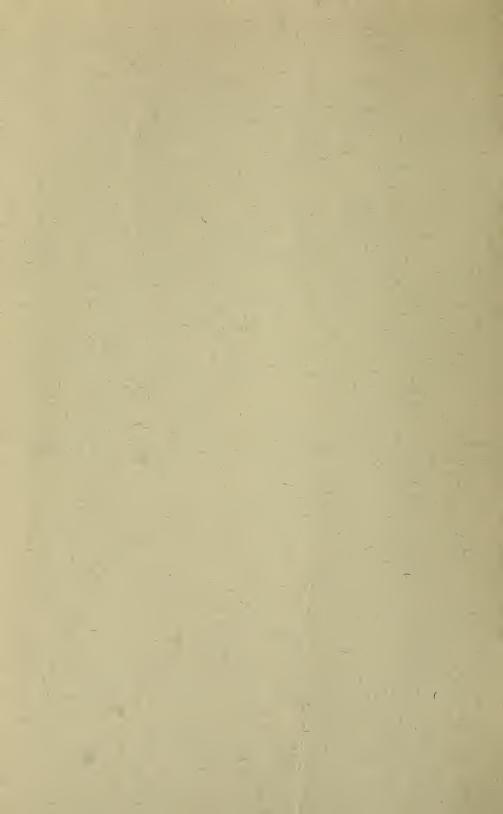

# State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the town of Gorham in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year. (On the ballot.)
- Article 2. Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town? (On the ballot.)
- Article 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government.
- Article 4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Protection of Persons and Property.
- Article 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health.
- Article 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Summer Roads.
- Article 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Winter Roads.
- Article 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting.
- Article 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid.
- Article 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
- Article 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Welfare.
- Article 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- Article 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to celebrate the return of war veterans on the 4th of July, in conjunction with the American Legion.
- Article 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Recreation.
- Article 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts.
- Article 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Water and Sewer Maintenance.

- Article 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.
- Article 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Skating Rinks.
- Article 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Unclassified Expenditures, including auto permits.
- Article 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising.
- Article 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of Issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- Article 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on temporary loans and short term notes.
- Article 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Dredging and New Foot Bridge, Peabody River.
- Article 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment on short term notes.
- Article 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for extension of Water Line, Bangor Road.
- Article 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Dredging.
- Article 27. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water line, Peabody River.
- Article 28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for gravel and sand for Swimming Pool.
- Article 29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relocating pipe on Gorham Hill.
- Article 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for purchase of Alpine Aqueduct Company's Water System.
- Article 31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for New Fire Truck,
- Article 32. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Lot No. 4, Union Street.
- Article 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of two certain tracts or parcels of land with the buildings thereon located at the corner of Main and Mechanic Streets, in the town of Gorham, County of Coos, State of New Hampshire, known as the Universalist Church property, as offered for sale by the New Hampshire Universalist State Convention at a price of \$10,500.00 for the real estate, organ, pews, and all other furnishings and equipment now located in the church building, or take any action thereon. (For record.)—(Not recommended by the Budget Committee.)

Article 34. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a corner parcel of land, shown as 160 feet by 227 feet, on blueprint prepared by E. E. Tankard, C. E., located at the end of Highland Place, and used as a turn around area, presently owned by Mrs. Emma Malloy, and for which Mrs. Emma Malloy has submitted an offer to sell at a price of \$1,000.00, or take any action thereon. (For record.)—(Not recommended by the Budget Committee.)

Article 35. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money on temporary notes in anticipation of taxes covering the period from March 8, 1960 to the Annual Meeting of 1961.

Article 36. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

Article 37. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 38. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The polls shall be open from nine of the clock in the forenoon to six of the clock in the afternoon.

A petition was received from the Gorham School Board for the establishment of a Capital Reserve Fund for Replacement of Roofs on Sections of High School. \$1,000.00 to be raised each year for 5 or 6 years.

We recommend that no money be raised for this purpose.

A request was received from the Selectmen for \$1,000.00 to purchase a lot of land at the end of Highland Place from Mrs. Emma Malloy. This property is currently being used as a "turn-around" for town vehicles and equipment.

We recommend that no money be raised for this purpose.

A request was received from the Selectmen for \$10,500.00 to purchase the land and building owned by the Universalist Church. The building to be converted for use as a public library

The building to be converted for use as a public library.

A special committee of members of the Budget Committee inspected the building and made their opinions known to the Budget Committee.

In view of the possible large expense of renovating the building, plus the fact that it might be possible to make more satisfactory arrangements for library space in the present Town Hall, we recommend that no money be raised for this purpose.

A request was received for \$1,200.00 to extend the Bangor Road Water Line.

We recommend that the Selectmen be authorized to negotiate a temporary loan of \$1,200.00 for this project if the need arises.

A request was received from the Selectmen for an amount of money for dredging the Peabody and Moose Rivers if conditions warrant and will permit the necessary work.

We recommend that the Selectmen be authorized to negotiate a temporary loan up to \$10,000.00 for this project if the need arises.

A request was received from the Water and Sewer Commission for \$3,400.00 to replace the water line across the Peabody River to the Bangor section. This will replace the line that was washed away during the high water of last fall.

We recommend that \$3,400.00 be raised for this project.

A request was received from the Recreation Commission for \$7,500.00 to be used as Capital outlay at the Libby Memorial Swimming Pool. The project was to include piping the inlet, removal of muck (replaced with gravel) and putting 2,000 cubic yards of washed sand along the shores.

We recommend that \$2,500.00 be raised for this project. We suggest that this amount be used for the piping, muck removal and gravel replacement. We recommend that the placement of washed sand be delayed until some future year. We also would like to suggest that the piping of the inlet should not be attempted until the project has been determined as sound from an engineering stand-point.

A request was received from the Water and Sewer Commission for \$7,500.00 to relocate a 3,500-foot section of the Gorham Hill Water Line. This change will be necessary due to the relocation of the State Highway in that section.

We recommend that \$7,500.00 be raised for this project.

A request was received from the Water and Sewer Commission for \$3,000.00 to purchase the Alpine Aqueduct Co. water system. The Alpine Aqueduct Co. have requested permission from the State of New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission to discontinue service.

We recommend that \$3,000.00 be raised for this project.

A request was received from the Fire Wards for an amount of money to be used for the purchase of a new Fire Truck. The truck to be replaced is twenty-eight years old and not too reliable.

We recommend that the Selectmen be authorized to negotiate a short term note up to \$20,000.00 for this project. Payment to be made over a period of five years.

We recommend that the following items be taken from cash on hand:

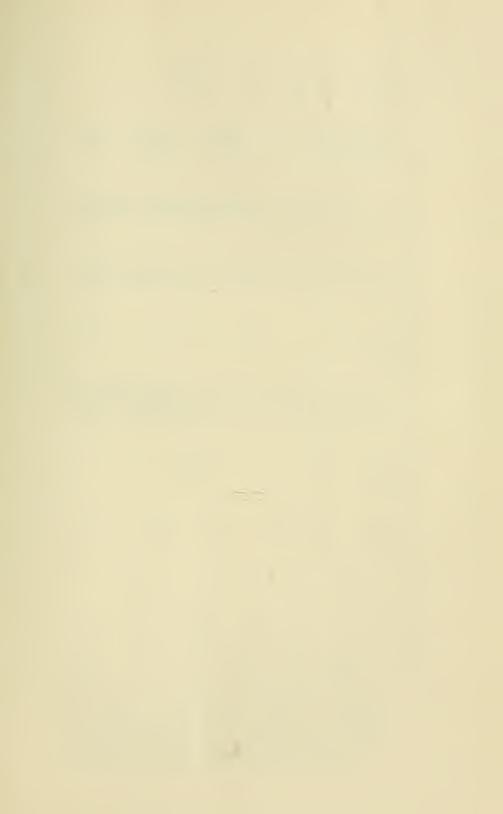

### Estimated Income:

While the School Board is not required to file the estimated income until June 10, 1960, the following figures are submitted as being an accurate estimate at this time: Balance, \$5,000.00; Construction Aid, \$8,400.00; Tuition Receipts, \$21,000.00; National Defense Education Funds, \$700.00; Miscellaneous, \$1,900.00; Total, \$37,000.00.

\*The starred items are required by law to be raised as determined by the proper authorities. The District determines the salaries of the District officers. The Supervisory Union Board decides the local share of the Superintendent's salary and other Union expenses. The share paid by the several Districts toward the Superintendent's salary for 1959-60 is as follows: Dummer, \$185.50; Gorham, \$3,672.90; Jefferson, \$466.40; Milan, \$545.90; Randolph, \$174.90; Shelburne, \$254.40. The State Treasurer also reports the amount of the per capita tax, while the Teachers' Retirement Board assesses the amount for the teachers' retirement and the State Employees' Retirement Association assesses the amount for the superintendent's retirement and other District employees that belong to the system. In those towns that are under Social Security, the amount to be paid by the District is established by law.

### Report of Recreation Commission

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gorham:

The Recreation Commission, a five man board appointed by the Selectmen, is in its tenth year of operation. The Gorham Recreation Department is now in its third year-round Recreation Program.

In 1958, the Recreation Advisory Council raised \$5,000 which was matched by the Spaulding Trusts Fund. This money was used at the Recreation Center for that part of the renovations which has been completed.

On February 14, 1959, the Gorham Recreation Center was dedicated with Governor Wesley Powell as principal speaker. On that occasion the National Recreation Association extended its congratulations to the Citizens of Gorham. On June 15, Richard H. Keir, Commission member, received a citation from the National Recreation Association for outstanding contribution to the Recreation movement of America.

The 1959 attendance records show, for the Recreation Center, Libby Memorial Swimming Pool, Playgrounds and Special Events, that many more people have found these activities to be attractive. Many of the participants in the program have shown their appreciation for these opportunities by their continued participation, letters and the remarks directed to the Recreation Department.

### PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note: 58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners; 10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple:

- Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
- 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles—use your ash tray.
- Don't burn at home—Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

### WHAT DOES IT DO?

Through its officers, directors, committees, town councilmen, and executive secretary, and by means of publicity and promotion, it works to improve those conditions upon which the North Country's economy depends.

### SUCH AS?

The North Country's principal economic factors are industry, recreation and agriculture. Anything that contributes to the welfare and improvement of these general areas of business is the concern of the WMRA. It works independently and in cooperation with various trade associations, chambers of commerce, clubs, and local, state and federal agencies. Some recent WMRA activities include petitioning the Civil Aeronautics Board to reconsider its recent findings on air service to Berlin and North Conway; attendance at travel and sports shows in Springfield, Massachusetts, Hartford, Connecticut, and Montreal, Quebec, to sell the White Mountains Region to out-of-state tourists and sportsmen; contributing cash and prize awards to deserving North Country 4-H'ers; helping develop the New Hampshire page in the "Travel U. S. A. 1960" portfolio; setting up and conducting an industrial realtors' tour of the Region; answering hundreds of inquiries monthly and publishing and distributing six different folders annually (approximately 100,000 copies total) to promote travel to the Region.
