TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall in said Lempster, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To hear all reports and act thereon.
- Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to keep the Common mowed around the Soldiers' Monument at Lempster Street.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to deliver blank inventories at the time they appraise the property for taxation.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to reinsure the Town Hall and Union Hall.
- Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and ap propriate for Old Home Day and Memorial Day.
- Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Library.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to limit the Road Agent to the appropriations.
- Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to receive sealed bids for mowing roadsides; a separate bid to be sent for each District.

Article 13. To see what sum per hour the Town will vote to pay for labor on the highway.

- Article 14. To see what action the Town will vote to take to continue the Town Forest Committee and take any ncessary action thereto.
- Article 15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to selling building lots on Lond Pond.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to have Lond Pond reclaimed for trout
- Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$549.65 for Town Road Aid. The State will contribute \$3,664.30.
- Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$402.00 for State Aid Construction. The State will contribute \$1,000.00.
- Article 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Poor and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- Article 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civil Defense.
- Article 21. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate, acquired by tax collector's deed; said authority to continue in effect until next Town Meeting.
- Article 22. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to acquiring new land for a cemetery and raise money therefor.
- Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$200.00 in trust from Miss Elvia M. Cutler. The interest to be used to care for the Cutler Lot and the Henry Trask Lot.
- Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$125.00 in trust from Frank M. Lovejoy for the care of the Frank M. Lovejoy Lot.
- Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one-hundredth of one percent of the assessed valuation of the Town of Lempster for the Dartmouth-Lake

Sunapee Region Association for the purpose of promoting and publicizing the natural Advantages of the town together with other towns in the region, the sum of \$28.47.

- Article 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Company.
- Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.
- Article 28. To see what action the Town will take in regard to raising money for graveling the Sane Pond Road, so called, beginning at the Marlow-Lempster Line and continuing to the corner of the road that leads to Sand Pond.
- Article 29. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the piece of road along the West side of Sand Pond. This being the same piece of road the Town acted on at the annual Town Meeting of 1950, under Article 20.
- Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to put the Road Agent in full charge of all road equipment including tractor.
- Article 31. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to the preservation of the Town Records.
- Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age Survivior's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate a sum of money to defray the Town's share of the cost thereof.
- Article 33. If the foregoing article is adopted; To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Town Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- Article 34. To see if the town will vote to have three road agents, instead of one, to take effect in 1954.
- Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Article 36. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to

secure the assistance of the State Tax Commitssion in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.

Article 37. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Lempster, I herewith submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools:

The School buildings were repaired during the summer, but there is much to be done if we are to continue using the buildings. It would seem wise to speed up efforts to obtain a new building adequate to provide for all the pupils, and equipped

to meet the needs of the total educational program.

The present plan of placing money in a capital reserve fund is a good approach to the solution of the problem but it is too slow. The need is now! Efforts to obtain additional state aid for building purposes, as well as transportation, should be encouraged.

The two teachers are doing an effective job in spite of physical handicaps of the buildings. There is need for greater participation on the part of parents in helping the boys and girls to have a wider variety of experiences in community living. More opportunities for working and playing together in Lempster, as organized groups with local leaders, would do much to increase the interests of the young people, and help to attract people to the community.

The programs presented by the pupils, in recognition of special holidays and in prize speaking, have been well done under the direction of the teachers.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of the school board, teachers and parents during the short time I have been with you. I hope that I may serve you effectively and efficiently in the solutions of our common problems. The boys and girls are here—let us give them all that is needed for competition and participation in our society.

SCHOOL WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Lempster qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Union Hall in said district on the tenth day of March, 1953, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the report of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to appoint a committee of not more than three citizens to work with the school board to investigate the present and future school needs, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the district will vote to use capital reserve funds not in excess of \$500 for the preliminary study and sketches of a proposed school building if the school board and committee deem advisable.

10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town. 11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1000 as a capital reserve fund for the construction, reconstruction or acquisition of school buildings and any land rights necessary, the final purpose to be determined by the district at a later meeting; said funds to be placed in the custody of the trustees of trust funds and reserved for the purpose listed herein, in accordance with the Law of 1943, Chapter 160, as amended by the Laws of 1945, Chapter 35, and of 1947, Chapter 8.

12. To see if the district will vote to accept a gift of one hundred dollars (\$100) from Lempster Parents' Club to be added to the capital reserve fund.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
