## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 13th of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The polls will be open at 12 o'clock.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To see if the Town will accept the Budget for 1962 prepared by the Selectmen and appropriate the amounts therein or to make any changes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$108.00 for the purpose of uniting with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the cooperative development and promotion of the North Country's economy.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

5. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new industrial loader at a cost not to exceed \$15,000.00, and for this purpose authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the town the necessary amount by the issuance of serial notes for ten years in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of having the Town appraised by either the State or an outside firm of appraisers.

8. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem—97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable—a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires—all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort—the rules are simple.

1. Don't burn at home—use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.

2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fireplaces and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.

3. Be sure that all lighted material—cigars, cigarettes and matches—are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.

4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.

5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.

6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

**REMEMBER** — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn **YOUR** property.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town School District in the Town of Dalton, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the school building in said Dalton on the twelfth day of March, 1962 at 8:00 o'clock in the evening, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To choose an auditor for the ensuing year.
6. To hear the reports of officers, auditors or committees of the district and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

### To the School Board and Citizens of Dalton:

It is with pleasure that I submit to you my annual report relative to your school.

School opened in September with a total enrollment of 76 pupils as compared with a total enrollment of 87 pupils a year ago. There are 27 enrolled in grades one and two, 22 in grades three and four, and 27 in grades five and six.

There have been no changes in the teaching staff since my last report. Mrs. Claribel Blakslee is being employed again this year to work with pupils in the primary grades who are having difficulty.

Considerable work has been accomplished on the school grounds during this past year, and as a result play areas have been established for the various groups. The teachers have purchased a merri-go-round for the playground and this will be installed in the spring after the frost leaves the ground. It was hoped that the other playground equipment could have been moved last summer but extensive work on the grounds made it necessary to delay this project.

A sliding curtain for the stage area was also purchased this past year so that programs could be presented by the pupils at various times during the year.

Your school building has become an active center for youth activities. Since the installation of the backboards for basketball, organized games have been regularly scheduled. Many youngsters have been able to benefit greatly by the facilities that are now available. The building is also used by adult groups for various activities throughout the year.

The school lunch program continues to operate very efficiently with most of the children participating. Federal foods are still available and the milk program is assisted with Federal funds.

The budget for the coming year is somewhat higher than that of the present year. The tuition rate for high school pupils has increased from \$360.00 per pupil to \$375.00 per pupil, and the elementary tuition from \$235.00 to \$240.00 per pupil. It should be noted at this time that these rates are still well below stage averages. Teachers salaries, which are low and have been low for a number of years, must be increased in order to hold and attract certified and qualified teachers.

Your school is supplied with modern text books and adequate teaching aids and supplies.

Included in this report will be found the report of the school nurse who carries on a very effective health program in the school. You will also find statistical report, financial report, budget for next year, teacher list and tuition list for the present year.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens of Dalton, the school board and other school district personnel for their continued support.
