- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the public library.

- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the police department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town poor.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for civil defense.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the health department.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town dump and appropriate money for the same.

- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the sidewalk.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for summer maintenance of the Akers Pond Road.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to spray the town for insects and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see, what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountains Region Association and appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for street lighting and appropriate money for the same.
- 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Water Department and appropriate money for the same.
- 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association and appropriate money for the same.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred sixty five dollars (\$165.00) for the North Country Mental Health Clinic and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes annotated Amended by Chapter 302 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$______ to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.
- 21. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the

plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

- 22. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
- 23. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire the General Sound & Visual Corp. to install a translator station on Howard West's tower to rebroadcast Channel 6 and Channel 13 at a total cost of \$6,750.00, a charge of \$100.00 per year to Mr. West for the use of the tower, building and electricity and to appropriate money for the same.
- 25. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before the meeting.

The share paid by the several Districts toward the Superintendent's salary for 1966-67 is as follows: Dummer, \$146.00; Errol, \$520.00; Gorham, \$7,775.00; Milan, \$869.00; Randolph, \$368.00; Shelburne, \$322.00. The Teacher's Retirement and the State Employees' Retirement Association assesses the amount for the Superintendent's retirement and other District employees that belong to the system. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT 1966 - 67

To the School Board and Citizens of Errol:

I am pleased to submit my first report as your new Superintendent of Schools. As many of you know, Errol is now a member of Supervisory Union No. 20. Other Districts in the Union include Dummer, Milan, Gorham, Randolph and Shelburne.

BUDGET

Your School Board is recommending a budget of \$39,320.09 for 1967-68. This amount represents an increase of \$693.72 over the present budget of \$38, 626.37. The major increase in the budget is under teacher salaries. If Upton continues to send tuition pupils to Errol, the school tax for 1967-68 should be less than the present tax appropriation of \$34,503.03. There will be a balance to further reduce the 1967-68 tax appropriation.

INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF

Upon the resignation of Mr. Speer, the School Board elected Mr. Richard Alger as Principal. Mrs. Janet Dunham, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, is teaching grades 4-6. Mr. Edward Donavan, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire is teaching in grades 7-10 with Mr. Alger. Mrs. Isabelle Linnel started the year in grades 1-3 but was required to drop out of teaching through no fault of hers. We were fortunate to hire Mrs. Sandra Leader to finish out the year.
