STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:


