

### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Epping, in the County of Rockingham, in the State of New Hampshire, gualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epping on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for roads and bridges.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as per contract with the Portsmouth Power Co.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Decoration Day expenses.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the winding of the town clock.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction the sum of \$1497.00 on condition that the State contribute \$2,994.00

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Class V Highways \$556.15 on condition that the State contribute \$2,224.61.

10. To see what sums of money the town will vote

to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

11. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a certain section of highway no longer necessary for public travel by reason of re-location.

12. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Australian, or secret ballot system, according to law, Page 123, Chapter 26, Section 88, of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for control of blister rust, on condition that the State contribute \$600.

### **REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER**

I herewith submit my report as Health Officer for the year ending Jan. 31, 1936.

We have again been fortunate as regards contagious diseases and have had only the following reported: tuberculosis, one; scarlet fever, six; chicken pox, four; measles, five. I sent to the State Laboratory of Hygiene for analysis eight pints of milk taken from dealers, with the following report: six satisfactory and two had excessive bacteria count. Several lots of town water were also sent and with the same complaint—iron in excessive quantity. The past year new pipes were laid to take care of the sewage from the Acre to the Town Dump, which has eliminated a lot of trouble and complaints.

Just another reminder, that spitting on the sidewalk or floor of any car or public building is forbidden by law.

At this time I wish to express my sorrow and regret for the loss of our beloved and departed Dr. Abram W. Mitchell. He advised and worked with me for many years in the interest of the health and welfare of the community. He was a real man and a wonderful doctor. I can think of no better recommendation to make at this time than for all of us to try and emulate the life of him who has gone beyond. Let me again ask all citizens to cooperate with me in the discharge of my duties as Health Officer and I will endeavor to see that all the Health Laws are complied with.
