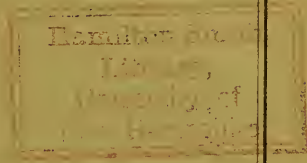

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Chapter 150, Laws of New Hampshire

Section 6—Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually on or before April 30 cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name, and bearing attached to said collar a metal tag distinctly marked with its registered number. Said tag shall be furnished by the clerk at the expense of the city or town from the amount received from dog license fees.

Section 18—The mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually within ten days from May first issue a warrant to one or more police officers or constables directing them to proceed forthwith either to kill or cause to be killed all dogs within such city or town not licensed and collared according to the provisions of this chapter, and to enter complaint against the owners or keepers thereof; and any person may, and every police officer and constable shall kill or cause to be killed all such dogs, whenever and wherever found.

Town Warrant

(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Cornish qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House on the eleventh day of March, 1930, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman and one trustee of the trust funds for three years and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of cemeteries.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise the necessary amount for maintenance of state aid roads.

7. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to apply for state aid on highways and raise the necessary amount therefor.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for trunk line maintenance.

9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of fifty dollars to help pay for lighting the streets of Cornish Flat with electricity.

10. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars for E. L. Huse M. D., for the ensuing year, to insure the services of a doctor for the people of Cornish.

11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money, if necessary, in anticipation of taxes.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for the control of white pine blister rust.

13. By request. To see what action the town will take in disposing of the hearse house.

14. By request. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair and gravel the stage road from a point near George Cunningham's house to Cornish Center.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars to gravel the road from the postoffice at Cornish Flat to A. P. Butman's house.

16. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to excavate the bed of Blow-Me-Down brook on Cornish Flat.

17. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of one hundred dollars to be known as the C. E. Jackson fund, the interest to be used in the care of the C. E. Jackson lot in the Edminster cemetery.

18. To see if the town will vote to discontinue certain roads, or parts of roads, as open highways, as designated in this article, subject to gates and bars:

(a) Fernald Hill road, from a point one rod westerly from the house of Minnie E. Smith to a point ten rods easterly from the house occupied by Fred Emery.

(b) Road from intersection at foot of Leavitt hill to the end of the road at Curtis place now occupied by H. B. Howe.

(c) Road from top of hill easterly from brick house known as F. J. Franklyn farm to intersection of highway near Clark place.

(d) South branch road from intersection of road near Clyde Bailey's to Claremont state road.

(e) Road from intersection near Helen Fifield place to intersection between Nevins place and Daniel Deming place.

(f) Road from intersection on Platt hill road near estate of Wm. Folger to a point five rods easterly from house formerly known as Hildreth place.

19. To see if the town will vote to return to the road agent system and elect one or more road agents at the next annual town meeting.

20. To hear the reports of officers, agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Cornish:

I hereby present for your consideration and that of the citizens of the town my eleventh annual school report.

Since my first report in 1920 the annual cost of education throughout the country has largely increased. The causes of this increase in New Hampshire are chiefly four: first, the decrease in the purchasing power of the dollar; second, the increase both in school enrollment and in the actual number of school days per year; third, the increased emphasis upon health training in the schools which has resulted in larger expenditures for medical inspection; and, fourth, the longer period that pupils remain in school.

The table below I am copying from a recent circular of the State Board of Education.

Of every 100 pupils who enter the first grade

1919	1929
93	95 complete sixth grade.
75	85 complete eighth grade.
55	67 enter high school.
31	43 graduate from high school.
11	23 enter post-secondary institutions.

In ten years the New Hampshire high school enrollment has increased from 12,087 to 16,097, a gain of 33 per cent. In 1919 the Cornish tuition cost was \$55 per pupil. This year the cost is \$60 and \$100. Your board has been notified that the tuition charges at Windsor High will be increased from \$60 to \$90.

The schools opened on the day following Labor Day. The teacher's name and fall term enrollment of the respective schools are here tabulated.

The number of different pupils enrolled 164.

In the school census returns of September, 1929, the enumerator reports 165 children between five and sixteen years of age. Four of these were below the age of admission and one who had reached the age of fourteen and had completed the eighth grade had withdrawn from school attendance. 160 of these children are accounted for in school: 140 in the public schools of the district; 18 in secondary school attendance; and two attending elementary school outside the district.

GENERAL STATISTICS

For the Year Ending June 30, 1929

The total membership was 193; the average membership, 152; the percent of attendance, 93.45. The seven pupils who maintained a record of perfect attendance are here listed—Rodney Palmer, Chester Smith, Otis Duque, James Marden, Norris Weld, Ralph Wright, Mildred Walker.

Eight Cornish students were registered in Kimball Union Academy; eight, in Windsor High School; and four in Stevens High—a total of 20 secondary students. The schools were actually in session 175 days. Five days were lost for holidays and other no-school days.

The Public Library

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

Statistics are, to the average person, dull reading, but I would like to give you a few figures which will show something of the activities of your library. During the past year the library was open to the public fifty-two days and we find a record for those days of over fourteen hundred visits and the loan of over three thousand and three hundred books. The periodicals were not counted. There were something like six hundred books and many magazines sent to the schools for those branches. Every teacher, I believe, has expressed pleasure at this part of our work and earnest appreciation of the material sent. Last summer during vacation time Mr. and Mrs. Barrett bore the expense of a moving demonstration of library possibilities in charge of Miss Alice Miller. In six or seven of the school-rooms of the town one after the other, Miss Miller arranged and displayed books, pictures, maps and other treasures of our library and for a week invited the children and older folk of the neighborhood to come and enjoy it all, borrowing to take home if one chose; and during the week she planned and carried out an evening's program for the public. For these evenings she was able to secure some very fine talent so that the communities felt they had been much favored. We hope all this brought to some an inkling of what the library *may* mean to any one who *uses* it.

During the summer we had the outside of the building given what attention it needed by both carpenter and painter, and on the inside the book stacks received a thoro cleaning.

We have increased the book list about a hundred volumes this year.

Thanks are due Mr. and Mrs. Barrett, Mrs. E. W. Quimby, Mrs. Charles Weld, Mrs. M. W. Hardy, Miss Cora Gaines, and Cornish W. C. T. U., for books given. Mr Charles Huggins most kindly and promptly responded to our appeal for missing numbers of the town reports and our files are now complete.

Had I time I should like to tell you some of the nice things that are said each year to us about the fine building and splendid collection of books we have; but I must not use too much space.

Come and see us often; we are there each Saturday from 3 to 5.30 and from 7 to 9 p. m.
