for groups from the Bicentennial committee and the Conway Historical Society.

To the many friends of the library, who are getting almost too numerous to mention by name, the librarian and trustees are grateful. Organizations and friends have been generous in the giving of time and books. The book committee has cooperated in the selection and purchasing of books. A very special “thank you” should go to the third grade pupils of the Conway Elementary School, who made many of the decorations and helped trim the Christmas tree that was in the main room at Christmas time. We appreciate, also, the generous gifts from those friends who wish to remain anonymous.

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Conway for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal and District Courts, Library and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1963 — December 31, 1964: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1963 and December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$18,508.72, in 1964.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$20,204.41, plus a revenue surplus of \$10,307.33, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$30,511.74.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1964, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Municipal and District Courts: (Exhibit E-1 and E-2)

Statements of the accounts of the Municipal Court for the period January 1, 1964 to June 30, 1964, and the District Court from July 1, 1964 to December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibits E-1 and E-2. **Statement of Bonded Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)**

A statement of outstanding bonded indebtedness as of December 31, 1964, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$1,490.28, from \$97,096.19 to \$95,605.91, in 1964, as shown herewith:

The Selectmen and Tax Collector should carefully go over these uncollected tax lists and such taxes thereon as appear to be uncollectible should be abated. To carry substantial amounts of old uncollectible taxes year after year in the Town balance sheets as asset accounts tends to distort the true financial condition of the Town.

The two-year period provided by law for redemptions from tax sales has expired on the taxes which remain unredeemed from the tax sales for the levies of 1961 and prior years as indicated above. The Tax Collector should therefore deed to the Town the properties represented by these tax liens.

Surety Bond:

The Surety Bond of the Town Clerk should be increased in amount from \$8,000.00 to \$10,000.00.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Conway for their assistance during the course of the audit.



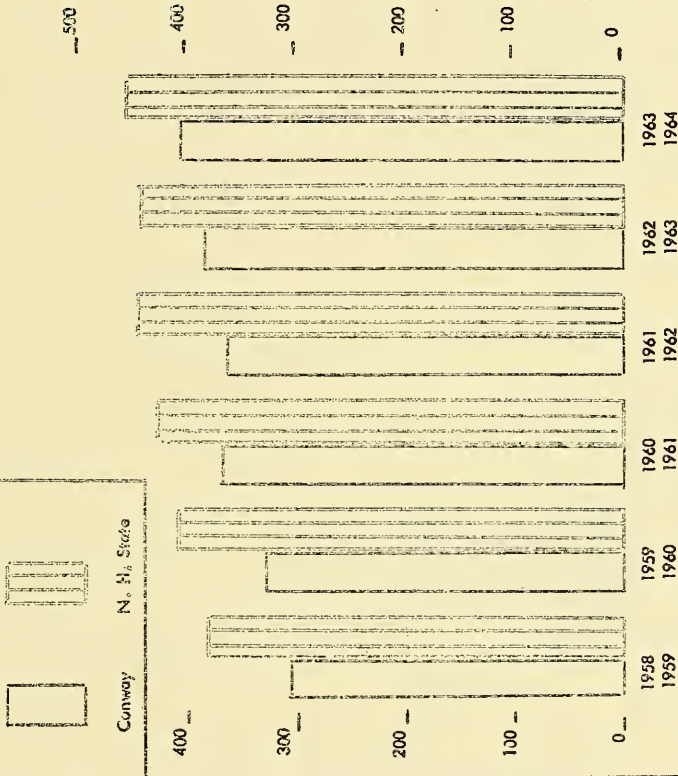

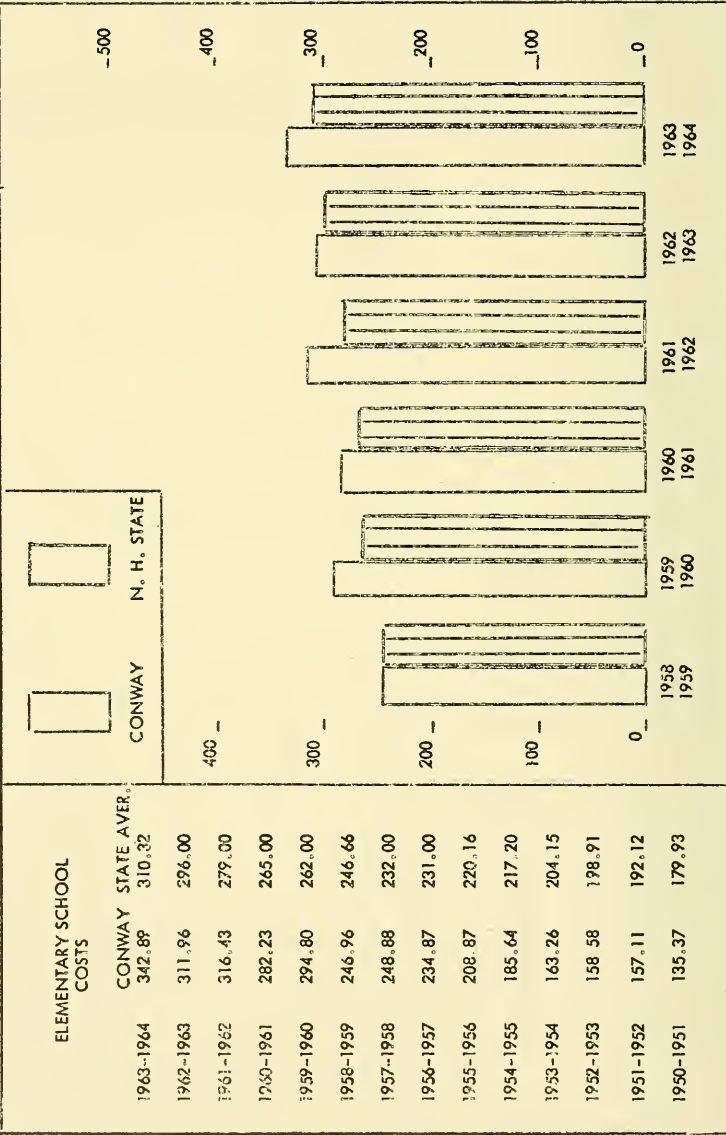

Report of School Superintendent

1) New School Building

The new addition to Kennett High School is now substantially completed. It took considerably longer to build than was originally planned. Much credit is due the architect, Frank Kennett, Jr., for the excellence of his design and planning. Probably no school district has ever received as extensive services from an architect as we did. In many ways, he served as a clerk of the works, constantly supervising each phase of the construction and making written reports of his findings. The fact that we have such a beautiful, well designed, functional school is in no small measure due to the architect's very intimate relationship with the project.

Shortly after the bonds were sold, it became evident that it was to cost more to build the school than was initially budgeted. This was ameliorated to some extent through the transfer of sums of money totalling \$67,000.00 into the Building Fund. These transfers were either approved by the voters or the Conway School Board.

This excellent school plant will meet our needs for many years. It was planned with the future in mind and can be readily adapted to the inevitable changes that are to come.

2) Vocational Education

About fifty per cent of our high school youth do not go on to college. Very few drop out of school; in fact, our drop-out rate at Kennett is exceedingly low. However, those that go directly into the labor market have not always been adequately prepared. Anyone that does not have a special skill today is not usually gainfully employed.

Currently, we have just one vocational course at Kennett High, Home Economics. We recommend expanding our vocational program to include courses in Building Construction, Clerk-Typists, Clerk-Stenographers, and Bookkeepers. If approved by the N. H. State Department of Education, we will be eligible for Federal reimbursements for teachers' salaries, equipment and supplies.

3) Advanced Placement Courses

We must also expand our program for the academically gifted. These students have not been adequately challenged in the past. Many high schools are now requiring five courses a year instead of the traditional four, and these schools are offering some sort of enriched academic programs for the gifted. Students completing advanced placement courses and passing the required College Board Advanced Placement Tests are exempted from taking college freshman courses. For example – at Harvard about half the freshman class had completed some college-level work in high school, and 191 entered as sophomores. This is being repeated at most good colleges

and universities throughout the country. Those who enter advanced courses through high school achieve better than those who have taken the preliminary college courses as freshmen.

4) High School Evaluation

As members of the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, we are required to have our high school evaluated by a professional team of educators in order to maintain our accreditation. The evaluation will take place next year and the full report will be printed and made available to the people of this area.

5) Salary Schedule

The basic salary schedule has been revised. The beginning teachers' salary (Bachelors Degree) has been increased by \$100.00. Salary differentials between men and women will no longer exist. Effective September 1, 1965, we will have a single salary schedule for all professional employees.

Merit pay for teachers has been under discussion here for some time. This year our new salary policy includes funds for initiating such a program. It will now be possible to reward those outstanding teachers for their many years of meritorious service. It will also make it easier to attract good experienced teachers to our school system.

6) Departmentalization of Subjects in the Elementary Schools

During the second semester, the Conway Elementary School will experiment with some departmentalization of subjects within grades four, five, and six. The project is quite similar to that which has achieved good results at the John H. Fuller Elementary School for the past two years. This approach to the teaching-learning process does take into account the special skills and interests of teachers. This method will be carefully tested and fully evaluated.

From the initial planning steps of a new school and on through the construction process, the School Board is involved in many and long meetings. Your School Board is a dedicated, hard-working committee that desires the best education that is reasonably attainable. You just can't have good schools without a good School Board.
