#### WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Freedom, New Hampshire, in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the 14th Day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$6200.00 to defray Town charges, consisting of town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, election & registration, town hall expenses, and appropriate money for the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the use of hydrants and appropriate money for the same.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500.00 for street lights and appropriate money for the same.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500.00 for the general expenses of the highway department and appropriate money for the same.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the salaries of the Selectmen, Tax Collector, Treasurer, and Town Clerk \$100.00 and the Auditor \$50.00 and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 for the same.
  - 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum

of \$300.00 for the Public Library and appropriate money for the same.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$6500.00 for winter highways and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$797.30 for class five roads and appropriate money for the same.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for town needy and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500.00 for insurance and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500.00 for old age assistance and appropriate money for the same.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week Celebration and Memorial Day and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$6000.00 for summer highways and appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00 for the fire department and appropriate money for the same.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$650.00 for maintaining the town dump and appropriate money for the same.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to use the revenue from the 1967 Severance Tax to cover any overages.

- 19. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.
- 20. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town; to the Lakes Region for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources for the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$900.00 for interest on short term and long term notes and appropriate money for the same.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$350.00 for Social Security and appropriate money for the same.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to be given as a donation and divided between North Conway and Huggins Memorial Hospital and appropriate money for the same.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$9000.00 for payment on the grader note and appropriate money for the same.
- 26. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$2000.00 for plowing driveways and appropriate money for the same.
- 27. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500.00 to tar a section of the West Ossipee Road and appropriate money for the same.
- 28. To see if the town wishes to appoint a Planning or Zoning Board.

29. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
