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THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, N. H., in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Chapel in said Hebron on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Highways and Bridges and make appropriations for the same.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Class V Highway and make appropriations for the same.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$54.00 for Lakes Region Association for issuance of printed matter, etc., in co-operation with other Towns and make appropriations for the same.

Article 6. To see what action the Town will take in regard to raising \$400.00 for Blister rust control and make appropriations for the same.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to put 4 lights around the Hebron Common and make appropriations for the same.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to have one road agent for both sides of the Town and rescind any previous action taken by the Town relative to the same.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to have one man look after the Hebron Common and around the Town Buildings, keeping the grounds in good condition at all times during the summer and raise money for the same.

Article 10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to procuring the A. E. Moore land on the Hebron Common for a building spot and take any action that may be necessary in regard to this matter and raise or instruct the Selectmen as to payment of the same.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Town Pound at the foot of Sanborn's Hill, so-called, and on the Ebenzer Kendall land, so-called, in a deed to the Town in 1807.

Article 12. To see if the Town of Hebron will raise \$250.00 to repair the library building and take any further action in this matter that may seem necessary.

Article 13. To see, if the Town will raise the sum of \$29.00 for Newfound Region Association to aid in advertising and other activities for the benefits of the Town in the Newfound Region Association.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to rescind its action adopting the Australian ballot system for the election of its Officers, and adopt in its place thereof the so-called Non-Partisan ballot system as provided by Sections 112 to 120, Chapter 34, revised laws as instructed by Chapter 22, Laws of 1943.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote that all buildings costing in excess of three thousand (\$3,000) dollars, erected upon land now owned or later purchased by the Town shall be constructed with a permanent fireproof exterior and roof covering, except for necessary trim, this to exclude all imitation such as sidewalls, shingles, etc.

Article 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
