of Merrimack, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, the 13th of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town expenses for the ensuing year and to make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To authorize and empower the board of selectmen to borrow for the Town by the issue of notes a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1951, said notes to be expressly payable from taxes within one year from the date of their issuance; and to authorize the board of selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
- 4. To authorize the selectmen to transfer the E. W. Ferrin Fund to the Trustees of Trust Funds, to be invested as provided by law.
- 5. To see what plan the Town will adopt for using the income from the Ferrin Fund.
- 6. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Hill:

I herewith submit my first annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

We are faced with particularly troubled times in schools of the nation, state and local districts. We must be on the alert to see that our schools remain free and radiate the cause of freedom and democracy. The youth of the schools must be prepared for present and future living in this troubled world. They must be given the training which will enable them to compete with the youth anywhere in the world. To the people of Hill falls the responsibility of seeing to it that this training is provided. You have been, in the past and will be in the future, most willing to share in the cost of the education of your boys and girls.

The schools of Hill are very fortunate in having two exceptionally capable teachers who are ever alert to the needs of the youth. The pupils are receiving the necessary attention to give them the background needed to meet the problems which they will need to solve in their future educational pursuits.

You are to be commended again for the fact that you have assumed the responsibility of providing transportation for the high school pupils. These young people continue to receive the opportunity to attend a secondary school. Their record in the high school of their choice shows that the efforts of the taxpayers of the village are not being abused. The pupils going to high school reflect the success they met in the local school. Their records are good.

The increasing costs of operating schools will be reflected in the annual budget. Tuition costs have been increased in Franklin and Bristol due to the increasing cost of operation of the secondary schools.

The school plant is one which is serving the community and the youth well. I would suggest, however, that some

thought be given to a program of maintenance which will keep all phases of the plant in good condition. One item which would be of considerable worth is that of capping the building with insulating material. Much heat loss could be cut down by this move. Attention should also be given to the problem of school lighting. The number and type of fixtures now in use in the school are not furnishing the amount and quantity of light which should be given.

During the short time that I have been your Superintendent of Schools I have enjoyed the highest degree of cooperation from the teachers, school board and citizens. This I deeply appreciate and pray that it continues in order that we may work together to bring to your boys and girls the type of education offerings they so richly deserve.
